FROM THE PRINCIPAL'S DESK

Dear Saints Families,

What a busy, but wonderful weekend we had this past weekend. SLCS hosted the Archdiocesan Librarian meeting all day Friday, students competed against many of our fellow Catholic schools at the annual Academic Decathlon on Saturday, (see below for the exciting results) and Sunday, our middle school choir did a fabulous job singing at the 9:00 a.m. Mass. On top of all that, many school families, staff and Leos attended and assisted with the beautiful parish Heart of Worship event. Today marks the beginning of Lent and the students were able to receive ashes at school during a short prayer service this morning. We briefly discussed the significance of the next 40 days in preparing our hearts for the sacrifice Jesus made on our behalf. In Saints Families yesterday, the students created Alleluia posters, which were collected and symbolically "buried" today, until they could be displayed around the school at Easter.

In keeping with the meaning behind Lent and preparing our hearts to reflect and improve, I am reminded of Fr. Drew's words about the family unit and keeping our children safe from distractions. Lent is the perfect time to reflect and prioritize this message. With all that we are facing today to pull us apart and the temptations our children are facing, I felt it was a good time to remind everyone of a simple tool created by our parish that supports this effort.

In the wise words of Fr. Drew: "All parents must create a kind of moat around their home. Every effort will be made to keep evil outside: anger, rage, abuse, active addictions, and the dark side of modern technology. Within the home, the parents will nurture gentleness, affection, active listening, prayer, humor, fun, diligence, study, and some measure of solitude and meditation. Families will safeguard against the compulsion to over-commitment and will strive to say 'no' while saying 'yes' always to God."

If you are looking for a way to shore up your family, make it stronger, and put God first, I urge you to look at the 10 Tenets in this simple booklet and together, let's really try to make a difference this Lent. family | St Laurence <a href="St Laurence-Lauren

A NOTE FROM THE CLINIC



As you may be aware, the Texas Department of State Health Services (DSHS) has reported an outbreak of measles in Texas; you may read the full alert here. With the health and safety of our community in mind, we are providing you with the following information about measles and how to prevent infection. Read HERE!

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention state the best way to protect against measles is with the measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR) vaccine. MMR is safe and effective. Two doses of MMR vaccine are about 97% effective at preventing measles; one

dose is about 93% effective.

Every student enrolled in a Catholic School in the state of Texas is required to be immunized against vaccine preventable diseases caused by infectious agents in accordance with the Immunization schedule adopted by the Texas Department of State Health Services.
