### Hosting Our Lady of Fatima Pilgrim Statue



*Statement of Cardinal Joseph W. Tobin, C.Ss.R., on  
New Jersey's Assisted Suicide Law  
August 1, 2019*

---

Human compassion fills our hearts with sadness when we hear about an individual who wishes to end his or her life to escape the pain and suffering of illness, disability, or disease. The fear associated with such devastating human conditions is real and legitimate.

However, as Pope Francis has noted, we must be careful not to yield to a false sense of compassion. Our Holy Father reminds us that we must never take a human life—even, or especially, our own, since “this is a sin against God, the creator.”

The gift of human life and dignity is sacred and must be respected and protected at every stage, from conception to natural death. Respect for human life encourages a trust and peace with God despite illness and suffering.

We remain united to Christ through our suffering. St. Paul reminds us that nothing can separate us from the love of God. We have Christ in life and death – when he will intercede for us and bring us to eternal joy.

We must be clear. What legislatures now refer to as “death with dignity” is legal permission for one to end their own life with a lethal overdose of prescription drugs. This new state law has become an answer to addressing one’s fear of affliction or suffering. What is more, in a for-profit industry like health care, there is the real danger that euthanasia will be seen as a cost-cutting measure. There is evidence in states that have already legalized assisted suicide that insurers encourage this “solution” instead of more costly medical care. The handicapped and impaired will feel pressure to end their lives.

This law also puts immense pressure on Catholics in health care ministries to follow their conscience instead of being coerced into providing assistance that is immoral.

Dying patients who request euthanasia should receive loving care, psychological and spiritual support, and appropriate remedies for pain and other symptoms so they can *live* with dignity until the time of natural death.

Many families surround loved ones with comfort in their final moments of life. The Little Sisters of the Poor provides a powerful witness to the conviction that loving, prayerful, and attentive presence offered in times of suffering and death can be redemptive. Their mission, which brings strength, peace, and assurance to those under their care, quietly proclaims their belief that “dying with dignity” comes with humble acceptance, not through the avoidance of suffering.

We only have to consider the cross of Christ to be reminded that God, in the hour of His greatest suffering, expressed His deepest compassion for us, and chose not to avoid painful torment and humiliation, but to accept it for our sake. ♦

## **An Update on *Founded on the Past, Focused on the Future* Capital Campaign for the Church of the Most Blessed Sacrament**

In mid-July, Father John and Mr. Thomas Rybak met with representatives of the Archdiocesan Office of Property Management.

The construction documents prepared by T.M. Rybak and Associates have been approved by the Archdiocese. In the next two weeks, the project will be put out for bid among a number of contractors recommended by both the parish and the Archdiocese. Based on the bids that are received, the parish, in conjunction with the Office of Property Management, will identify the contractor(s) best qualified to complete the new construction and renovations included in our campaign.

“Our intention is to complete this process quickly, but also methodically,” said Mr. Steven Belloise, the Executive Director of the Office of Property Management. “Every project is different; every parish is different. Our goal is to identify the construction team that will best serve the MBS community in achieving the goals of the campaign in a manner that is both timely and fiscally prudent.”

The plan is to complete the bidding process and have the general contractor for the project in place by early September, and for construction to begin in the fall. If all the necessary funding is in place and all three elements of the project (Community Center, Blessed Mother Chapel and church repairs) can be completed simultaneously, the objective would be to finish the work in 12-14 months. If the project needs to be completed in phases, it is anticipated that the timeline would encompass two years.

“We will be better able to make a determination about the actual construction timeline once the bidding process is completed,” said Mr. Rybak. “I would say that we are looking for the best construction team because we may decide to break out the project, not only in phases, but also by type of work. That sort of approach may save money, and include some parishioners in the process.”

“I am pleased that we have received the approvals we were expecting, and are moving forward with the bidding process,” said Father John. “With God’s grace, we will take the first steps toward realizing our shared vision for the Most Blessed Sacrament community this fall. I want to thank everyone for their patience, their support and their prayers. It is going to be a very busy and exciting time for our parish family.”

The Travelers Information Form below must be filled out and returned with your \$25.00 check (cost of bus transportation to and from DC). The actual cost is much higher but MBS has agreed to underwrite 50% of the bus cost. Remember to make your checks payable to Most Blessed Sacrament and mail or turn them in to the parish center to the attention of Rev. John Job. The address for Most Blessed Sacrament is 787 Franklin Lake Road, Franklin Lakes, NJ 07417. We must receive all payments by Tuesday, October 1, 2019.

Our motorcoach will be departing at 5:30 am the morning of Saturday, October 26, 2019 from the MBS parking lot. Please arrive at least 20 minutes beforehand for check-in and seat assignments. When our motorcoach arrives in Franklin Lakes, do not board until your name is called. This will be done in the order of when your checks were received. If you are late in arriving, you may miss your name being called to board. We cannot save seats for those who arrive late. There are no refunds if the coach must depart without you, as all monies have already been disbursed. Because some of you need to arrange for rides on our return to Franklin Lakes in the evening, our estimated time of arrival will be approximately 10:00 pm.

The driving distance between Franklin Lakes and Washington, DC is approximately 250 miles. With a stop along the way for food, bathrooms, and to stretch our legs, driving time should be approximately 5 hours, barring any traffic problems we might encounter along the way. As for food, you may bring your own. However, lunch can be purchased at the basilica's cafeteria in DC, and dinner at the rest stop on our return.
