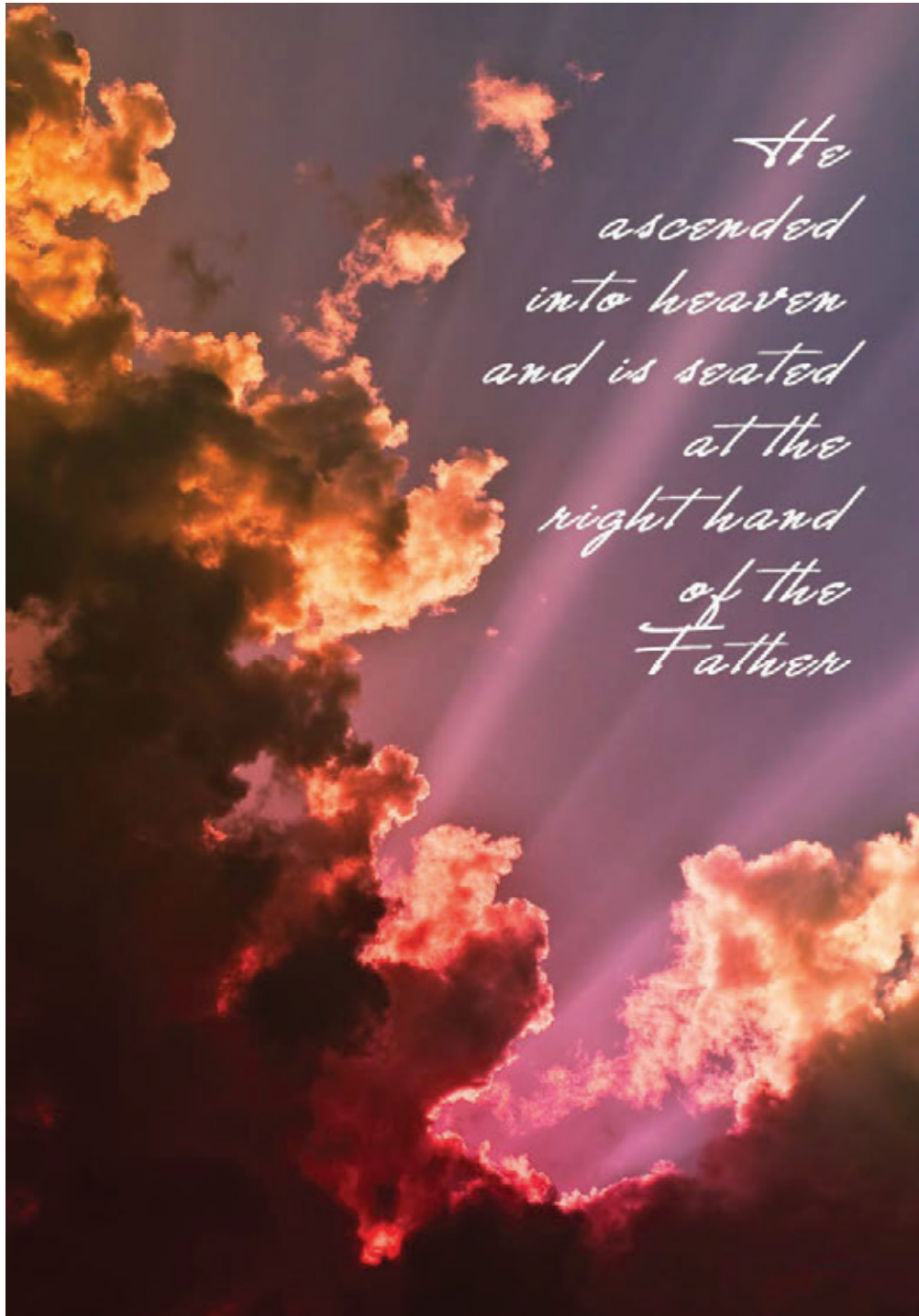

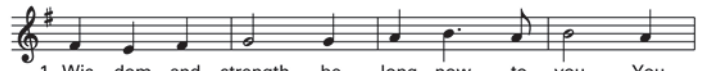

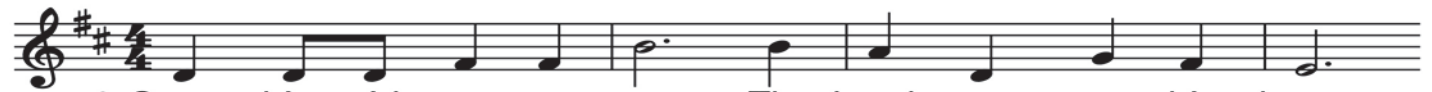

JUNE FAMILY PROMISE WALK-IN DINNER

MBS has been providing dinners for the Family Promise Walk-In Dinner program in Hackensack for many years.

Our next date for providing dinner is **June 5, 2021**.

Family Promise has been in touch to notify us that they are still providing "meals to go". The shelter is still closed. Family Promise is delivering meals to offsite locations and offering meals to the community at the facility's loading dock.

MBS has been asked to provide food to allow for **160 meals**.

As we have for the last two meals provided to Family Promise, we have reached out to a local restaurant to help cater the meal. The cost will be \$10.00 per meal.

In addition to the catered food, we will still need the following items:

Desserts that are **individually wrapped (in foil/plastic bags)** ready for handout. Dunkin donuts, brownies, cookies are all suggestions.

Cases of water bottles (Family promise has requested at least 100 bottles).

Utensils (fork, spoon, knife wrapped in a napkin).

To cover the \$1,600.00 cost of the meals we are asking for monetary donations. Any amount will be graciously accepted and appreciated. All money collected will be used for the meal on June 5, and any extra will be donated to Family Promise.

If you can provide a donation, please send checks made payable to MBS to either of us at the addresses below.

If you can donate desserts, water, or utensils, please contact either of us to let us know. We can arrange for delivery or pickup of the items.

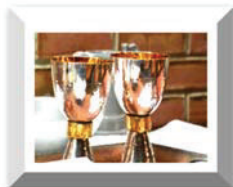

Catholic Stewardship *in* Action

MBS's Goal this Year is \$ 97,095.

→ If we reach this goal in funds collected by June 30th, the parish will have a 2% reduction in our Archdiocesan assessment for the next year. Our generosity to the Appeal by June 30th would save the parish \$18,657!!!

As of now we have in **FUNDS COLLECTED** \$88,356 or **91%** of the goal.
Needed by June 30th: \$8,739 to qualify for the 2% reduction.

→ If we reach this goal in funds pledged by June 30th, the parish will have a 1% reduction in our Archdiocesan assessment for the next year. Our generosity to the Appeal by June 30th would save the parish \$9,327!!!

As of now we have in **FUNDS PLEDGED** \$98,066 or **101%** of the goal.
We qualify for the 1% reduction!!! Thank you!!!

→ ***Finally, 100% of all funds collected in excess of the goal will be returned to the parish!!!***

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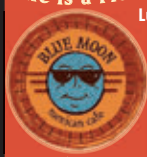
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
