MBS’s Goal this Year is \$ 97,095.

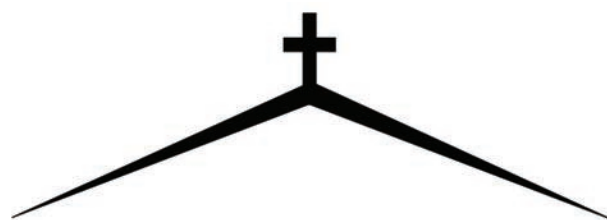
Since we reached this goal in funds collected before June 30th, the parish will have a 2% reduction in our Archdiocesan assessment. Our generosity to the Appeal has saved the parish **\$18,657!!!**

As of now we have in **FUNDS COLLECTED \$142,730** or **147% of the goal**, and in **FUNDS PLEDGED \$148,555** or **153% of the goal**. **Thank you so much!!!**

THE ADVENT CALENDAR—A Family Tradition

Advent means 'the coming,' and refers to the four-week season of preparation for the birth of Jesus on Christmas Day and the anticipation of His coming again. Advent begins on Sunday, November 28th and continues until December 24th.



The Advent calendar, which originated in 19th Century Europe, has 24 numbered flaps concealing a biblical scene and verse about the coming of the Messiah. Children especially enjoy opening a new door each day as Christmas draws near and we approach, once again, the Nativity of the Lord.

This year, Most Blessed Sacrament has Advent calendars for each family. They may be found on the table in the vestibule.

CELEBRATING THE SAINTS

Saint Rose Philippine Duchesne (1769-1852) was born in Grenoble, France. Rose entered the Visitation of Mary Convent. After the French Revolution, she joined the Society of the Sacred Heart. Her goal was to go to the United States and to work among the Native Americans. With four other sisters, she traveled the sea for 11 weeks and arrived in New Orleans. She then traveled the Mississippi to Saint Louis, Missouri. In Saint Charles, Missouri, Rose founded the first free school for girls west of the Mississippi. In Florissant, Missouri, she would open the first Catholic Indian school. At the age of 72, retired and in poor health, she would have her wish of opening a mission for the Potawatomi Indians in Sugar Creek, Kansas. The Potawatomi named her "Woman-Who-Prays-Always." Her feast day is November 18th.
