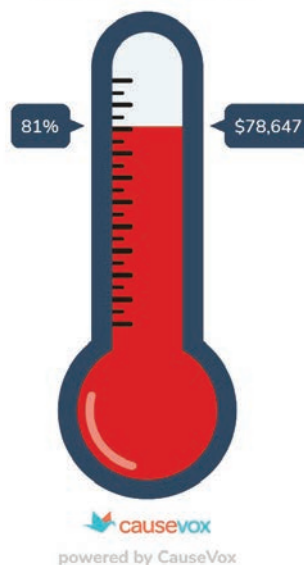

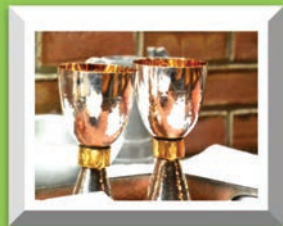

CELEBRATING THE SAINTS: Saint Anselm (1033-1109)

Indifferent toward religion as a young man, Anselm became one of the Church's greatest theologians and leaders. He received the title "Father of Scholasticism" for his attempt to analyze and illumine the truths of faith through the aid of reason.

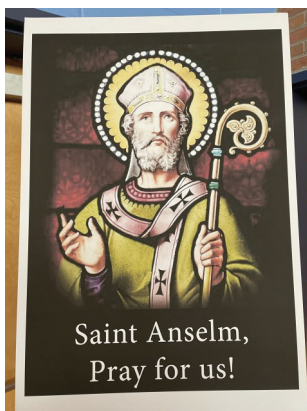
At 15, Anselm wanted to enter a monastery, but was refused acceptance because of his father's opposition. Twelve years later, after careless disinterest in religion and years of worldly living, he finally fulfilled his desire to be a monk. He entered the monastery of Bec in Normandy, was elected prior three years later, and 15 years later, was unanimously chosen abbot.

Considered an original and independent thinker, Anselm was admired for his patience, gentleness, and teaching skill. Under his leadership, the Abbey of Bec became a monastic school, influential in philosophical and theological studies.

During these years, at the community's request, Anselm began publishing his theological works, comparable to those of Saint Augustine. His best-known work is the book *Cur Deus Homo* ("Why God Became Man").

His care and concern extended to the very poorest people. Opposing the slave trade, Anselm obtained from the national council at Westminster the passage of a resolution prohibiting the sale of human beings.

A SPECIAL ANNOUNCEMENT ON THE SOLEMNITY OF THE ASCENSION OF THE LORD

On March 23, 2022, after serious discussion, the Latin-rite Diocesan Bishops of the Ecclesiastical Province of Newark (encompassing the state of New Jersey) decided, by unanimous vote, to transfer [permanently] the observance of the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord to the 7th Sunday of Easter, effective this year. As a result, in 2022, the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord will be celebrated in all the Latin-rite dioceses of New Jersey on Sunday, May 29, 2022 (as it is in most dioceses in the United States.), replacing the liturgical celebration and readings of the 7th Sunday of Easter.

THE EASTER VIGIL

The Easter Vigil took place on Saturday evening, April 16th, at Most Blessed Sacrament. The liturgy is the high point of the Easter triduum celebrating the passion and resurrection of Jesus. With a rich display of symbols, rites and readings, the Church in worship expresses her faith in the mystery that brings her into being.

At this year's Vigil, our parish was blessed to witness two baptisms, two confirmations, and the reception of an already baptized Christian into the Catholic Church.

This Easter, Karyn and Paul donated the ornamentation on the front of the stand. It is the **Chi Rho**. The ancient symbol is formed by superimposing the first two (capital) letters—chi and rho (**XP**)—of the Greek word **ΧΡΙΣΤΟΣ** (Christos) in such a way that the vertical stroke of the rho intersects the center of the chi.

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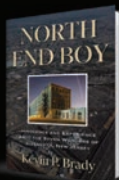

which is featured in the book.

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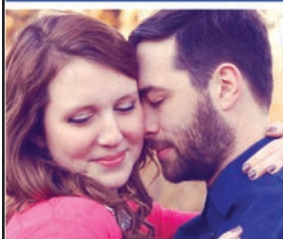
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
