The words and ideas expressed in our Gospel reading today would not have been considered in a crude or grotesque way. Rather it would have been understood that union with God in deep intimacy was its aim. The law of communion runs through nature as every living thing communes with another in order to sustain its life. Why then is it strange for Christ to say "unless you eat my flesh and drink my blood you have no life in you."? Wouldn't the plants say the same to us if they could speak?

The nourishment that we receive in Holy Communion is one that feeds the

divine potential within us. Without it, we cannot enter into the fullness of our nature - we are all tadpoles refusing to become frogs - fighting our nature. This is no way to live a rich and full existence. Fullness is what we were made for and it is fullness that we receive in Jesus Christ – perfection is achieved by Communion just as health and nourishment are achieved in our earthly communion with the plants and animals we consume.

May we be strong in the life that we share in Jesus Christ. May the food we consume fill us up. May Divine Life become for us a living reality of daily life... May Christ dwell in us richly. May divine blood pump in our veins. May the knowledge and love of God make us daily more aware of the blessedness that is Christian life. There are no problems or complaints or difficulties for us if this is the case. We will only love and become increasingly more beautiful by God's gift of himself and one another. Communion is the greatest thing that there is for us – to be one in the love of God with one another who gives us everything in giving us himself.



G.I.F.T.—Growing in Faith Together

St. Benedict's Ladder of Humility— Week 5 of 12

Step 5: REPENTANCE"Never hide any of the evil thoughts which arise in your heart or the evils you commit in secret. Instead, reveal them to someone you trust. For Scripture says, 'Commit your way to the Lord; trust in him.'" (Psalm 37:5)

Repentance explained—Repentance is voluntary sorrow because it offends God, for having done something wrong, together with the resolve to amend one's conduct by taking the necessary means to avoid the occasions of sin. To repent is to be sorry for sin with selfcondemnation.

Baptism was given to take away original sin. For sins committed after baptism, a different sacrament is needed. It has been called penance, confession, and reconciliation, each word emphasizing one of its aspects. During his life, Christ forgave sins, as in the case of the woman caught in adultery (John 8:1–11) and the woman who anointed his feet (Luke 7:48). He exercised this power in his human capacity as the Messiah or Son of man, telling us, "the Son of man has authority on earth to forgive sins" (Matt. 9:6), which is why the Gospel writer himself explains that God "had given such authority to men" (Matt. 9:8).

Since he would not always be with the Church visibly, Christ gave this power to other men so the Church, which is the continuation of his presence throughout time (Matt. 28:20), would be able to offer forgiveness to future genera-tions. He gave his power to the apostles, and it was a power that could be passed on to their successors and agents, since the apostles wouldn't always be on earth either, but people

would still be sinning.

A little about the visiting Deacons...
