Striving to know, love, and serve God in all others.

The Christian must finally come to the concept of the end of things. In truth, the Christian comes to these things first. Fulton Sheen once said that the pagan moves forward toward death and the Christian begins with death. If this is true, then we see death as a door that leads to life. As St. Paul indicates "death is gain". Do we live our lives like this?

Unfortunately, I think not. We are culturally opposed on these points and we often adopt attitudes that show that our thinking about the end (our own and/or the world's) is often avoided. We live in an age that avoids all that sheds light on these things. We do not even want to allow a sad thought into our lives. We spend time with escapes from death rather than appreciating that for the one who dies daily, death is indeed gain.

So what will happen to us? When we come before God we are called to account for our stewardship. How well did we love? What did we do with our talents? Bury them? Or, invest them? Did the others in your life, even your enemies, find Christ in you? I am reminded of the story of Abraham Lincoln who was criticized by an advisor for not destroying his enemies. He responded, "Do I not destroy my enemies when I make them my friends?" Wise, Christian and lovely is the thought that echoes this great statement.

So, as we consider the end, we realize some great ideas. Our universe is 14.7 billion years old. Our lives are very short and full yet of tremendous and profound meaning. The good we do echoes throughout the vastness of time and the endlessness of eternity. Our lives matter and they are made rich by a God who loves us poor unworthy creatures. Live your life like it was a song created on the breath of God – a great love song... Live it joyfully, fully knowing that you are his disciples, knowing that he is calling you back to himself... Let nothing frighten you – all is passing away and only God remains. May he recognize us as his own by the love we have for one another.

Pastor's note

You have all been very patient. Thank you! The boiler will hopefully be working at St. Mary's now, but if not, know we are working on the problem. Remember that in Europe and elsewhere that they do not even bother with heating at all even on the coldest days. This is too hard for me! But, I would ask that you join yourselves in prayer to the homeless and those working in the cold. Everything is being done to move this along. Again, I am impressed by your patience. Thank God it's not January!

We have had to make some changes to the Christmas masses. This is done because of the shortage of priests. We need to be aware that even just a few years ago the masses were celebrated with a priest in residence at St. Bridget's, two retired priests and with a priest in residence at St. Mary's in addition to a Pastor. We have only two total now. The reality is that this is likely to not get better any time soon. The Christmas schedule is as follows:

THE IMPORTANCE OF CONFIDENTIALITY IN STEPHEN MINISTRY



Confidentiality is a cornerstone of Stephen Ministry because it is absolutely essential for building safe, healing, caring relationships.

Stephen Ministers don't reveal what their care receivers have told them. Not to the pastor, not to the Stephen Leader, not to their spouses or friends, and not to other Stephen Ministers.

Why? Because trust is vital for a caring relationship to be effective. Care receivers are experiencing difficulties that leave them feeling very vulnerable. Discussing their innermost feelings is an important step in the healing process. But in order to open up and discuss that which is troubling them most, care receivers need complete trust in the Stephen Minister – and the assurance that what they say will not be circulated to others and become news for gossip.

This assurance builds trust and creates a safe place where care receivers can risk revealing their most painful issues – problems they might not even discuss with close friends or family. Confidentiality helps create a relationship that promotes healing and

Another aspect of confidentiality is that nobody – except the Stephen Minister, the care receiver and the Stephen leader who matched the two together – even knows that a care receiver has a Stephen Minister. Care receivers, of course, are free to tell others

about their relationship and who their Stephen Minister is, but the Stephen Minister never tells. This means a care receiver can choose to have complete anonymity so that if he or she doesn't want people even to know that he or she has a Stephen Minister, nobody will eve know.

One final point involving confidentiality involves the Stephen ministry model of supervision, where confidentiality is also a key element. (Supervision, done twice monthly, is vital to Stephen Ministry so that Stephen Ministers can provide the best quality care possible to their care receivers.) In supervision the focus of discussion is on the relationship between the Stephen Minister and the care receiver, rather than the details of what is going on in the care receiver's life. By not revealing a care receiver's name or any significant details, confidentiality is maintained, and supervision becomes a place where Stephen Ministers can support and encourage one another in ministry while they provide the best quality care to their care receivers. It's a model that has enabled life-changing ministry to happen in thousands of Stephen Ministry congregations since 1975.

Why all this talk about confidentiality? To build your trust in Stephen Ministry. It is a high-quality caregiving ministry that you can count on should you ever have the need. Confidentiality is a cornerstone of good ministry – and of our Stephen Ministry.

Our WINTER COAT DRIVE for the migrant community at Our Lady of Guadalupe Church is winding down. The generous donations of so many parishioners of new and used coats initially helped us fill 170 of the 226 requests. The tags which were available last weekend have all been taken, so we will soon be able to deliver all the coats to Marion.

CHRISTMAS GIFT TAGS are available in both churches this weekend. All presents will be due back by Sunday, December 9. This year as presents are returned to St. Mary's Church, we will be keeping them in the sanctuary until the distribution day.

Christmas gift tags this year will list only the needs of local children and migrant children at Our Lady of Guadalupe. No tags will list coats as requests. The seven other agencies we have supported in the past have all been notified of our need to reduce the number of gift requests we make; they will be receiving no gifts from St. Benedict's this year.

We are **NOT** scheduling a **BELL-RINGING DAY** for Salvation Army this year. Over the last several years we have been unable to staff all the stations around Canandaigua as we once were able.
