Rather, they proclaim their own ideas, sometimes deeply inconsistent with our tradition and the life we share in union with him and one another. We must understand that we are not people of Vatican II, or John Paul II, or Paul, or Peter even... We are His and our life's goal and the purpose of the Church is that we become related to him. The priesthood we share is not ours; it is Christ's alone.

This year on Epiphany, recognize who has been made manifest before you today. God became human not so we could proclaim ourselves, our own designs, but so that we could live his life and belong to him. From him flows true light and life and love. When we love, we find ourselves insufficient, but on course. And in this, life is worth living in truth. ~MC

#### THE MYSTERY OF THE EUCHARIST IN THE LIFE OF THE CHURCH

#### **II. OUR RESPONSE**

C) Conversion

44. Christ began his public ministry by calling people to repentance and conversion: *Repent, and believe in the gospel* (Mk 1:15; cf. Mt 4:17). It is thus fitting that, at the beginning of every Mass, we are invited to acknowledge our sins in order to prepare ourselves to celebrate the sacred mysteries. We confess that we have sinned, and we implore the Lord's mercy. This is necessary since we are all sinners and sometimes fail to live up to our vocation as disciples of Jesus and to the promises of our Bantism. We trust in his mercy, the mercy that we behold in his body broken for us and his blood poured out for us for the forgiveness of our sins. 
Shawls Available to Those in Need St. Benedict's Prayer Shawl Ministry has created prayer shawls, which are available at the PAC and at St. Bridget's
