




News from the Office of Parish Faith Formation

Why We Dismiss Candidates at Mass


Catecumens and Candidates are dismissed to study the Scriptures with R.C.I.A. Ministry members. They gather at the Parish Center to explore how the Scriptures are relevant to their lives of faith and to learn more about Catholic life and doctrine. Their dismissal has a definite purpose – to break open the Word and reflect on its meaning.

The Candidates are escorted to each session by 2 Catechists, who collaborate to read the Scriptures, lead the discussion and answer any questions. Later, their Sponsors join the group after Mass and contribute to the session. The Sponsors play a valuable role by encouraging participation and modeling for the Candidates how to live a faith-filled life in the Catholic community.

Just as the Parishioners are dismissed out into the world at the end of Mass, so too the Candidates are dismissed to learn and reflect as they prepare to receive the Sacraments.

HIS WORD TODAY

"You know the time in which we are living. It is now the hour for you to wake from sleep, for our salvation is closer than when we first accepted the faith... Let us cast off the deeds of darkness and put on the armor of light. Put on the Lord Jesus Christ and make no provision for the desires of the flesh."



For twenty centuries, faithful Christians have listened to and read Saint Paul's exhortation. No one can deny that his inspired word is not true. Because of the long time span though, we may have fallen asleep.

We are encouraged to begin this new period of advent with an eager enthusiasm, seeking ways to discover the presence of the Christ of history, as well as the Christ who is and is coming. Advent summons us to look with a new set of eyes at what the coming of Christ means for us in 2016.

He comes in the gift of friends. He comes in the gift of prayer. He comes from those in need who ask us to be light to overcome their darkness. As daylight grows short, may we be light for others to see that the coming of the Lord is even more important now than advent 2015. We pray the words of Revelation 'Come Lord Jesus.'

SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT December 6, 2016

First Reading: Isaiah 11:1-10

In this beautiful passage, a messianic prophecy, Isaiah exults in the coming of the Lord, who will bring justice and peace for all.

Second Reading: Romans 15:4-9

Paul reveals to us the necessity of living in peace and harmony. His words "Accept one another, then, as Christ accepted you, for the Glory of God" are as needed today as they were in Paul's own time.

Gospel: Matthew 3:1-12

John the Baptizer prepares the way for Jesus. Clothed in a garment of camel's hair, he baptizes the people in the Jordan River, but warns the Pharisees in ringing tones that they must give evidence that they mean to reform.

Also, please arrive 5-10 minutes before your session time begins!


