Second Document Released from the Council

(First was on Sacred Liturgy)

“Chief among them are those means of communication which of their nature can reach and influence not merely single individuals but the very masses and even the whole of human society”

“It will be principally for laypeople to animate these media with a Christian and human spirit and to ensure that they live up to humanity’s hopes for them, in accordance with God’s design”
