Rite of Election







This is the liturgical rite, usually celebrated on the First Sunday of Lent, by which the Church formally ratifies the catechumens' readiness for the sacraments of initiation and the catechumens, now the elect, express the will to receive the sacraments.

Rite of Election

Before the Rite of Election is celebrated, the catechumens are expected to have **undergone a conversion** in mind and action and to have developed a sufficient acquaintance with Christian teaching as well as a spirit of faith and charity. With deliberate will and an enlightened faith they must have the intention to receive the sacraments of the Church, a resolve they will express publicly at the actual celebration of the rite.

Rites Belonging to the Period of Purification and Enlightenment

In order to inspire in the elect a desire for purification and redemption by Christ, three scrutinies are celebrated....From the first to the final scrunty the elect should progress in their perception of sin ad their desire for salvation. RCIA, 143

First Scrutiny; The women at the well – John 4:5-42

Second Scrutiny; the man born blind – John 9:1-41

Third Scrutiny; the raising of Lazarus – John 11:1-45

Lectionary Year A is always used for the readings.
