In the video-based study A Biblical Walk Through The Mass, Dr. Edward Sri explores the roots of the words and gestures we experience at Mass and explains their profound significance. Drop-off & Pick-up Procedures

Preschool-Grade 5 Parents and guardians are asked to enter from Highway 545 through the alley directly in front of the parish center, not the Memorial Forest Road (Jefferson Street). Follow the traffic pattern set by the cones around to the East door (back side) of the Parish Center for drop-off. Do not drop off your children in the parking lot to walk into the Parish Center through the (west) main door. When you arrive at the doors, put your vehicle in PARK, or APPLY THE PARKING BRAKE before unloading. Children must cross around the FRONT of your vehicle before entering the Parish Center. Drivers are asked not to use electronic communication devices while in the traffic lane.

Both Locations (Parish Center and Church) Follow the directions for Preschool-Grade 5 first, then proceed west (left) on Jefferson Street (Memorial Forest Road), take an immediate right on Vine Street (behind the church) traveling up the hill, make a left onto the alley toward the church, merging with traffic coming from the north along Vine Street (the cemetery road).

Grade 6-High School At Louie's Tavern, turn east on Plum Street (towards the cemetery), turn right on Vine Street (along cemetery). Turn right, merging with traffic, onto the paved road to the north entrance of the church. At pick-up time, an identified traffic volunteer will coordinate the merging of Parish Center and Cemetery Alley traffic into 1 pick-up lane. The 1st vehicle is to stop at the west end of the handicap parking to allow for 4 vehicles to load at a time. An identified traffic volunteer will direct the vehicle where to stop.

Second Saturdays for Families The Second Saturday for Families program is an opportunity for members for our parish family, students, parents/guardian and catechists to gather for Mass, followed by a light supper, movie, and activities for all ages, including basketball, cornhole, board games, and Euchre. The goal of Second Saturdays for Families is for parents of children in the Faith Formation Program to meet and to share in fellowship, parental support, and an opportunity to meet their children's catechists. Children and their parents/guardians, Preschool through Grade 5, will receive a personal invitation to this activity and are asked to bring drinks for their family, and a fruit, vegetable, or dessert to share with others.

Who is in charge? As we continue to learn about Christ through this weekend's gospel, we hear another parable. We are reminded about a dishonest steward and the dangers of wealth. If we live our life in service to our money and material things, we devote ourselves to it and we live by it. Possessions and wealth are not evil, in and of, themselves. We must remain vigilant of how we use our possessions and wealth in building the kingdom of God. In the end, do we manage our possessions or do our possessions manage us?

A Statue In Place A recent addition to St. Meinrad Catholic Church has arrived. A modest statue of St. Theodora Guerin, co-patron of the Archdiocese of Indianapolis, is located in the southeast corner of the nave. "Mother Theodore," as she is often known, became the first saint from the Archdiocese of Indianapolis when she was canonized by Pope Benedict XVI in 2006. Responding to a request from the first bishop of Vincennes, Mother Theodore sailed from France, to settle in Indiana. She founded a community of religious sisters in Terre Haute, whose mission was education and caring for the sick. This community is now known as the Sisters of Providence of St. Mary-of-the-Woods. Soon added to the space will be a plaque identifying the saint and a votive candle.

Faith Formation Faith Formation has begun with its various programs and activities. I am amazed at the number of students, catechists, catechist aides and volunteers who make up this comprehensive program. I look forward to joining preschool through high school for their Opening Mass on Wednesday evening at St. Boniface. Soon our 10th and 11th grades will be celebrating the Sacrament of Confirmation. Let us keep these young people in prayer as they prepare to complete the sacraments of initiation, as well as their sponsors and parents. Whether we are in preschool, grade school, junior high, high school, or fully initiated members of the church, young and old alike, it is important for us to all continue to learn about Jesus and how we are called to holiness and to mission, making the church visible in our community, county, state, and world, a lifelong priority. To love Christ is to be in love with him. Do we spend the

same amount of time with Christ as in our other relationships? Grades 10 & 11 are not scheduled to formally meet until October, as listed in the schedule. In these sessions we will explore options for continued formation and community involvement. Thank you for your good example to our young people, particularly your visible presence at Sunday Mass and in the liturgical ministries that you serve for our parish family.
