PADRE'S POST

100 Years of Fatima - What were the apparitions seen in Fatima? In the years 1916 and 1917, through the tutelage of an angel and the Blessed Mother, two young children were led to holiness in just a few short years. That tutoring began in the spring of 1916 with three visitations of the Guardian Angel of Portugal, apparitions which served as preparation for the visits the following year of the Mother of God.

I have noticed at any given Mass, there remains chaos around identifying who is scheduled to serve as an usher. Please communicate among yourselves before the beginning of Mass; the first person listed in the bulletin should coordinate these efforts.

Also for your convenience, included in this weekend's bulletin is the Transfer Authorization for Direct Deposit for your regular stewardship giving. If you will be planning around random local Mass schedules or will be traveling throughout the Summer, try direct deposit. This will keep your financial stewardship steady and will make the accounting of your gift simplified in the office and for end-of-year statements.

Gratitude As the Faith Formation comes to a close, I want to extend my sincere gratitude to all who support this program, from womb to tomb, from Children's Liturgy of the Word, to the eldest member of the adult study group, we all benefit. I was happy to gather recently to celebrate with the catechists and other volunteers, along with their families, from the Faith Formation Program. A special note of thanks to all who coordinate our particular programs that form so many throughout their lifelong journey with Christ and his Church. Each catechist and volunteer who support these programs received a copy of *Prayer for Caregivers* to accompany them throughout the Summer months.

Our Way to Christ In today's gospel, Jesus tells us that he is our way, the roadmap to the Father, to heaven. He is the way, the truth, and the life. By following his example of a life lived in service to all, we point ourselves to the way to the Father. How do we read this roadmap? How do we know the way to Christ?

As Catholics, we encounter the Lord in the sacraments and liturgical prayer (Mass) of the Church. Christ is present to us at Mass, in Sacred Scripture and the Eucharist, as well as in the sacraments of healing (reconciliation and anointing of the sick), and in baptism, confirmation, and matrimony. In these sacraments, especially the ones we celebrate regularly, like Eucharist and the sacraments of healing, Christ strengthens us in our everyday lives and shows us a way we are invited to walk with him. The map that is Christ also appears to us in Sacred Scripture. We can learn about Jesus by reading about him, especially in the Gospels. Saint Jerome insists that ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ. So let us check our directions, our maps and GPS, every now and again, to ensure that we are on the path to holiness with Christ as our guide. The way we choose to go along the path of life can take some interesting twists and turns, so we need to make sure that we are walking with Christ. Keep Jesus, your map, handy and trust in the way to God that is the Church and its mission. *PAX – Father Anthony, OSB*
