PADRE'S POST

Prayer Request Please continue to keep the Waninger family in your prayer. David is gaining strength and mobility while remaining hospitalized. Funeral arrangements are pending for Raven until David can be present for the funeral. Their children Hayley and Dawson are residing with a family member. Family members are staying at the house until it is once again occupied. Many people have asked what they can do to help the family. My response has been “pray for their healing from this tragedy, pray for the doctors, nurses and all who are caring for them.” When the family returns to their home, they will need another level of care and support and we as a parish family can be there for them. A fund has been

established to benefit the Waninger family and may be added to at any Old National Bank. The name of the fund – Benefit of the Waninger Family.

Why do we need the Holy Spirit? Today we celebrate the great day of Pentecost. Our scripture readings focus on the Holy Spirit coming down upon the early Christians, led by the Apostles, but that does not explain why the Holy Spirit is necessary. In one sense, this celebration seems removed from us, a “once upon a time” story, however, we should not forget that the same Holy Spirit that descended upon the Apostles came to us when we became full members of the Church in the Sacrament of Confirmation. When the Archbishop laid his hands upon us and called down the Spirit, we were made sharers in the power of the Spirit. While we are not the Apostles, and we are not their successors, the bishops, we are members of the Church, and we share in the power and truth that has been given to all of them through their ordination. So, while we cannot make official declarations, we can live the truth of the faith in our everyday lives. We cannot ordain men to the priesthood, but we can encourage people to consider vocations within the church of priesthood, consecrated life, or sacramental marriage. We are not missionaries, but we can pray for the Spirit to stir up the heart of those called to be missionaries. The same Holy Spirit that pulled at the hearts of Peter and Paul dwells within us. Today, we pray for the Spirit to come and renew the face of the earth. At the same time, it is easy for us to forget that we, “ordinary men, women, and children of faith” that we are, are often the instruments by which the Spirit renews the world, including our parish family and the greater community. As we conclude this Easter season, let us see how the Spirit is working with us to accomplish the renewal this world desperately needs. The Spirit desires to work with us and in us; are we willing to be part of its mission?

Celebrating the Feast Day of Saint Boniface It is hard for me to realize that it was only a year ago that members of our parish family made our pilgrimage to Fulda, Germany. The grand celebration on the church plaza with thousands of people who walked from their home parishes singing the traditional feast day song, accompanied by their local parish bands, remains a vivid memory in my mind and heart. The actual feast day is June 5. Let us ask for Saint Boniface’s powerful intercession to renew and strengthen our parish family, notably renewing those who hold Historic St. Boniface to be their home parish. We have so much to be grateful for; I pray that this weekend is one of joy, gratitude, good health, and safety. Father John will be principal celebrant for all Masses this weekend. I will be away attending the priesthood ordination of Matthew Solyntjes serving as the seminary representative. Matthew graduated from the seminary in May and served in various leadership roles in Project Warm CACD, most recently serving as the student manager. While in Iowa, I plan to visit nearby family in Des Moines, and finally have the opportunity to meet a new nephew, Nicholas, born in March. On a personal note, I do not have the physical strength or ability to sustain large crowds with jumbled sound and amplified music. Since treatment, when I have tried to integrate back into this level of activity, my cranial nerve ‘fires up,’ pain becomes unmanageable, and I become physically sick. In a recent conversation with my doctor, he recommended that I make other plans for the weekend and not to be tempted to think I can handle something that could compromise the interior healing from its progress. The Lord provides! This year, I was not able to attend the high school and seminary commencement exercises. I will be praying for you all; please continue to prayer for me. I have great confidence in the leadership making this year’s celebration possible. Enjoy! Saint Boniface pray for us!
