Archabbot Kurt Stasiak, OSB, has assigned Father Paul Nord, OSB, to serve our parish family as an associate priest for sacramental assistance, and pastoral care for homebound, sick, and infirm. He will serve with Father Anthony and Father John in the weekly rotation of Masses and pastoral ministries.

Just as Father Anthony will continue his assigned work in seminary formation and Father John will continue as prior of the monastic community, Father

Paul will continue teaching in the seminary and work on completing his dissertation. He will fill the role that Father Guy Mansini, OSB, has been filling since December. With Father Paul's addition to the parish staff, all three priests will share in the responsibilities of serving the parishes.

Father Paul is originally from St. Francis of Assisi Parish – St. Joseph, Dale. He graduated from Southridge High School in Huntingburg in 1993, and Rose-Hulman Institute of Technology in 1997. He worked as a Chemical Engineer in Terre Haute and Chicago before beginning priesthood formation at Saint Meinrad in 1999. He entered the monastery in 2002. In July 2016, he returned to the monastery from advanced Biblical studies in Rome, and he now teaches full time in the Seminary and School of Theology. His family is from northern Spencer County, and he is related to the Dilger, Schum, and Scheessele families and, more distantly, to the Wagner, Mohr, Roos, and Maffenbeier families, and the local families originally from Dudenhofen, Germany. The Fortnight for Freedom is from June 21 - the vigil for the Feasts of Saint John Fisher and Saint Thomas More - to July 4, Independence Day. With the increasing polarization in our culture, we all can benefit from a greater understanding of religious freedom in a way that respects all people. We are called to follow Christ as missionary disciples, by seeking the truth, serving others, and living our faith in all that we do. As we anticipate celebrating Independence Day, I invite each of us to take time to pray, reflect, and take action on religious liberty, both here in this country and abroad. The Crest of Fulda, Germany Throughout the celebration of BoniFest, a number of people asked about the crest used in the advertising. Where did it come from? Its origin comes from a combination of the cross of the Fulda Abbey, and the symbol of the patron saint of the abbey, Saint Boniface. It dates back to the oldest known seal of the city, from the late 13th century.

The coat of arms is divided into 3 different areas, each with its own meaning. The five-point crown depicts the city wall, the 3 lilies growing on the 3 mountains stands for the 3 siblings, Simplizius, Faustinus and Beatrix, the three protective patrons of the city. The red background identifys the three died as martyrs. Since the city owes its origin to the monastery of Fulda, on a silver background is the continuous black cross from the coat of arms of the abbey, where Saint Boniface is entombed and revered as the "Apostle of the Germans" for bringing the faith to the area. He and 52 others died as martyrs in 754.

Family Is Important Soon after arriving as your pastor, I realized the familial ties in the area were strong. Many of you have aunts, uncles, cousins, and extended family in the area surrounding St. Boniface and St. Meinrad. So, the scripture passage for the weekend, calling us to place our love of God above that of our family and friends may seem out of order. That would have been a surprise to his listeners, too; family dynamics were very important for Jesus' Jewish audience. He is not telling us to ignore family, but instead to place God first. When Jesus speaks, we have to remember that he is not a mere human being, but a Second Person of the Holy Trinity, and, thus, as God, he is not telling us to place a stranger ahead of family, but to hold God first and foremost in our lives. Christ is not telling us to completely ignore family, but instead to place God first. We are called to regularly visit our relatives and friends, as long as they do not become like little gods that we are aiming to please along the way of salvation. This week, we are encouraged to make God first in our lives; how do we do this well, and how do we put other things and people first before God? As we prepare to celebrate July 4, Independence Day, let us reflect on where our priorities lie and how we live up to what is embossed on our currency "In God We Trust".
