PADRE'S POST

Remembering Souls Over the past few weeks, I have been writing on the topic of sharing in the work of compassion, compassion particularly for those who are in need. Christ and his Church have given us many ways of praying for others as we gather for sacramental worship, such as having a Mass said for a particular intention or praying that the graces received at one's reception of Holy Communion are applied to a soul in need. However, there are other ways our devotions can be expressed outside the Eucharistic celebration in our ordinary, day to day activities, such as when we gather at the table in our own homes.

As we approach the annual celebrations of All Saints' and All Souls', we remember those who have gone before us. All of us know someone who has died. Perhaps these losses are more recent for some of us, but we have all lost someone. As I wrote a few weeks ago, our prayer can help the souls of our friends and family in purgatory through the pious tradition of including a prayer for the repose of the souls of the faithful departed while already praying at one's meal prayers, either at the beginning or the end of the meal. One prayer I recommend in particular is the prayer that is included in the funeral liturgy, at grave side, but we can use this prayer daily in our homes as well. It goes like this: "Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord. And let the perpetual light shine upon them. And may the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen." I can remember praying this prayer as a child when gathering at my grandparents' home not realizing until years later what it means and how important this prayer is for the souls that have passed from this world. By adding this short prayer to our regular meal prayer from now until the end of November, the month traditionally dedicated to the Holy Souls in purgatory, who knows how many souls will be cleansed of their sins and welcomed into the sight and full communion with God. These souls will be grateful and will show their gratitude by praying constantly for you, your family and your special intentions. This week, if you do not already, I invite you to consider beginning to remember the beloved dead at your meal prayers; you too are participating in the holy and eternal exchange between heaven and earth.

The Parish Mission Lives On I was very moved by your attendance, laughter, singing and prayer each evening as we gathered this past week for our Parish Mission. Father Jim Sichko, a priest of the Diocese of Lexington, did a fantastic job leading, challenging and inviting us as a parish family to a greater call to discipleship and evangelization. Each evening I jotted down a few notes to reflect upon as I closed my day with gratitude and prayer. Now the big question is where do you and I go from here? On the final evening of the mission, before the closing hymn, I asked each of you to think about and answer three distinct questions for yourself. I invite each of you to continue praying through these questions asking for the Holy Spirit to guide you and I, and our parish family on its providential path: 1. What did you learn about yourself through participating in the Parish Mission, 2. What did you learn about your parish family through participating in the Parish Mission, 3. What did you learn about Christ and His church while participating in the Parish Mission? Each of us is called to share in the life of the church through the gifts and talents that we already hold; we need the Word of God, the sacraments of the church, and this community of faith itself to draw out our goodness and smooth out our rough edges so that we can be a light of hope throughout all the seasons of our life. I admired Father Jim's challenge, his equation for an attractive, healthy and holy community, parish family: be kind (keep your mouth shut), honor the absent (care for and be concerned about those who do not gather regularly with us, and stop talking about them and reach out to them), and focus on the positive (when appropriate address the negative). The only way we can fail at this is by not trying. I want to express my sincere thanks to Jeremy and Amy Schipp and their lively committee, made up by parishioners from both SB & SM, for their outstanding leadership in preparing for and making our Parish Mission possible and a priority for us to encounter at this time in your life together as a parish family.
