#### PADRE'S POST

5<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time In today's gospel we hear that famous line in scripture "do not be afraid". Jesus shared this phrase with Simon when he invited him to follow. Peter confesses that he is a sinful man and thereafter together with James and John, Simon leaves everything behind and follows the master teacher. Centuries later, on the day of the Inauguration of His Pontificate, St. Pope John Paul, (chosen by the Holy Spirit to serve as 264<sup>th</sup> Supreme Pontiff, last pope to serve in the 2<sup>nd</sup> millennium, and successor of St. Peter, the 1<sup>st</sup> pope), shared from St. Peter's Square, on Sunday, October 22, 1978, in his homily to the faithful gathered in the square, watching on television, or listening through radio, those great words three times, "do not be afraid".

Karol Józef Wojtyła was born in Poland, served in the military, suffered and saw many of his family members suffer under the rise of Hitler, and through his years as a priest and archbishop of Kraków, Poland, he knew what those words meant personally and for his people. As we listen to the scripture readings this weekend, we are reminded that we are to accept the invitation to follow our Lord and Jesus Christ, to follow and to sing His praises. The Paschal Mystery that we share in every time we gather for Mass, Christ's Suffering, Death, Resurrection and Ascension as we profess in the Creed, binds us to this good news. As Paul reminds us, he sees himself as the least of Jesus' followers and the least of Christ's Apostles by his behavior and sin against the Church. However, in his deficiency he is not ineffective but effective in his ministry, inviting others to follow in the ways of Christ and His Church. In the scriptures, the call of Peter, James and John can be simply thought of as a radical turning away from all things or it can be an inspiration for us that when we choose to follow Christ we may never know where we are going or how we are getting there, but God will provide through the precious gift of providence, leading us now and forever into the promise of eternal life. I invite you in the days to come to meditate, think about, on the words "thy will be done" that we often find ourselves praying halfheartedly or with some distraction in the Lord's Prayer. Over the last years I have meditated on these sacred words and have learned to more and more trust in God's Will over mine. I continue to pray for our parish family daily asking the Lord to be

Almsgiving On February 6, Ash Wednesday was a month away! Soon we will be discussing among family and friends what we might add to our life for Lent in the ways of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Since Lent of 2010, my first Lent, Sacred Triduum and Easter with you, I have challenged our parish family to add to their life in Lent, over deleting something. Adding prayer, fasting and almsgiving to your daily routine throughout the 40 Days of Lent, my prayerful hope is that you will continue with the discipline you have brought to life and have strengthened your spiritual life throughout Lent. Next Wednesday, students preschool through grade 6 will receive Sunday Stewardship Envelopes to be used to develop a habit and awareness for almsgiving. Each class will have a seminarian catechist give a brief presentation on almsgiving. All stewardship gifts received through these envelopes will be directed to Catholic Charities, Tell City, to directly impact the poor and marginalized, and our brothers and sisters who are "in between and needing a hand up and not a hand out" for their family due to illness, unemployment or having a particular need. Catholic Charities, Tell City, helps people of all ages and does not discriminate against other faiths or situations. We find almsgiving first mentioned in the Old Testament as a way to support the poor, and after Jesus' life on earth in the New Testament we see almsgiving as a way to support the "living saints among us" that Jesus spoke of in Matthew 25, the hungry, thirsty, the stranger among us, naked, sick, and the imprisoned. By use of the children's Sunday Stewardship Envelopes, the young church will make a direct impact on the tri-county area. Our homeschooled families will also receive stewardship envelopes as well as families who actively participate in Children's Liturgy of the Word.
