PADRE'S POST

3rd Sunday of Easter Jesus' invitation, whether it is to put out once again a worn net that produced nothing in its last cast, or to follow him as a disciple, requires faith. Often, we parallel our faith to something that is familiar, our favorite bible passage, our own way around the rosary beads, our favorite prayer or place to think and pray. If it is familiar or something we are comfortable with, by all means we will engage and strive to persevere. If it is something unfamiliar or new, we may feel that our faith is being tested. In today's Gospel, the fishermen that Jesus revealed himself to at the Sea of Tiberius must have thought that he really had no idea what he was asking of them – a rookie. However, when they put the net into the Sea, they pulled in 153 large fish with no damage to their nets. Throughout our life we may be asked to do new things, put our nets into the deep from a different side of the boat, like Jesus' disciples, to recalibrate our life, our comfort in thought or action, or in taking the risk to something different, or share one of our gifts or talents that we may not have even discovered yet for ourselves. When we begin something in faith at God's invitation, in and through faith there will be plenty of what is needed – resources, accomplishments, gifts to share – if we follow Jesus' invitation. Let us pray in the days to come that we have the courage to be in the uncomfortableness of invitations and to see the beauty of God revealed in others.

Faith & Action Congratulations to our First Communion candidates. It is a privilege to celebrate this day with you, your family, especially your parents and god-parents, and other guests who have joined you today. Celebrate well; enjoy and take to heart the gift of the Eucharist that you have been learning about and preparing to receive. For Catholics, the Eucharist is the source and summit of our faith, that is to say, the Eucharist is what our church has its humble beginnings from 2000 years ago when Jesus gathered with his disciples on the night before he died to celebrate the first Mass, the Passover, with his disciples. The Eucharist is what gathers us day after day, Sunday after Sunday, year after year to receive the Lord Jesus Christ, Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. This is how we follow that command, "do this in memory of me;" we gather to celebrate Mass in memory of Jesus Christ and the Church he found for us and our salvation. You remain in my prayer.

Please be attentive to your commitments related to your spiritual life, in particular, your sacramental life as Catholics. One of the great privileges of being Catholic, a member of the universal Church, no matter where you find yourself, the Word of God and the Sacraments are yours to celebrate.
