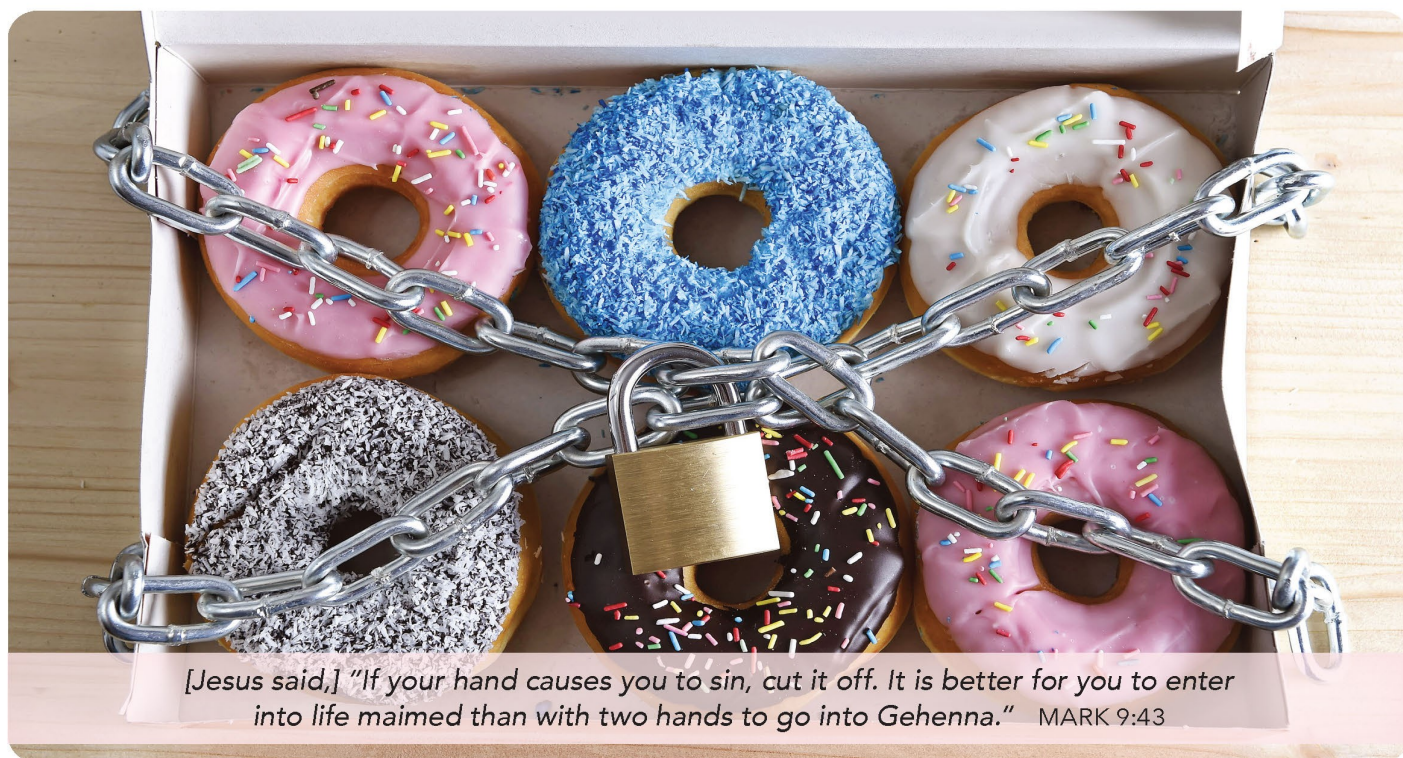

Isn't That a Bit Extreme?

No sacrifice is too extreme in pursuit of a dream. We will forego sleep, the enjoyment of a favorite pastime, the company of good friends—even the pleasure of good food. Ask anyone who has spent hours preparing for a recital, trying out for a position on an athletic team, or studying for an entrance exam. The same is true when one's livelihood is involved. Ask farmers, people in the military, teachers, or health-care workers. Ask new parents, or even those who have been at it for a long time. If we really value something or someone, no sacrifice is too great—at least for a while—when that cherished goal is in view.

We don't seem as willing to forfeit comfort when negative inclinations are involved, and we all have them: rivalry, jealousy, fury, selfishness, slander,

gossip, conceit, to name a few. We know that such pettiness or rank cruelty can harm us as well as those we offend, but too often we seem unwilling to restrain such inclinations.

In today's Gospel passage, Jesus speaks quite strongly to such reticence. Does he really expect us to maim ourselves? Isn't that a bit extreme? The fact is, when we try to purge ourselves of reprehensible behavior it is like cutting off our hand or plucking out our eye. Ask anyone who deals with an addiction. If Jesus asks this of us, it means that we certainly have the strength to do it.

The Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Sacrament of the Eucharist: Basic Questions and Answers

Part 3 of a 10 Part Series

Produced by the Committee on Doctrine of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops and approved by the full body of bishops at their June 2001 General Meeting.

3. *When the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ, why do they still look and taste like bread and wine?*

In the celebration of the Eucharist, the glorified Christ becomes present under the appearances of bread and wine in a way that is unique, a way that is uniquely suited to the Eucharist. In the Church's traditional theological language, in the act of consecration during the Eucharist the "substance" of the bread and wine is changed by the power of the Holy Spirit into the "substance" of the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. At the same time, the "accidents" or appearances of bread and wine remain. "Substance" and "accident" are here used as philosophical terms that have been adapted by great medieval theologians such as St. Thomas Aquinas in their efforts to understand and explain the faith. Such terms are used to convey the fact that what appears to be bread and wine in every way (at the level of "accidents" or physical attributes - that is, what can be seen, touched, tasted, or measured) in fact is now the Body and Blood of Christ (at the level of "substance" or deepest reality). This change at the level of substance from bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ is called "transubstantiation." According to Catholic faith, we can speak of the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist because this transubstantiation has occurred (cf. *Catechism*, no. 1376). This is a great mystery of our faith—we can only know it from Christ's teaching given us in the Scriptures and in the Tradition of the Church. Every other change that occurs in the world involves a change in accidents or characteristics. Sometimes the accidents change while the substance remains the same. For example, when a child reaches adulthood, the characteristics of the human person change in many ways, but the adult remains the same person—the same substance. At other times, the substance and the accidents both change. For example, when a person eats an apple, the apple is incorporated into the body of that person—is changed into the body of that person. When this change of substance occurs, however, the accidents or characteristics of the apple do not remain. As the apple is changed into the body of the person, it takes on the accidents or characteristics of the body of that person. Christ's presence in the Eucharist is unique in that, even though the consecrated bread and wine truly are in substance the Body and Blood of Christ, they have none of the accidents or characteristics of a human body, but only those of bread and wine.

PADRE'S POST

26TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Today we continue in the Gospel of Mark, Chapter 9, with the theme, "Everyone can proclaim Christ." Jesus reminds his followers that nothing done in His name will go unrewarded. As you recall last Sunday, Jesus instructed his disciples "Whoever receives one child such as this in my name, receives me; and whoever receives me, receives not me but the one who sent me." Jesus reminds his disciples today that holiness is found in the truth as long as the truth is spoken in charity and love. He says that anyone who receives a simple believer, whether childlike in stature, faith or socio-economic status is to do so with the love of Christ. Jesus came to remind us that in our life of knowing God, loving God and serving God we are to offer ourselves as Christ did, laying down his life for us. When we receive a simple believer, one curious about the faith, we are called to lay down our life for one another. How do you handle conflict? Do you follow the traditions found in scripture? Speak first with the person, then in the presence of him or her and others who also cares for them and then finally seeking counsel by facilitation so that an independent party can help guide the conversation to an agreeable conclusion.

What I have learned over the years is what I often share with couples, throughout their preparation to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage, which is to be "ABCing" (to always be communicating). As we hear in Numbers, Chapter 11, prophets are chosen by God. Eldad and Medad, though absent when the Lord empowered 70 elders with the gift of prophecy, also received the gift. Some elders complained because they were absent and Moses reminded those complaining that no matter the situation, it is important to be grateful when people receive a gift from God or others. Saint James in his letter Chapter 5 teaches that the invitation to come to God is for those who weep and wail in their miseries. Whether their miseries are tied to worldly wealth or lack of faith, we hear in Psalm 19 today that the love of God, the precepts of the Lord, give joy to the heart.

I pray that as you seek the face of God in the coming days you encounter the joy that renews not only your heart, but your hope in what lies ahead. God's love and mercy is for us to receive through Jesus and the Church and for us to share with others in our journey with Christ.

Have a blessed week. Let us continue to pray for the family of Hailee Houston who died on September 20 after suffering extensive injuries in an auto accident west of St. Meinrad on September 10. Hailee would have celebrated her 18th birthday on September 22. I also ask that you pray for our local volunteer fire fighters and first responders. Their work is often unseen. If you see a member of the St. Meinrad Fire Department or your local fire department, tell them thank you. Let us also show our gratitude by

supporting their annual Open House on Sunday, October 3, at the St. Meinrad Community Center and Park. Pray for a successful day and support their activities, whether in person or visiting one of their food stands for a carry out meal.

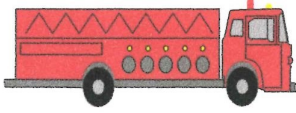

Dear Padre,

Isn't evangelization a role best left to religious professionals? I worry about being ridiculed if I try to spread the Good News. Any suggestions?

Many Catholics incorrectly assume that evangelization is not their job but a task for priests, deacons, or others serving in an official capacity. But it is helpful to remember that evangelization is more a matter of commitment rather than a specialized competence. The Gospel proclaims that a disciple must go out into the world and spread the Good News.

Evangelization is the mission and purpose of the whole Church. It is doing God's will and work on earth.

Your anxiety about being ridiculed may arise from a notion that others will reject information about Jesus Christ. This fear may be underestimating the powerful attraction of the Good News. This worry may be based on your own lack of confidence rather than the response of others. There are several ways for dealing

with this concern: First, acknowledge this fear and seek counsel and advice from someone who has overcome it. Second, remember that to help us offset these negative emotions we are all given the fruits of the Holy Spirit: joy, love, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control. Third, remember the future—God works in mysterious ways, and grace, though powerful, may take a long time to come to fruition.
