Who Was This Man?

Peter, John, and James must have asked this question themselves. This Jesus was certainly not the man they had come to know. Here he was radiant, and his clothing was dazzling. Furthermore, he was in deep conversation with two of the greatest heroes of the religious tradition: Moses, the agent of the law, and Elijah the prophet. And then there was that voice that identified Jesus as “my chosen Son” and commanded them to “listen to him” (Luke 9:35). What were they to think? What would anyone think? Who was this man?

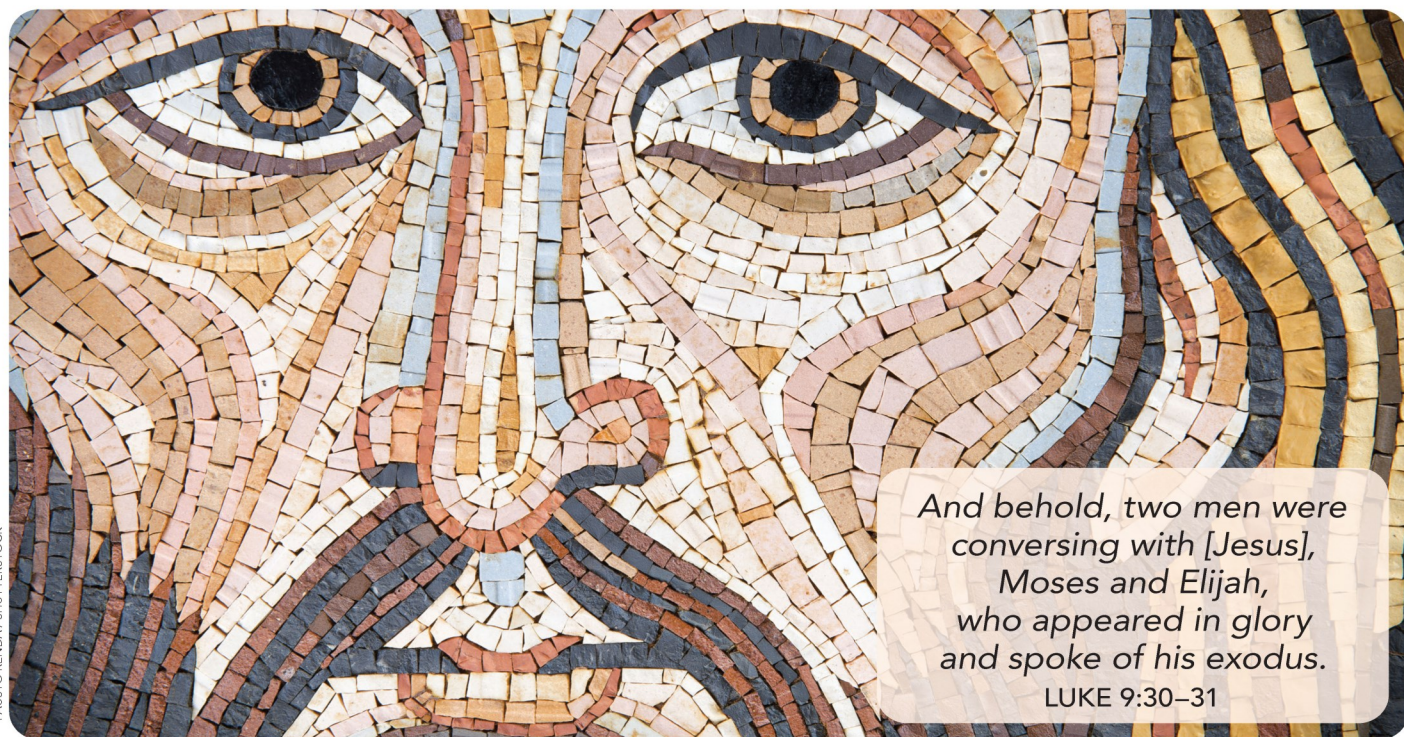
Jesus’ own experience was quite different. While he prayed, he was transfigured, and in that transformed state he engaged Moses and Elijah in conversation. They discussed his future death in Jerusalem, his exodus, his deliverance. It is important to note that they maintain that his exodus was to be his own accomplishment—not a deed done to him. Who was this man?

It was the mysterious voice from the cloud that provided an answer to that question: “This is my chosen Son.” But what did “my Son” mean? Unlike we who profess faith in the Trinity, it’s likely the disciples still had to learn what being God’s Son was all about. However, they must have realized that it meant something about Jesus’ relationship with God. Every aspect of this mystifying experience told them so. When they came to their senses, the light had disappeared, the ancient men were gone, the voice was silent. And there he was again, the man they had come to know. But who was this man?

Registered parishioners desiring to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage must contact the parish office a minimum of six months before the proposed wedding date to reserve the church and other parish spaces. Visit the parish office during office hours or [inquire online](#) to begin the marriage inquiry process and to request an initial appointment to start preparing to receive this sacrament.

The Gospel at Home

This Week's Gospel: Luke 9:28b-36

Jesus journeys to a mountain with Peter, James, and John in this Sunday's Gospel. While praying, Jesus becomes transfigured. His glory shows through as the ancient Israelite leaders Moses and Elijah speak with him. Then the voice of God tells the Apostles that Jesus is his Son. "Listen to him."

Exploring the Gospel Message

Seeds (Preschool): This week's lesson teaches that Jesus is God's Son. Talk with your child about your relationship with the Son of God, especially how you hear and listen to him. The class also recorded prayer times and places. This would be a good week to plan regular prayer times or maybe add to them. Encourage your child to find times and places to pray to Jesus.

Promise (Grades K-1): This week your child read about what God revealed during the Transfiguration. Ask your child what the voice from the cloud said about Jesus. Check out your child's Prayer Pocket from this week's class. Encourage your child to pray on his or her own as well as with family and friends.

Good News (Grades 2-3): Your child explored who they are by answering eight questions. Ask your child what he or she would shout from a mountaintop? Your child also wrote seven short prayers about what they are thankful for, so be sure to ask what some of those prayers were. Discuss as a family how you listen to Jesus. Ask your child about "Mai's Poem" from class, and how Abraham and Sarah listened to God. Ask, too, what the Transfiguration is.

Venture (Grades 4-6): In this week's class your young person learned about the time of Abraham. He or she also read a story about fifth-graders who wrote chapters about themselves for a book. Share a story from your grade school days. Ask your child to imagine what it must have been like for the Apostles to see the Transfiguration of Jesus. Ask your young person to explain the Lord's Prayer, then pray it together as a family. What are the welcoming, healing, and loving signs your family shares with others? Ask your youngster what he or she learned from the game based on The Lord's Prayer.

Visions (Grades 7-9): Listening to the Lord and looking at things from different points of view was how this week's class started. Have your young person describe the story of Kubisa Muzenende. Be sure to ask about Daniel Baguma, a child soldier from Rwanda. How has your family helped people? What is your young person's Lenten Commitment? Pray for his or her success. Maybe incorporate the Psalms into the prayer as the class did this week.

Pray Together

God commanded the Apostles and us to listen to Jesus, his Son. During prayer this week, include some silent time to listen to what God is telling your hearts. Share what each of you heard the Lord saying to you. Pray to the Holy Spirit for guidance in following Jesus' teaching in our lives.

Lenten Almsgiving

In his 2018 Message for Lent, Pope Francis said, "Almsgiving sets us free from greed and helps us to regard our neighbor as a brother or sister. What I possess is never mine alone. . . . When we give alms, we share in God's providential care for each of his children. If through me God helps someone today, will he not tomorrow provide for my own needs? For no one is more generous than God."



The following fact of faith is offered by Rev. Larry Rice, CSP

During Lent, Catholics prepare for the celebration of Easter by observing a penitential season of repentance, renewal, and on-going conversion. Lent calls us back to the basics of our faith, acknowledging that we are all sinners, all in need of God's grace. Traditionally, Lent has been a time of renewed prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

Of these three disciplines, almsgiving is probably the least well understood. After all, works of charity and giving to the poor are supposed to be part of how we live in every season. But, just as Lent asks more of our prayer, it also asks more of our generosity.

For many people, fasting and almsgiving are connected disciplines. The point of fasting, after all, isn't merely that we eat less, it could also mean that others can eat more, specifically those who live in poverty and hunger. One very popular Lenten almsgiving program is provided by Catholic Relief Services. It's called Operation Rice Bowl. The core

of the program is a cardboard bowl. During Lent, we're encouraged to put our alms in the Rice Bowl. Seventy-five percent of the funds collected go to hunger relief programs around the world, and the remaining twenty-five percent stay in your local Catholic diocese to aid local hunger programs.

You can find information about Operation Rice Bowl and request materials for it by visiting the Catholic Relief Services website: orb.crs.org. They have resources for individuals, families, teachers and catechists, and for parishes.

However you choose to give to the poor this Lent, whether you're giving of your time, talent, or treasure, this season can be an important time of spiritual renewal. Part of how we're renewed is by acknowledging the many ways that God has blessed us and sharing those blessings with the poor and marginalized.



PADRE'S POST

2ND SUNDAY OF LENT

Lent is a time for us to discern the voice of Christ in the church and in the world. In today's gospel we hear from Luke, Chapter 9, how the glory of Christ is revealed at his Transfiguration. It is here that the manifestation of Christ's mission comes to light. At the Transfiguration God tells us to listen to Jesus. Peter, James and John witness Moses and Elijah conversing with Jesus, speaking of his exodus and what was going to be accomplished in Jerusalem.

The Transfiguration gives us a foretaste of Christ's glorious coming when he "will change our lowly body to be like his glorious body." We must remember that it is through suffering that we enter the kingdom of God. St. Paul in his Letter to the Philippians, Chapter 3, illustrates that our citizenship in heaven includes the Lenten call to turn away from worldly pleasures and reject sin. He reminds us that we are not of this world and that our citizenship is in heaven and from heaven we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church, paragraph 555, teaches: "For a moment Jesus discloses his divine glory, confirming Peter's confession. He also reveals that he will have to go by the way of the cross at Jerusalem in order to 'enter into his glory'. Moses and Elijah had seen God's glory on the Mountain; the Law and the Prophets had announced the Messiah's sufferings. Christ's Passion is the will of the Father: the Son acts as God's servant; the cloud indicates the presence of the Holy Spirit. 'The whole Trinity appeared: the Father in the voice; the Son in the man; the Spirit in the shining cloud.'"

Throughout Scripture covenant language is evident. In today's first reading from the book of Genesis, Chapter 15, the covenant between God and Abram is revealed. It is by faith that Abram finds favor with the Lord and in his fidelity the Lord makes a covenant with Abram and his descendants. In this special relationship between Abram and God the Lord made known to him that as many stars as he can count in the sky so too shall be the number of his descendants.

Jesus speaks to us through the Church, in Word, Sacrament and the ministry of charity. In the coming days be attentive to the choices you make and how they impact your thoughts, words and actions. These thoughts, words and actions of the Christian life are brought in "real-time" in the Lord's Prayer. Did you know that there are seven petitions in The Lord's Prayer? These petitions center us in our relationship with God, neighbor and self. Learn more about these petitions in the Catechism of the Catholic Church, paragraphs 2759-2865.

I pray that your Lenten journey continues to be one of prayer and prosperity. May your Lenten observance continue to purify and unite you in the sufferings throughout the world. Please pray for a peaceful resolution to the conflict in Ukraine and other countries and territories in conflict throughout the world. Let us also pray for our brothers and sisters caring for refugees. May God continue to bless you and your loved ones as we prepare to celebrate the Paschal Mystery of our Savior.

Statues to receive refinishing at St. Meinrad Parish

The Madonna and St. Joseph with Child statues in the church at St. Meinrad Parish have been part of the parish's history since the dedication of the current parish church on March 27, 1960. In recent years a conversation began to finish these statues from Oberammergau, Germany, drawing attention to the unique features of the carvings, including the gentleness of the facial features. Trinity Church Supply of Cincinnati, Ohio, which has created the additional sanctuary appointments commissioned since 2009, will oversee this commissioning. The artist is excited to begin this project because of the extreme detail of the carvings. He was trained in Italy, hand paints - no airbrushing and has a studio in the United States. He will use first quality oil colors mixed up specifically for each part of the statue. Gildings are done with Real Gold Leaf 23 ct. Approximate time for the project's completion is 15 weeks. As part of its mission of mercy and healing, the Catholic Bishops Conference of Liberia (CABICOL) focused on a theme of reconciliation during its 2019 plenary assembly. In a practical response to the pastoral need identified at the assembly, CABICOL subsequently used a grant from the USCCB's Solidarity Fund for the Church in Africa to gather 250 youth and 20 adult chaperones and facilitators from the three Liberian dioceses for a six-day training in healing and reconciliation. These young participants learned how one woman's non-violent peace movement helped bring an end to the civil war in 2003. When you support the collection for the Solidarity Fund, you help the Church in Africa form young people to take on roles of service, healing, and mercy.

Dear Padre,

What is the rationale for believing in God?

While Scripture tells us in story form how God created heaven, earth, and humanity, science tells how he has really done so: from a Big Bang of unharnessed energy; to the formation of Earth and the universe; to the evolution of life; and finally, to us! Creation's unfolding is like a magnificent symphony formed from nothing by a powerful, omniscient composer. This "musical score" of evolution rises and falls, inexorably leading to its culmination—intelligent beings who can ponder the beauty and awe of God's creation.

The odds are totally against an accumulation of "lucky breaks" that make creation possible: our Earth being in a narrow habitable zone, neither too near nor too far from the sun; the appearance of oxygenating plants, allowing us to breathe; a dinosaur-destroying asteroid collision permitting mammals—and eventually us—to evolve. How could all of that be accidental?

Indeed, multitudes have dedicated their lives to God's existence. For more than two millennia, our Church has taught about a loving God in the person of Jesus Christ. Not only do we learn Jesus' teachings regarding God's compassion, forgiveness, and the promises of eternal life, but we see that compassion and forgiveness at work in today's ministry.

A loving relationship with anyone is impossible without trust and faith. So it is with God. We must entrust ourselves to him, opening ourselves to knowing and loving him. For this reason, belief in God is always a grace, a gift freely given from God, which we ask for ourselves.
