Do You Love Me?

Three times Jesus asked Simon Peter: "Do you love me?" (John 21:16). This is the same Peter who earlier had sworn three times that, even if everyone else deserted Jesus, he never would. He was so sure of himself. Now, realizing the unreliability of his loyalty to Jesus, Peter is not so quick to answer with such self-confidence. Note that Peter did not reply with a straightforward, "Yes!" Rather, he amplified each response with the telling words: "You know...." With these words he acknowledged that Jesus could read his mind and heart, that he knew Peter's genuine love of him despite his all-too-human weakness. This itself was an act of faith.

This simple exchange did not humiliate Peter. That was not Jesus' way. They both understood what Peter had done, and they both knew how brokenhearted it had left him. Peter was humbled—not by Jesus, but by

the recognition of his own human frailty. Despite this, or perhaps because of it, Jesus commissioned Peter to be leader among his followers. Another person might have chosen a more reliable man. However, there is great strength and wisdom in a leader who has learned from experience how circumstances might cause otherwise brave people to turn their backs on their responsibilities and run from danger. Such a leader will challenge while being compassionate and stand firm while being understanding. This is the kind of leader Jesus chose, for he knew that Peter would be that kind of leader.

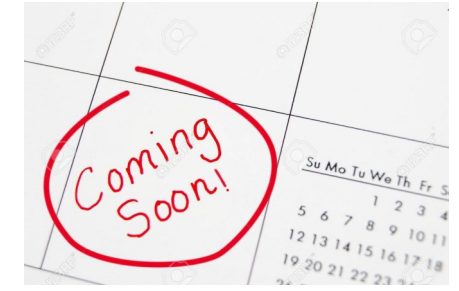

BECOME A MEMBER

A Catholic parish is the single most important part of our Catholic Church. A parish is where parishioners - the people - continue the mission of Jesus Christ. Our parish family exists to nurture an intentional faith-filled Catholic Community that inspires and empowers all people to follow Jesus Christ. We would love to have you as a parish family member if you are new to the area. If you have remained under your parent's membership, but now you are an adult, we encourage you to register independently. You may come to the parish office during office hours and register in person or [register online](#), so we have a way to welcome you.

BAPTISM

Parents are encouraged to begin preparing for their child's baptism before the birth of their child. The program used in preparing for this sacrament is called *Belonging: Baptism in the Family of God*. Two preparation sessions for parents and godparents are required, at least two months before the sacrament is celebrated. Visit the parish office during office hours and register in person or [register online](#) before the initial meeting.

MARRIAGE

Registered parishioners desiring to celebrate the Sacrament of Marriage must contact the parish office a minimum of six months before the proposed wedding date to reserve the church and other parish spaces. Visit the parish office during office hours or [inquire online](#) to begin the marriage inquiry process and to request an initial appointment to start preparing to receive this sacrament.

WEDDING ANNIVERSARY

Registered parishioners desiring to receive a blessing for significant marriage anniversaries at Mass contact the parish office a minimum of three months in advance. Visit the parish office during office hours or [inquire online](#).

The Gospel at Home

This Week's Gospels: John 21:1-14

In Sunday's Gospel, Jesus appears to seven of his disciples at the seashore. They have been fishing without any luck. Jesus points out where to catch some fish, and they catch more than they can handle. When they arrive on shore, Jesus has prepared breakfast for them. Then they recognize Jesus and realize that he is truly alive.

Exploring the Gospel Message

Seeds (Preschool): Your child learned that the Risen Jesus came to visit his friends. They also learned about the importance of friends, neighbors, and family. Help your child see the people at Sunday Mass as their church family. If there is a coffee hour this Sunday after Mass, stay for a while to visit with other members of the parish family.

Promise (Grades K-1): Your child's class celebrated that Jesus is present. The Risen Jesus shared a meal with his friends, and he also shares himself with us every time we go to Mass. Ask your child to tell the family the story, "Who has come to visit?" How does your family make others feel welcome? Be sure to check out your child's celebration cup made during the lesson.

Good News (Grades 2-3): Your child learned how the early Church spread and grew. The class also learned about the symbol of the fish. Ask your child to tell the family about the fish and why it was and still is a sign for Christians. Spend some time making a fish symbol you can display at home. You might also make or purchase some fish symbols for the family members to carry with them. Ask your child to explain how Jesus is with us at Mass.

Venture (Grades 4-6): Your youngster's class recognized that the Church is worldwide. The class also identified ways that people remember Jesus. Ask your young person to share with the family why Jesus is called the Lamb of God. Ask your child to share with the family the map of the spread of the early Church, and talk about what it means to the family to belong to the Catholic Church. Your young person can share some information about Saint Macrina the Younger.

Visions (Grades 7-9): One of the interesting discussions your young person had in class was identifying people who have died and who have had a lasting effect on society. Talk about people who have died who have greatly influenced your family. Much of the class was taken up with a play that dramatized the beginnings of the Church. Ask your teen to share what he or she learned about the Church's birth. Talk about why Jesus is called the "Lamb of God."

Pray Together

The Gospel about the great catch of fish can be a reminder that the Church has spread throughout the world. When you complete your conversation about the week's Gospel lesson, find some stories in the newspaper, online, or from the evening news that tell of Christians around the world who are suffering from poverty, war, or persecution. Share the stories and then pray together in your own words for those people, understanding that you are fellow members of the Body of Christ.

Alleluia, Christ Is Alive!

Easter blessings to you and your loved ones. A warm welcome to the candidates for First Holy Communion – Grade 2 students – their parents/caregivers, godparents and families. For we as Catholics, there is nothing more remarkable than to receive Jesus, truly present in the Eucharist at Mass.

Today's celebration brings to light that the children's preparation for their First Holy Communion began at home. The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches "that the primary responsibility for the spiritual growth and development of the children rests first and foremost with the parents. Parents may share this responsibility with others, but they do not relinquish it." (CCC, #2223) The family has the most important role in communicating the Christian and human values that form the foundation of a child's understanding of the Eucharist. Children who participate with their family in the Mass experience the Eucharistic mystery in an initial way and gradually learn to join with the liturgical assembly in prayer.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches "that the primary responsibility for the spiritual growth and development of the children rests first and foremost with the parents. Parents may share this responsibility with others, but they do not relinquish it." (CCC, #2223) The family has the most important role in communicating the Christian and human values that form the foundation of a child's understanding of the Eucharist. Children who participate with their family in the Mass experience the Eucharistic mystery in an initial way and gradually learn to join with the liturgical assembly in prayer.

At the Last Supper Jesus asks his disciples to remember him by gathering and sharing the bread and wine - his Body and Blood. In today's Gospel, John, Chapter 21, the Risen One - Jesus invites his friends to a meal he has cooked on the lakeshore. They recognize him in the sharing of a meal. In the Eucharist (Holy Communion), Jesus gives us his Body and Blood. The Church is Christ's Body on earth. Through our loving words and actions, people come to know Jesus.

As members of Christ's Body on earth, we are part of the Communion of Saints—followers of Jesus on earth, in Heaven, and purgatory. The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches, "[W]e are members of [Christ's] Body which is the Church, branches grafted onto the vine which is himself." (CCC #1988)

We congratulate our twelve children who will receive their First Holy Communion this weekend at St. Boniface Parish and St. Meinrad Parish. May our children continue to grow in their love for Jesus in the Sacrament of the Eucharist and receive our Lord each and every Sunday.

I pray that you may feel the warmth and comfort of the Lord's love with you every day. And that God continues to bless you and your family. I encourage you to frequently receive our Lord in the gift and mystery of the Eucharist with gratitude and joy. When we do, we welcome the spiritual nourishment needed to pre-

Dear Padre,

Where was St. Joseph during Jesus' crucifixion?

It's impossible to know for certain when Joseph died, since the Gospels don't refer to it. By the time Jesus starts his public ministry, Joseph had disappeared. We know for sure that Joseph lived at least until Jesus was twelve (see Luke 2:42). While Joseph scholars have many ideas, most believe Joseph probably died around the time of Jesus' baptism and before the wedding feast at Cana, when Jesus was about thirty years old (see Luke 3:23). That's because Mary is mentioned at the wedding feast, but Joseph is not (see John 2:1-12). And, while Jesus is preaching, the only ones looking for him are his "mother and brothers" (see Matthew 12:46-49, Mark 3:32-34, and Luke 8:19-21).

Finally, while dying on the cross, Jesus entrusts his mother to the disciple John, who took her to his home (see John 19:27). If Joseph had been alive at the time, this wouldn't have been necessary. Thus, it's entirely likely that Joseph died with Jesus and Mary at his side, giving his death great significance in popular devotion. From ancient times, Christian traditions have held that Joseph died in the arms of the Virgin and Jesus. The origins of Joseph as the patron of a happy death can be seen as early as the second century.
