Who's Calling?

God called Isaiah: “You are my servant.... I will make you a light to the nations” (Isaiah 49:3, 6). God called John the Baptist: “The one who sent me to baptize with water...” (John 1:33). God called St. Paul: “Called to be an apostle of Christ Jesus....” (1 Corinthians 1:1). And Paul says God calls us: We are “called to be holy” (1 Corinthians 1:2). Given that call, the question is, “What are we called to do with our lives?”

Frederick Buechner, an author, suggests we are called to wherever our deep hunger and the world's great need meet. As he explains, the world's great need may be to feed the hungry and shelter the homeless, but if we become depressed helping the poor, that is not where God wants us to be. On the other hand, we may love designing sandcastles, but the world has no great need for sandcastles, so that surely is not what God calls us to do. Rather, God calls us to the place where what we love doing and what the world desperately needs intersect.

Adults are often inclined to ask children what they want to be or do when they grow up. Perhaps asking them what they think God wants them to do might be a question laced with greater wisdom. To turn the question may call forth a more thoughtful answer. ●

PADRE'S POST: *Second Sunday in Ordinary Time*

Thanks to so many of our parish family who made the Season of Advent and these days of Christmas blessed and beautiful. It takes many parishioners to prepare for the celebration of the Christmas Mystery. Thanks to all who made these seasons special and memorable for all. Also, thank you to everyone for the many cards, received greetings, gifts and good wishes – your thoughtfulness is a humble sign of your care and affection and much appreciated. During this season, we celebrate the birth of Christ into our world and into our hearts and reflect on the gift of salvation that is born with him, including the fact that he was born to die for us. I pray that you enjoy a New Year overflowing with the joy that only God can provide. Well done!

Today we celebrate the Second Sunday in Ordinary Time. In John's Gospel, Chapter 1, we hear John the Baptist testify that Jesus is the Son of God, the one who will baptize with the Holy Spirit. In this encounter, John recognizes Jesus as the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. He reveals that Jesus is God's Chosen One upon whom the Spirit has descended and came to rest. This moment of divine revelation refers to St. Matthew's account of the Baptism of Jesus in the River Jordan by John the Baptist. In Matthew, Chapter 3, after the Lord was baptized, the heavens were opened, the Spirit descended upon him like a dove, and the voice of the Father thundered, "This is my beloved Son with whom I am well pleased."

As John saw the Spirit of God descend upon Jesus, this is how he knew that Jesus truly is God's Son. God told John to look for a sign. This sign helped John the Baptist complete his mission of revealing to others the Lamb of God. The Holy Spirit guided Jesus in doing his work on earth. At our Baptism, we receive the gift of the Holy Spirit, and this Spirit, when called upon and discerned, helps us do our work on earth as followers of Jesus. In the end, Jesus accepts his mission as God's suffering Servant. Jesus allows himself to be numbered among sinners.

The foreshadowing of God's strength revealed in glory is found in today's first reading, Isaiah 49. It is throughout Israel that the Lord will show forth his glory and splendor. Israel is identified as a light for all the nations, whereby salvation will come to all people. Today's second reading from 1 Corinthians 1, echoes the words of Psalm 40, which is about discerning the call to do God's will. Paul and Sosthenes greet the people of Corinth, reminding them that they are called to be holy people. They are to discern God's will because Jesus Christ has sanctified them.

The [Catechism of the Catholic Church](#) teaches: John the Baptist is "more than a prophet." In him, the Holy Spirit concludes his speaking through the prophets. John completes the cycle of prophets begun by Elijah. He proclaims the imminence of the consolation of Israel; he is the "voice" of the Consoler who is coming. As the Spirit of truth will also do, John "came to bear witness to the light." In John's sight, the Spirit thus brings to completion the careful search of the prophets and fulfills the longing of the angels. "He on whom you see the Spirit descend and remain, this is he who baptizes with the Holy Spirit. And I have seen and have borne

witness that this is the Son of God. . . . Behold, the Lamb of God." (CCC 719)

We, too, are to discern God's will by being open to the different kinds of spiritual gifts encountered throughout the Church and world. When we bring these gifts to life and light within ourselves, we show the world that Jesus' Spirit is alive and in us. The Holy Spirit teaches us the truth. The Spirit gave the apostles the strength and course to follow Jesus' example. The Holy Spirit continues to guide the Church in its mission today. Before Jesus returned to his Father in Heaven, he made a promise to all who call on him as Lord, promising that the Holy Spirit would come to stay with them. Throughout the Gospels, the Holy Spirit is present: when Mary becomes pregnant, Jesus' baptism, in the Gospel for the first Sunday of Lent when the spirit leads Jesus into the desert, and in the Gospel for the second Sunday of Easter when Jesus comes to his disciples, breathes on them and gives them the Holy Spirit. Let us pray that the Holy Spirit continues to provide us with the strength and courage to do what is right, helping us to make good decisions in the coming days in our family and community.

This year, we celebrate the Feast of St. Meinrad on the Sunday before his feast day (January 21). As we gather as a parish family to celebrate our faith and heritage on the feast of this hermit, martyr and patron saint of hospitality, I invite you to think more about the call to pray without ceasing.

We need daily prayer. Prayer is time dedicated to God, and it allows us to listen with the ear of our hearts to God's daily invitation to follow Christ and his Church, as did blessed Meinrad. Those who have gone before us in faith heard and received the same invitation in 33 AD, 1854 AD, 1861 AD and 2023 AD.

Try visiting your parish church daily to pause and pray. Parishes are open from dawn to dusk. See what happens to your heart, fears, and worries when you pray with them and leave them at the foot of the cross. Try learning what it is like praying before the Eucharist, just you and God. Eucharistic Adoration is weekly from 3-4 p.m. before Holy Mass begins on Wednesday at 4:15 p.m. at St. Meinrad Parish.

When praying before the Blessed Sacrament, I often think of this quote from the Curé d'Arns, "When we are before the Blessed Sacrament, instead of looking about us, let us shut our eyes and open our hearts; and the good God will open his. We will go to him, and he will come to us, the one to give, and the other to receive. It will be like a breath passing from one to the other. What delight we find in forgetting ourselves that we may seek God." – St. Jean-Baptiste-Marie Vianney, the Curé d'Arns, 1786-1859.

I pray for you and your loved ones daily at the altar, for your health, prayer, and petition, and especially for the prayers and petitions entrusted to me by you.

Join our brothers and sisters throughout the Archdiocese of Indianapolis on Sunday, January 22, 2023, by supporting the annual appeal for the Church in Latin America collection. Please join me in offering your prayerful and vocal support.

For more than 50 years, this collection has been a way for Catholics in the United States to unite more closely with our brothers and sisters in faith throughout Latin America and the Caribbean through supporting diocesan pastoral catechetical and family life ministries, seminary studies, and formation programs for religious sisters and brothers. The collection even helps the poorest dioceses obtain basic necessities that they otherwise would be unable to afford, which would leave them unable to minister effectively to the faithful.

Week of Prayer for Christian Unity January 18-25

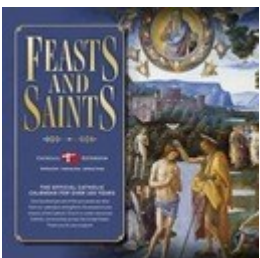


The theme for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity in 2023 was selected by the Minnesota Council of Churches, USA in the aftermath of the extrajudicial killing of George Floyd and the trial of the police officer responsible for his death. These events brought anguish, but also time for the Christian communities to contemplate ways in which they may be complicit in racial injustice. Christian unity is needed as a source of reconciliation and unity.

The theme, taken from the first chapter of the Book of Isaiah, reflects his concern for the oppressed who suffer from injustice and inequality fed by hypocrisy that leads to disunity. He teaches that God requires righteousness and justice from all of us, to create the peace and unity that God desires. These virtues originate in God's love for all, and racism runs counter to this vision. Isaiah's challenge to do good and seek justice together applies equally to us today.

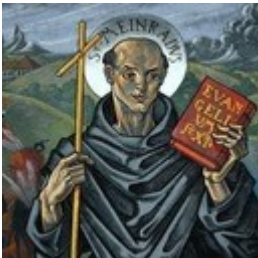

St. Meinrad Parish will celebrate feast day January 15



St. Meinrad Parish will celebrate the feast day of its patron, St. Meinrad, on Sunday, January 15, 2023. Mass will be celebrated at 8:30 a.m. Central Time.

Father Anthony Vinson, OSB, pastor, will give the feast-day homily focusing on holiness and hospitality found in the Christian vocation.

Eight days after the parish founding, the new German Catholic settlement was established as the town of St. Meinrad. Born about the year 800 in what is now Germany, Meinrad was a Benedictine monk who lived as a hermit for much of his life, dedicated to prayer and solitude. Even as a hermit, his reputation as a wise and holy man led people to seek him out for counsel and prayer.

Despite his desire for solitude, the monk Meinrad graciously attended to his guests' needs, physical as well as spiritual.

In 861, two robbers came to Meinrad's hermitage, believing he had treasures hidden there – gifts from the people he had counseled. In spite of a premonition of his impending death, Meinrad invited the robbers in and offered them food and drink.

The men murdered him and then fled in fear without taking anything. Meinrad's death earned him the title of "Martyr of Hospitality."

Meinrad's hermitage became the site of the Abbey of Einsiedeln in 934. When, in 1854, Einsiedeln established an abbey in America, the name chosen was Saint Meinrad.

The feast of St. Meinrad is celebrated on January 21.

Dear Padre,

***I am African American. When I go to church,
I feel disconnected from the rest of my life.
How does the Church fit with my culture?***

Church documents lift up different cultures as treasures to be preserved and incorporated into the life of the Church. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* teaches, “[The gospel] must be proclaimed, celebrated, and lived in all cultures in such a way that they themselves are not abolished by it, but redeemed and fulfilled: It is with and through their own human culture, assumed and transfigured by Christ, that the multitude of God’s children has access to the Father, in order to glorify him in the one Spirit” (CCC 1204).

Many think “catholic” means homogenous, that the Mass should be exactly the same everywhere. On the contrary, it is “catholic” because it takes in everything. It is, or at least it should be, a cross-cultural experience, for we all are the children of God. All cultures should find their expression in the Catholic Mass.

The difficulty is putting this into practice, especially in communities with members from more than one culture. Receptivity on the part of the pastor is important, too. As he learns about another culture, he’ll be more open to using the best of it in worship. Perhaps you, along with other concerned parishioners, might discuss this with your pastor. There are resources and institutes available to assist you in making your worship truly reflect who you are individually and communally. ●
