Coming of Age, Coming of Faith

t is said we never become a believer before age thirty-five. I don't think there is anything magical about that age. Some in their seventies still have not yet come to be people of faith, and there are those who, at a very young age, seem to have entrusted their lives to God. What the age of thirty-five does say, however, is that most people need to have lived a while and experienced a few ups and downs to recognize there is a power in their lives greater than themselves.

This week's Gospel story of the man born blind encapsulates a lifelong journey of coming to see who Jesus is, compressed into a few days. When asked who cured him of blindness, the man first says the man Jesus did it. Brought to testify before the Pharisees, he says that Jesus must be a prophet. Confronted by the

Pharisees a second time, he testifies that Jesus must be of God. Finally, when he sees Jesus again, he calls him Lord, a name for God. The story is a parable of sorts about how we come to have faith, to see with new and different eyes.

Faith involves trusting, sometimes trusting an unseen Power who feels absent at times; about surrendering control over our lives to God, as we come to see in an entirely new way. It can take a lifetime to begin seeing in such a way.

PADRE'S POST

Fourth Sunday of Lent Laetare "Rejoice" Sunday John 9:1-41

Who or what are you looking for?

Today we celebrate *Laetare* Sunday, the Fourth Sunday of Lent. As we read from the Gospel of John, Chapter 9, we hear that Jesus cures a man who was born blind. As a result of Jesus' kindness, the man's parents, friends and neighbors reject him, and he is expelled from the synagogue for his insistence that Jesus healed him. In last Sunday's Gospel, Matthew, Chapter 4, we heard Jesus speak with the woman at the well, and as he searched her soul, the woman saw him as a prophet. In today's gospel, this miracle of light happens on the Sabbath.

In this passage, Jesus is identified as the light. As we learn about Jesus, we grow in faith and in our belief that Jesus truly is the Son of God. Jesus invites us to trust in him as he did with the man born blind. It was clear to others that the man born blind was different from other people. Jesus, through his compassion, saw beyond his blindness and brought to light his faith. Questions of why this man was born blind meant nothing to Jesus. Jesus' instruction to go to the pool of Silom – which means sent – was received in faith, and after washing, the man's eyes were opened.


When the man was asked how he gained his sight, the truth fell on deaf ears. To some, it could not have been anything Jesus of Nazareth did. To others, it could not have been the work of God because it occurred on the Sabbath. Our belief in Christ and the Church is found in the Creed. As we grow in our understanding of Scripture and Tradition, our belief in the teachings of the Bible and the Church becomes more and more tangible. As we gather on Sundays and Holy Days for the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, we pray the Creed stating with one voice what we believe about God.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us, "Believing is possible only by grace and the interior help of the Holy Spirit" (CCC, 154). Our belief in God is strengthened by what we see and experience through our other four senses. For the man born blind, Jesus brought the gift of light to him, illuminating a world yet unseen for him—a world where others had only defined his path. Indeed the man had a reason to rejoice, and when he tried to share this good news, it was rejected. "Jesus makes use of signs to heal...In the Sacraments, Christ continues to touch us in order to heal us" (CCC 1504). Through Baptism and the gift of the Eucharist, we are all called to walk in the light—the light of Christ. St.

Paul writes to the Ephesians in Chapter 5, "Live as children of light, for light produces every kind of goodness, righteousness and truth." I pray that as you continue to deepen your faith during these Lenten days that each person of the Holy Trinity—Father, Son and Holy Spirit—brings life and light to your prayer and work.

Through the intercession of St. Joseph, Spouse of the Virgin Mary, may you and your loved ones know his intercession and protection. The Bible says that Joseph was a righteous man (Matthew, Chapter 1) open to all God wanted to do for and through him. St. Joseph is the Patron of Workers. May the work of our hands be blessed day after day as we offer our prayer and ourselves through our vocations. St. Joseph, pray for us.



(Normally, the Solemnity of St. Joseph is celebrated on March 19. This observance is moved to March 20 in 2023 because of the Fourth Sunday of Lent.)

Remember to look at page 6 of the weekly bulletin for weekly discussion. The questions continue with what you learned about your faith with your catechist and classmates. Also, the "Family Corner" briefly describes the gospel and helps us understand how Scripture and Tradition define us as a Church. Pray the family prayer together and take the weekly challenge inspired by the question of the week.



The infirm and individuals needing assistance seated in the first pew on either side will receive this sacrament first. Anointing of the Sick is a sacrament of healing. The idea behind this sacrament is that we are all members of the body of Christ. When one of us suffers, all of us suffer, and all of God's creation suffers with us.

A parishioner or caregiver is strongly encouraged to contact the parish office and speak with a staff member to

request a priest visit their home to receive this sacrament if their particular situation does not allow for the communal celebration of this sacrament. Please also notify the parish office if you are ill, shut-in, entering the hospital or a have recently moved to a long-term care center.

The sacrament of anointing may be repeated:

- When the sick person recovers after being anointed and becomes sick again at a later time.
- When, during the same illness, the condition of the sick person becomes more serious.
- In the case of a person who is chronically ill or elderly and in a weakened condition, the sacrament of anointing may be repeated when in the pastoral judgment of the priest the condition of the sick person warrants the repetition of the sacrament. (*Pastoral Care of the Sick*, *No. 102*)




Dear Padre,

Why should I bother to be more religious? I'm a good person. Isn't that enough to get me into heaven?

When asked for advice about how people should decide on a vocation, St. Ignatius Loyola, the founder of the Jesuits, said they should do an imagination exercise. "Imagine that you are on your deathbed," he said. "From that point of view what would you wish you had done in your life?" That is still good advice.

Here's another exercise: Imagine you have a grandmother who is completely generous and caring toward you. Throughout



Our life with God is much the same. God has given us absolutely everything, from our existence to every breath we take. God has also given us a way to know him through his Son, Jesus (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 73). And one way we know Jesus is through the Church and the celebration of the sacraments (CCC 1085). To refuse these gifts, to say, "I am already a good person. I don't need these gifts from God" is a bit presumptuous, don't you think?

To be "religious" is not just an outward show of piety. It's the way we have been given to learn God's language: the language of forgiveness, of faith, hope, and love.
