When I feel sorry for myself or just down in the dumps, when I feel buried by life not going the way I think it should, sometimes I remember to stop thinking about myself and my problems, and I say to myself, *I need to go care about someone else*. It seems that doing so pulls me out of that tomb of darkness and back into the light. Then I ask myself, *Why didn't I do that sooner?* The truth is, I didn't remember. But the very fact that I eventually do remember is the spirit of God dwelling within me that pulls me back into life, just as Paul once wrote (Romans 8:9 and the verses afterward). It's like hearing a voice calling me out of a dreary tomb of death, just as sure as Lazarus heard Jesus calling him out.

Have you experienced times when your spirit feels deader than dead, but then someone or something calls


you back into life? I have. When that happens to us, I think we've been blessed with a hint of the resurrection. When I find myself wondering if there is really life beyond death, if resurrection really does happen to us, then I think about all the times that what I thought was a death turned out to be some unexpected doorway to new life. If that happens with such little deaths along the way, wouldn't it also happen on our last day on this earth? ●

PADRE'S POST

Fifth Sunday of Lent

John 11:1-45

If you had been here

Throughout the season of Lent, we are invited to return to the Lord. How we do this can look different for each one of us taking this 40-day journey. What is important is that we respond to this invitation and return to the Lord. It may be in our prayer, fasting or almsgiving that we not only return to the Lord but also find him awaiting our return. In today's gospel, John 11, we hear what Martha, someone who knows Jesus, had to say when she encountered him. "Lord, if you had been here, my brother would not have died." What an accusation. What a statement of fact. At the news of Lazarus' death, Jesus returned to Bethany to find Lazarus, the brother of Martha and Mary, already buried according to Mosaic Law. Upon Jesus' arrival, he assured his friends that he was the Resurrection and the Life. And before their eyes, he gave life back to Lazarus. Today's gospel invites us to reflect on the meaning of resurrection and life, calling us to believe that Jesus can do more than raise us back to life as he did Lazarus. He calls us to believe we are to share in God's gift of everlasting life.

Martha's anger, rooted in grief, may be something we can relate to. Perhaps we find ourselves accusing God, his Son, Jesus, or the Holy Spirit of not being present in the course of life's events according to our will. Perhaps we have difficulty trusting the Divine Will when life's circumstances according to our will have been altered, comprised or we have experienced the permanent sting of death. What Jesus' friends witnessed in Lazarus' coming back to life when Jesus called him from the tomb is different from Jesus' resurrection. Lazarus' mortal body would die again. Yet in his risen body, Christ will live forever. As we prepare to celebrate the Sacred Triduum, there is a moment of reality from Jesus dying on the wood of the cross, his burial in the tomb, and the resurrection celebrated on Easter morning. On Holy Saturday, the evidence of the crucifixion remains before our eyes in unlit sanctuaries and empty tabernacles awaiting the illumination of the pillar of fire – the Paschal Candle. Jesus opens heaven's door to all who have longed for the fulfillment of God's promise. The Church teaches that in following Jesus through the Paschal Mystery, we live forever in heaven, even after our mortal death. Lent is a time for each of us to restore our soul to be in right relationship with God and to invite others to do the same.

The [Catechism of the Catholic Church](#) teaches us, "Christ's resurrection was not a return to earthly life, as was the case with the raising from the dead that he performed before Easter: Jairus' daughter, the young woman from Naim, Lazarus....[T]hey would die again. Christ's resurrection is essentially different. In his risen body he passes from the state of death to another life beyond time and space." (CCC, 646)

As we live out our earthly vocation, death is part of this vocation. There is a distinct difference between Lazarus' new life and Jesus' resurrected life. Jesus' resurrection is a promise that we can spend forever in heaven with God after we die. From our tradition, those who have died and gone to heaven are called saints.

PADRE'S POST (continued)

If we desire to go to heaven, we have the desire to be a saint. The Church's gift to us is a pathway through the Word of God, the Sacraments of the Church, and the ministry of charity to form us into saints. What are the obstacles that make this invitation a challenge for you?

I pray that you have the strength to finish the good works of your Lenten journey diligently. Make a difference! Please mark your calendar for the Sacred Triduum. These three most holy days are for our community to gather and pray, recounting the moments in salvation history when Christ suffered and died for us. See page 5 in this week's bulletin for service times during Holy Week and the Sacred Triduum.

Palm Sunday announcements Next Sunday is Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord. As we participate in this celebration, we together with the Church throughout the world, recall the entrance of Christ the Lord into Jerusalem to accomplish his Paschal Mystery. The order of worship for this celebration begins on page 86 ff in the missalette. The faithful holding palm branches assemble inside the main door in the narthex area of the church. Palm branches will be available in pews before Mass begins. The cantor will invite the faithful to gather for the commemoration of the Lord's entrance into Jerusalem using the second form of the solemn entrance. Children participating in Children's Liturgy of the Word will process with the ministers to the sanctuary and continue to the classroom.

Remember to look at page 6 of the weekly bulletin for weekly discussion. The questions continue with what you learned about your faith with your catechist and classmates. Also, the "Family Corner" briefly describes the gospel and helps us understand how Scripture and Tradition define us as a Church. Pray the family prayer together and take the weekly challenge inspired by the question of the week.





Jesus rises from the dead and leaves the tomb.



The guards at the tomb report what happened to the chief priests, who pay them off to tell a cover story.



Peter and John check out the tomb. All they find are the burial cloths.



Mary Magdalene sticks around the tomb and encounters Jesus.



Jesus walks to Emmaus with two of his disciples. They realize it's him only after breaking bread.



Jesus appears to more disciples, shows them his wounds, gives them power to forgive sins.

WHAT YOU'LL SEE AT CHURCH



The priest wears white because it's a joyful day, celebrating our love for Jesus in the Eucharist.



The priest will wash people's feet as a sign of his dedication to those whom he serves.



No Masses are celebrated on Good Friday, so the priest must plan (and consecrate) ahead.



After Mass, the altar is stripped, and most decorations are taken down or covered. The consecrated hosts are transferred to an "Altar of Repose" somewhere else in the Church until about midnight, then transferred to another tabernacle away from public view. This absence of the Eucharist helps us experience the loss and emptiness the Apostles felt on Good Friday.



The Chrism Mass, in which the Bishop blesses all the holy oils for his diocese, is also celebrated on Holy Thursday.

WHAT YOU'LL SEE AT CHURCH



The priest wears red to bring to mind the blood Jesus shed.



This is the one day all year on which no Masses are celebrated.



The tabernacle will still be empty and the church still undecorated.



Candles are lit only when Jesus (in the Eucharist) is present.



St. John's account of The Passion is read. The congregation often reads the part of the crowd demanding Jesus' crucifixion to reinforce how our sins made necessary the cross of Christ.



The Veneration of the Cross occurs during the Good Friday service. Those at the service show a sign of love (kiss, genuflect, etc) to a cross in thanksgiving for Jesus' cross.

WHAT YOU'LL SEE AT CHURCH



The priest wears white because we're joyfully celebrating Jesus' victory over death!




The Paschal Candle, the "Light of Christ," is carried into the church and the congregation's candles are lit from it.



The Exultet prayer and lots of extra readings help us recall salvation history.



We sing Alleluia for the first time since before Lent started!



We sing the Litany of the Saints, asking them to join us in prayer to God.



People coming into the Catholic Church are Baptized and Confirmed.

LIVE THE DAY



Cover or put away your holy pictures and/or statues.



Attend a Tenebrae service. Check around for times as it's held on various Triduum days.



Take on special fasts or increase your prayers and/or devotions.



Simulate visiting Jesus in prison by making a pilgrimage to local parishes' Altars of Repose.

LIVE THE DAY



Keep silence throughout the day, especially from 9:00am-3:00pm, when Jesus was on the cross.



Increase your time spent praying. Reflect on The Passion.



Pray the Stations of the Cross. Your parish may schedule a service.



Start the Divine Mercy Novena.



Take on extra fasting or increased other acts of piety.



Pray the sorrowful mysteries of the rosary.

Dear Padre,

Are Catholic religious orders dying?

Yes...and no.

In Africa and Asia, some religious orders are vibrant, with orders of men and women religious increasing in number. In the United States, Europe, and Oceania, it's a different story. As many as 300 of the 420 institutes of women religious in the US are in their final decades of existence (*Leadership Conference of Women Religious*, 2019). One-third of all women's congregations in the US have fewer than fifty members. In the US, sisters over age ninety far outnumber those under sixty. Consequently, many communities fall short of the number of active ministers needed to replace their elderly and retiring members. The story is similar for many orders of religious men.

As those in religious orders struggle to remain effective in their mission and ministry for God and humanity, they are reimagining styles of leadership, levels of administration, and, in short, ways of getting the job done. This includes, for example, creative partnerships with laypeople to share in the charism, community life, and ministry of the religious order.

People are still drawn to Jesus and the work of building the kingdom. Only God knows how this "building process" will look in the future. As in all challenging times, the Church remains hopeful. From crisis comes resurrection! ●
