The Art of Dying

When I was much younger and idealistic, I might have been ready to die for some worthy cause. Friends about my age had the same experience.

There was something romantic about giving our lives then. Something glorious—or so we thought. There was the brotherhood and sisterhood of us all, peace and non-violence, nuclear arms opposition, equal opportunities for education and housing. Many of us now over fifty thought we would lay down our lives for any one of those dreams.

For some of us, things have changed. We've grown older and, perhaps, wiser, and it seems we're not so eager to die anymore. The glamor has been tarnished, and, for some, the romance

has turned from infatuation to disillusion. Death seems like a tragedy, continually rearing its strength to destroy in full or in part the fruit of our lives.

Yet death continues to remain the only doorway into real life. Without death there is no life—in this life or

in any life. For that reason, then, one of the tasks of life is to learn how to die well, something we also need to teach our children. It takes a lifetime to learn how to die for one another, and that is why our young people need a community of adults who seek to master the art of dying. It is also why, for one long week,

we tell the story of Jesus and of how, for the sake of us all, he did not back away from death. ●

PADRE'S POST

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord *Matthew 26:14-27:66*

His Death opened the gates of Heaven for us.

A blessed Passion Sunday (Palm Sunday) to you and your loved ones. As we honor our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ on Passion Sunday, we hear two Gospel readings from the Gospel of Matthew, the first from Chapter 21, for the blessing of palms, and today's reading of the passion narrative beginning in Chapter 26. We hear in the first reading, as we gather for the blessing of palms, how the people welcomed Jesus into the city of Jerusalem. His triumphant entry served to fill the people with faith and hope. Imagine what it was like to be present - seeing, hearing...all the senses engaged - as people's garments were placed on the colt for Him to ride and palm branches were scattered to carpet his path. The people were excitedly aware of the fulfillment of the Old Testament prophecies of Isaiah (62:11) and Zechariah (9:9-11).

While reading the Passion, we begin to spiritually walk this path of glory, experiencing for ourselves the Paschal Mystery - His passion, death, and resurrection that had been revealed to his disciples.

As we gather today for Passion Sunday, marking the commencing of the days of Holy Week, the Church reveals through Divine Revelation (Sacred Scripture) and Sacred Tradition the glory and rawness of Jesus' last days on Earth before his Ascension into Heaven. As your pastor, I encourage you to make time this week to immerse yourself in the Sacred Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday).

From Passion Sunday to the Easter Octave (eight days beginning on Easter), the Church brings to life for her faithful the revelation contained in the words of Scripture and Tradition. These rites and rituals define us as Catholics whose faith was born on Pentecost when the Holy Spirit descended on those first disciples in the Upper Room. These disciples took the commission seriously "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit (Matthew 28:19)."

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us, "Jesus' entry into Jerusalem manifested the coming of the kingdom that the King - Messiah was going to accomplish by the Passover of his Death and Resurrection. It is with the celebration of that entry on Palm Sunday that the Church's liturgy solemnly opens Holy Week." (CCC, 560)

In the complexity of these days, where the devil's desire for chaos attempts to steal our hope of the promise of eternal life, we remain faithful to what began at the Last Supper on the night before Jesus died and commissioned soon after on the day of Pentecost. No matter where Christ's first disciples found themselves, "They devoted themselves to the teaching of the disciples and to the communal life, to the breaking of the Bread and to the prayers." (Acts 2:42)

As we prepare to celebrate the glory of Easter, I pray that Christ continues to renew this reali-

ty within our parish family and the local Church of Central and Southern Indiana. I look forward to praying with you in the coming days.

Let us continue to remember the sick, the homebound, and infirmed members of our parish family and their caregivers. I remain edified by the tender and intentional care so many receive from their spouses and other family members. I know for some this is a new and uncharted path in marriage and family life.

A blessed Eastertide to you and your loved ones.

Family Corner

About the Gospel

Jesus enters Jerusalem amidst great excitement. The city quickly turns against him. Jesus celebrates his Last Supper with his Apostles on Passover. He is arrested the next day and is soon tortured and crucified. His body is laid to rest in a sealed tomb.



In recent weeks a few key volunteers who have quietly and faithfully served our parish family have had changes in their health or family situations and are no longer capable of serving in their past roles.



Also needed is an individual or individuals willing to serve in a rotating schedule with some working knowledge of basic building mechanics to walk through the church, maintenance building, parish center, and shelter house facilities daily to watch and listen for possible water leaks, odd sounds from HVAC systems and refrigerators, or other possible maintenance issues needing reporting to Tina Boehm, Finance and Resource Coordinator and member of the Facilities and Grounds Commission for appropriate and a timely resolution. This person will use an app on their phone to report issues, so no paperwork is involved. This area of responsibility would require approximately 15 minutes per day.





Dear Padre,

Why do we call Jesus “the Lamb of God”? How did Jesus get that name, and why do we refer to him as a lamb? Doesn’t that make him sound weak and helpless?

A lamb was a common animal of sacrifice for the Jews. The Passover account talks about sacrificing an unblemished lamb to God and eating its flesh so the people would have strength for the journey to the Promised Land.

Jesus is the perfect, unblemished sacrifice by which our sins are forgiven and we are made children of God. The Father provides Jesus as the sacrifice, and so Jesus is the Lamb of God, the sacrificial offering made because God loves us. Jesus chose to sacrifice himself according to the Father’s plan. “He humbled himself, becoming obedient to death, even death on a cross” (Philippians 2:8). Jesus gave himself into our hands so we could be caressed by the hands of God.

Like the Passover lamb, the Lamb of God is food for us. We “eat his body” and “drink his blood.” This food and drink gives us strength for our journey of faith. The food we receive from Jesus, the Lamb, is the nourishment we need to do as St. Paul begs the Philippians—and us—to do: “Have among yourselves the same attitude that is also yours in Christ Jesus” (Philippians 2:5). ●
