The Gift of Doubts

When people tell me they have doubts about their faith, I usually tell them that doubts can be a good thing. “Reflect on your doubts,” I say. So very often the doubts bring someone to deeper faith and understanding. When people say they’re not sure they believe in God anymore, often what they mean is that they don’t believe in a particular idea of God, like the bearded old man in the sky or a God who “allows” children to die of cancer and “permits” wars that slaughter people.

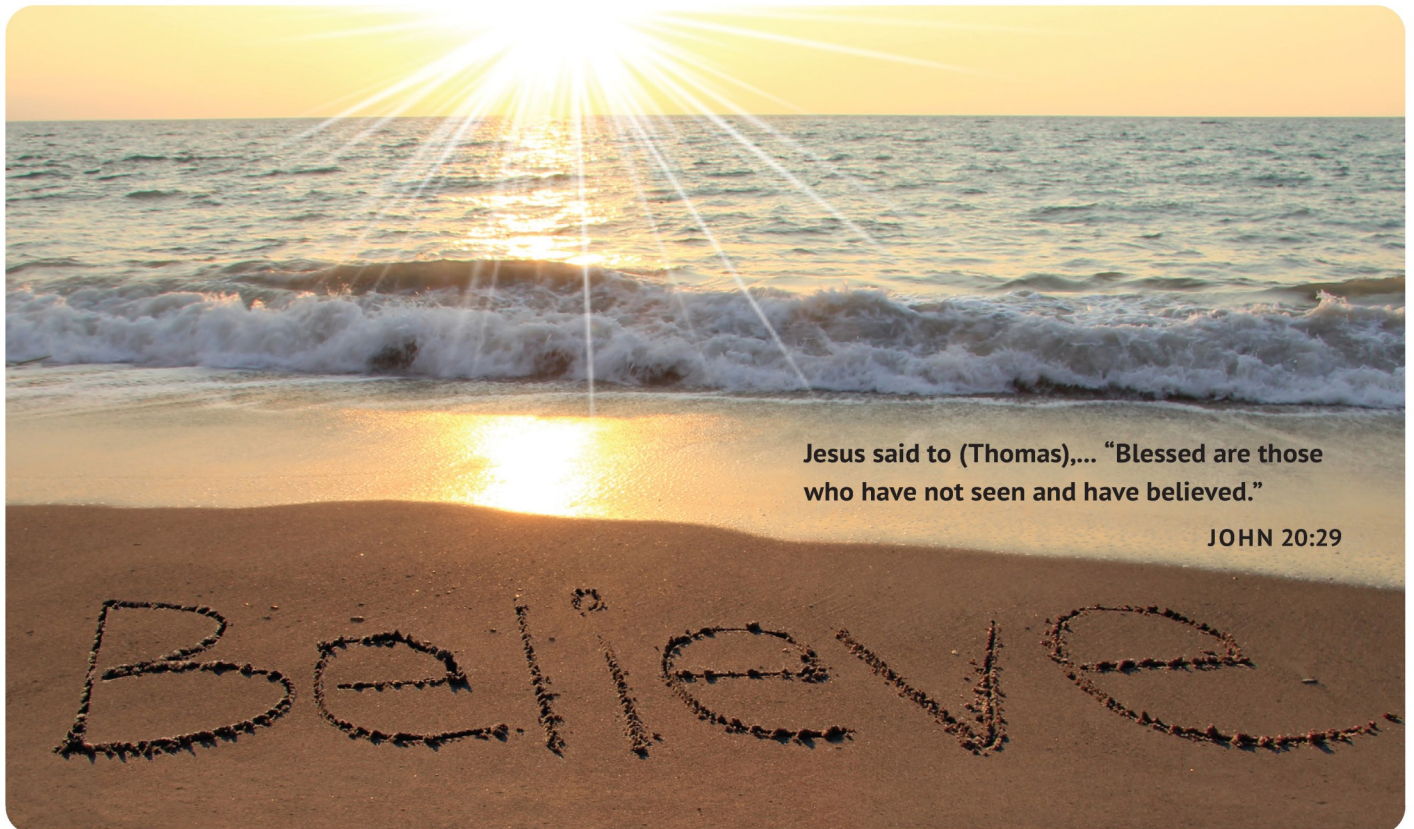
What such doubts ask us to do is to rethink our understanding of who God is. Tossing out our old idea of God does not mean there is no God. It simply means we had a faulty or immature notion of God. It may take some time to rethink who God is, but if we stay with it, do some reading, ask some questions, and pray over it, we

may come to a deeper and richer understanding of God. In short, because I don’t understand how something can be does not mean that that something—or someone—is not true or real.

In this week’s Gospel, Thomas, who was not with the community when Jesus appeared, later could not believe that the Jesus he had known was alive. He doubted. Yet when he was with the community the following week, he discovered that the risen Lord was indeed real but in an entirely new reality. It takes a community of faith to become a believer. ●

PADRE'S POST

Second Sunday of Easter
(or Divine Mercy Sunday)

John 20:19-31

Blessed are those who believe without seeing.

A Blessed Eastertide to all. I hope the days of the Easter Octave are joy-filled and days of peace for you and your loved ones. Again, thanks to the many parishioners who helped in preparing for the Sacred Triduum and Easter Sunday. Our parish family is most grateful to you for your time, dedication and service. Thanks for your vision and energy. I appreciate the guidance of the Worship Commission and the liturgical musicians who prepared and worked tirelessly for these celebrations. I continue to receive many compliments about the music, the preparedness of lectors, servers and other liturgical ministers, and how beautiful the inside and outside of the churches looked for their particular day of the Triduum and Easter.

As I shared in my Easter homily, the Paschal Mystery - the Lord's Passion, Death and Resurrection - is something each of us must come to know in a personal way. When the disciples of Jesus arrived at the tomb, they believed because they saw the stone removed, the empty tomb and the burial cloths. They believed, yet they did not yet understand the Scriptures. We too are called to believe in the Resurrection of Jesus Christ through both Divine Revelation and Sacred Scripture. We are called to believe without being eyewitnesses. As Jesus tells the disciples in John 20:29, "Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed."

The focal point of the Catholic Faith is in the Resurrection, the Easter Mystery. We are called to engage our faith beyond any physical evidence for the Resurrection. We hear in John's Gospel, Chapter 20, that Jesus appeared to His disciples behind closed doors. The disciple Thomas was not present at this first appearance and did not believe the other disciples when they claimed to have seen the Risen Christ. Jesus then appeared to the whole group, Thomas as being present, eight days later. As Jesus gathers with them, it is in His glorified body, wounds visible, bearing the marks of His Passion that He greets them. When Thomas sees the Risen Jesus and touches the wounds in His glorified body, he proclaims, "My Lord and my God!"

The [Catechism of the Catholic Church](#) teaches us, "The disciple of Christ must not only keep the faith and live on it, but also profess it, confidently bear witness to it, and spread it: 'All however must be prepared to confess Christ before men and to follow him along the way of the Cross, amidst the persecutions which the Church never lacks.' Service of and witness to the faith are necessary for salvation: 'So every one who acknowledges me before men, I also will acknowledge before my Father who is in heaven; but whoever denies me before men, I also will deny before my Father who is in heaven.'" (CCC, 1816)

Today we celebrate the Second Sunday of Easter, Divine Mercy Sunday. As Jesus appeared to his disciples, coming through a locked door, he greeted them in peace and gave them the authority to forgive sins. In the 1930s, Jesus chose

a humble Polish nun, St. Maria Faustina Kowalska, to receive private revelations concerning Divine Mercy that were recorded in her Diary. Mankind's need for the message of Divine Mercy took on dire urgency in the 20th Century, when civilization began to experience an "eclipse of the sense of God" and, therefore, began to lose the understanding of the sanctity and inherent dignity of human life.

On May 5, 2000, five days after the canonization of St. Faustina, the Vatican decreed that the Second Sunday of Easter would henceforth be known as Divine Mercy Sunday. Jesus appeared to St. Faustina in a vision, with his right hand raised in a blessing and his left hand touching his garment above his heart. Red and white rays emanate from his heart, symbolizing the blood and water that was poured out for our salvation and our sanctification. The Lord requested that "Jesus, I trust in You" be inscribed under his image. Jesus asked that his image be painted and venerated throughout the world: "I promise that the soul that will venerate this image will not perish" (Diary, no. 48) and "By means of this image I will grant many graces to souls," (Diary, no. 742)

Area parishioners are invited to participate in a Divine Mercy Service at St. Joseph Catholic Church in Jasper, Indiana, beginning at 2 p.m. Central. A blessed and safe week ahead! Also, thank you to everyone for the many cards, received greetings, gifts (handmade cards from children and baked good that I shared with the monks) and best wishes throughout the Octave of Easter - your thoughtfulness is a humble sign of your care and affection and much appreciated. Remember, we the faithful, will not be done celebrating the joy of Easter after 50 Days. The 50 Days of Eastertide go beyond this mark on the calendar. The third person of the Trinity, the Holy Spirit has been sent to us as a new guide to teach, sanctify and lead us. Like the first disciples, we are not alone, and we rejoice as a Church as the Risen Christ breathed upon the first disciples at Pentecost as the One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic Church founded in 33 A.D.

This person will use an app on their phone to report issues, so no paperwork is involved. This area of responsibility would require approximately 15 minutes per day.

Dear Padre,

I am very curious why, after his resurrection, Jesus told Mary Magdalene not to touch him, but in the upper room, Thomas was encouraged to touch him.

Saint John tells us of this incident between Mary and the risen Jesus. There are scholars who say that immediately after Jesus spoke to Mary he ascended to heaven. His encounter with Thomas, then, would be after the ascension, and the feast of the Ascension we celebrate forty days after Easter is simply a termination of Jesus' earthly appearances.

There is another explanation to consider, offered by other Scripture scholars. The word Jesus uses to tell Mary Magdalene not to touch him is more like "cling" to him. She cannot *cling* to her old relationship with Jesus. Since his resurrection, a new relationship is necessary. Mary was looking for the Jesus she knew before the passion, not the Jesus of the resurrection. She must now come to know the risen Jesus.

Mary could not cling to Jesus because she had to see him in a new way. For Thomas, the situation is different. Jesus invites Thomas to place his hand on the wounds to prove that he is "real"—that he is really a new kind of being, a resurrected being. Thomas, in his way, also wants to cling to what he thought he knew about Jesus. Both he and Mary Magdalene were close to Jesus, but even so, there were things they still did not understand. Jesus always has the ability to surprise us. ●
