Saved by Love, Not by Suffering

FR. JOSEPH JUKNIALIS

I **m not sure there is any value in suffering in and of itself.** Nor do I think God wants us to suffer. That would make him sadistic. Nor is it, then, Jesus' suffering and death that saves us, but rather his love even to the point of suffering and death that saves us. It is his love that reveals the greatness of God's love for us that is so unbelievable. The basis of our faith is Jesus' trust in God, who would bring about life even through death. We also hear the wisdom of St. Peter today: "...If you are patient when you suffer for doing what is good, this is a grace before God" (1 Peter 2:20). Such is the shepherd's voice that teaches us and leads us.

Does anyone ever choose to suffer for doing what is good? Yes. Every day. Spouses become caregivers for husbands or wives robbed of their memories. Each day people go to jobs that are pure drudgery, and they do so because they love their families. Some choose to

live simply, to be countercultural in a consumer society. Others help their community by living in neighborhoods many avoid. Some parents willingly postpone a career in order to be present to their growing family. Teachers often go beyond expectations for students

who need extra help. It is never the suffering of these people that captures and reflects the image of Jesus, but the love even to the point of suffering. ●

A message from Grant Doyle, Parish Intern

Blessings to you and your loved ones as we continue to joyfully celebrate this Easter season and prepare in the coming weeks to celebrate the Ascension of the Lord on May 21. It was at the Ascension that our Lord sent out the disciples to fulfill the Great Commission: Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations (Mt. 28:19). I would like to share with you that I have accepted the Lord's invitation to "make disciples of all nations" by recently joining the FOCUS missionary staff! As a FOCUS missionary, I will enter the spiritual battleground of the modern college campus to invite and enter into discipleship with college students to help them know Christ Jesus and grow in their relationship with Him and His Church.

To prepare for this extraordinary mission, I will join all first and second-year missionaries at New Staff Training (NST) in Lincoln, Nebraska beginning May 24. At NST, I will receive one month of formation and training that will prepare and equip me for full-time mission. I will then return home on June 22 to begin full-time support raising in which I will invite others to partner with me in this mission. After one month of support raising I will leave in late July or early August to join my missionary team at our assigned campus (which will be determined at a later date) to begin our mission work for the Fall 2023 semester!

As I transition into this exciting opportunity, I would like to thank our parish family for all of the support, prayers, fellowship, and ability to serve alongside so many of you this year. It has truly been a blessing and a joy to serve and grow in faith with the parishioners of St. Boniface Parish and St. Meinrad Parish. A special thanks to Father Anthony and all of the parish staff, Jess Fischer and all F3 (family faith formation) leaders, all who have volunteered and participated in our CYO Youth Group, and all liturgical ministers I have had the privilege to serve with, including our seminarians Deacon Jack, Deacon Bobby, and Cyrus and Fredrick from Glenmary Home Missioners. The dedication and faith of so many in our parish family has profoundly impacted and inspired me to grow in my relationship with our Lord Jesus Christ. I look forward to sharing more about my mission with you all later this summer. Please know that you are in my prayers, and please keep me in your prayers as I embark on this journey! My last day in the parish is Wednesday, May 3, 2023.

This person will use an app on their phone to report issues, so no paperwork is involved. This area of responsibility would require approximately 15 minutes per day.

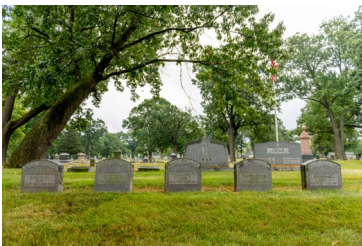

After a brief homily, individuals wishing to receive this sacrament are asked to move to the end of the pew along the center aisle. The infirm and individuals needing assistance seated in the first pew on either side will receive this sacrament first. Throughout the year, Communal Anointing of the Sick is also celebrated 20 minutes before the Saturday Vigil Mass at St. Boniface Parish and the Sunday Mass at St. Meinrad Parish on the second to last weekend in May and the last weekend in August.

Anointing of the Sick is a sacrament of healing. The idea behind this sacrament is that we are all members of the body of Christ. When one of us suffers, all of us suffer, and all of God's creation suffers with us.

A parishioner or caregiver is strongly encouraged to contact the parish office and speak with a staff member to request a priest visit their home to receive this sacrament if their particular situation does not allow for the communal celebration of this sacrament. Please also notify the parish office if you are ill, shut-in, entering the hospital or a have recently moved to a long-term care center.

The sacrament of anointing may be repeated:

- When the sick person recovers after being anointed and becomes sick again at a later time.
- When, during the same illness, the condition of the sick person becomes more serious.
- In the case of a person who is chronically ill or elderly and in a weakened condition, the sacrament of anointing may be repeated when in the pastoral judgment of the priest the condition of the sick person warrants the repetition of the sacrament. (*Pastoral Care of the Sick*, No. 102)

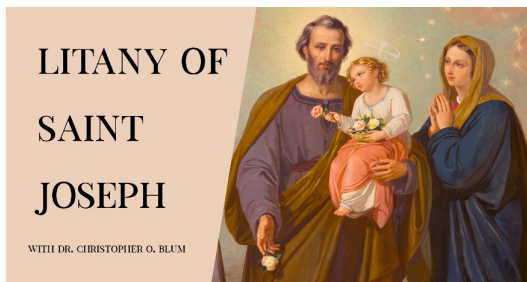

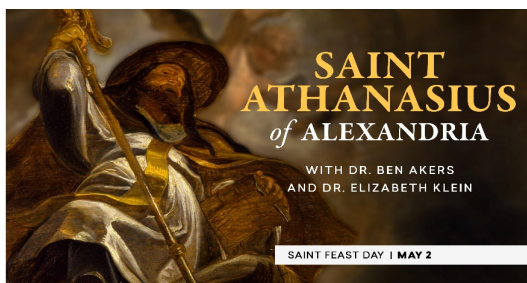

Sacraments

Dear Padre,

In the Apostles' Creed, we profess that Jesus "descended into hell." Is there any biblical reference to this? Do we know what he did when he was there?

Jesus Christ—who experienced death completely—descended to the realm of death. By his resurrection from the dead on the third day, he conquered death and the devil, “who has the power of death” (Hebrews 2:14). Other scriptural references include Acts 3:15, Romans 8:11, 1 Corinthians 15:20, and Hebrews 13:20. An ancient homily for Holy Saturday also attests to this belief: “God has fallen asleep in the flesh and he has raised up all who have slept ever since the world began....Greatly desiring to visit those who live in darkness and in the shadow of death, he has gone to free from sorrow Adam in his bonds and Eve, captive with him....‘I order you, O sleeper, to awake. I did not create you to be a prisoner in hell. Rise from the dead, for I am the life of the dead.’”

According to the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*, “Jesus did not descend into hell to deliver the damned, nor to destroy the hell of damnation, but to free the just who had gone before him” (CCC 633). His descent was to proclaim the Good News to the spirits imprisoned there, bringing “the Gospel message of salvation to complete fulfillment” to all people of all times and all places (CCC 634). Thus, “the gospel was preached even to the dead” (1 Peter 4:6). ●
