There are moments when we realize the baton has been passed to us, and now we must conduct the symphony

of our lives. One such moment may be when both parents have died. "They" say we never fully grow up until that occurs, for from that time on we can no longer go home. I know of a daughter who received a gift from her mother when the daughter moved out on her own. Inside, the daughter discovered a pair of apron strings, a symbol of her break with home. At various times, life hands us a bountiful serving of responsibility as we commit to a vocation, or for many, become parents for the first time. On such occasions, the future may weigh heavily upon us.

This week's Gospel is a farewell speech of sorts. Given to the Twelve on the night before his passion and death, Jesus promises he will not leave us orphans and that the Spirit will be given to us to do what we must do.

There have been any number of times when life has unfolded for me into new circumstances and life roles, occasions often filled with anxiety and sometimes even fear. I usually found I could deal with such realities by asking myself what would be the worst that could happen, and if it did, could I handle it? Every time, I found myself realizing I *could* handle the worst. Importantly, the ability to do what needs doing always seems to flow from God's Spirit that is given to each of us. If our faith in God is alive in us, our spiritual apron strings are never severed. ●

F3 Families and Caregivers, remember to view The Gospel for All Ages on page 6 of the weekly bulletin to learn more about today's Gospel passage through Scripture and Tradition.

This page features questions from this week's student session where your student, their catechists and classmates have learned more about their Catholic faith.

Also, the Family Corner briefly describes the gospel and helps us understand how Scripture and Tradition define us as a Church. I encourage each of you to continue to learn more about your faith as a family and together to pray the Family Prayer and take the weekly challenge inspired by the Question of the Week.

Why do you think Jesus was completely obedient to God and what can we learn from Jesus' actions?

Today we celebrate the Sixth Sunday of Easter, continuing in the Gospel of John, Chapter 14. As Jesus speaks to his disciples, he promises an eternal presence for those who love him. In last Sunday's gospel, Jesus revealed that he is the way, the truth, and the life. And whoever has faith in him has faith in God and will do the works of God. We believe these works are both visible and invisible, as professed in the Nicene Creed. Through our prayer and worship and in our service to others, the works of God continue.

As Jesus promises to ask for a Paraclete for those who love him, this Paraclete will be with the disciples always. Jesus reveals a name for the Paraclete, "the Spirit of truth." This conversation between Jesus and his disciples takes place at the Last Supper. As Jesus prepares to be crucified, he reassures them even in his absence, and they will not be abandoned. The Advocate, the Holy Spirit, will intercede for them and bring about a common unity among the disciples as revealed and eternally reflected in the communion between the Father and the Son.

The [Catechism of the Catholic Church](#) teaches us, "Because the Holy Spirit is the anointing of Christ, it is Christ who, as the head of the Body, pours out the Spirit among his members to nourish, heal, and organize them in their mutual functions, to give them life, send them to bear witness, and associate them to his self-offering to the Father and to his intercession for the whole world. Through the Church's sacraments, Christ communicates his Holy and sanctifying Spirit to the members of his Body." (CCC 739)

In today's gospel, we learn about the tension between the community of disciples to whom God revealed himself through the Paschal Mystery and the unbelieving whose lack of faith has not allowed them to see what has been

revealed. This lack of faith leaves a world in darkness, unable to accept "the Spirit of truth." Whether it is first-century Palestine or the looming days of the 21st century, this same contrast remains in our world today.

Please join me in praying that our faith renewed in this Easter Mystery and strengthened through the gift of the Holy Spirit allows us to continue sharing in the sufferings of Christ (in our personal cross as well as the crosses we carry as a society). As we share in the sufferings of Christ, we are also able to rejoice in renouncing sin so as to live in the freedom of God's glory revealed in the promise of eternal life. It is through the Holy Spirit that God's revelation and love are known on earth until the end of time, as it is in heaven.

Next Sunday, we celebrate the Lord's Ascension into Heaven. As the apostles looked on, Jesus was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight. Until now, some of Jesus' disciples may have doubted who Jesus was. He speaks clearly to the disciples in his last words before his departure. "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me," promising that he will be with them always, until the end of time.



As we pray in thanksgiving for the gift of all mothers, we also specifically lift up in prayer mothers experiencing a crisis pregnancy so that they may find support and encouragement and choose life for their child.

It is also important to remember that Mother's Day can be a difficult holiday for many people, including couples struggling with infertility; parents who have lost a child; those who have lost their own mothers; couples longing to welcome a child through adoption; and women who have been wounded by participation in abortion. Let us trust in the intercession of [Saint Gianna Beretta Molla](#), patron saint of mothers, physicians, and unborn children, to pray for us.

A blessed week ahead to all. I am pray daily for the health and spiritual prosperity of our parish family. Please join me in continuing to pray for the safety and prosperity of all who labor and work with the land during planting season.

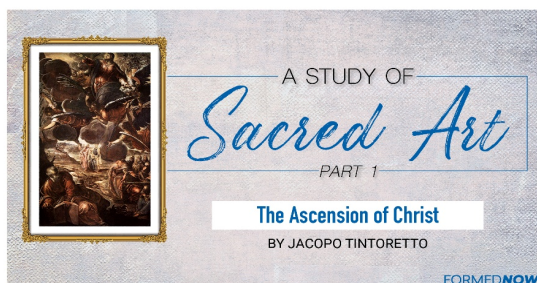

After a brief homily, individuals wishing to receive this sacrament are asked to move to the end of the pew along the center aisle. The infirm and individuals needing assistance seated in the first pew on either side will receive this sacrament first. Throughout the year, Communal Anointing of the Sick is also celebrated 20 minutes before the Saturday Vigil Mass at St. Boniface Parish and the Sunday Mass at St. Meinrad Parish on the second to last weekend in May and the last weekend in August.

Anointing of the Sick is a sacrament of healing. The idea behind this sacrament is that we are all members of the body of Christ. When one of us suffers, all of us suffer, and all of God's creation suffers with us.

A parishioner or caregiver is strongly encouraged to contact the parish office and speak with a staff member to request a priest visit their home to receive this sacrament if their particular situation does not allow for the communal celebration of this sacrament. Please also notify the parish office if you are ill, shut-in, entering the hospital or a have recently moved to a long-term care center.

The sacrament of anointing may be repeated:

- When the sick person recovers after being anointed and becomes sick again at a later time.
- When, during the same illness, the condition of the sick person becomes more serious.
- In the case of a person who is chronically ill or elderly and in a weakened condition, the sacrament of anointing may be repeated when in the pastoral judgment of the priest the condition of the sick person warrants the repetition of the sacrament. (*Pastoral Care of the Sick, No. 102*)

Dear Padre,

If the Catholic Church recognizes baptisms from other Christian denominations, why not confirmations?

Baptism signs us with an indelible mark. It defines our character and can never be repeated. A baptism is always held to be valid if a person is baptized with water using the Trinitarian formula (*Catechism of the Catholic Church*, 1256). If a priest is unsure of the validity of a person's baptism, he would baptize the person conditionally, recognizing the earlier baptism if it happened and was valid. The minister of baptism is usually an ordained minister, but in necessity anyone can baptize, including a non-Christian, if the person intends what the Church intends.

Confirmation also leaves an indelible mark, as does holy orders, and they also cannot be repeated. What makes confirmation different from baptism is that the minister of confirmation is ordinarily the bishop because this expresses the apostolic unity of the Church (CCC 1312). If someone had been confirmed in a Church that has apostolic succession, their confirmation would be considered valid, and the person wouldn't be reconfirmed.

Most Christian churches have a common understanding of what the sacrament of baptism is, but while other churches might have communion, confirmation, and ordination, their celebration of those sacraments may not include all the requirements necessary for the Catholic Church to consider them valid. ●
