## Freed by the Spirit

**F**ear can be a most powerful imprisoning force. Like the apostles who locked themselves behind closed doors after the resurrection for fear of the local leaders, there are times when our own fears lock us out of the future and into our past.

We find ourselves choosing not to be generous for fear that if we are, we will find ourselves empty-handed with no one to care for us because all of our resources have been used up. And so, because of our fear, we lock ourselves into our own selfishness. At other times, we hesitate to be kind for fear that our care will be misconstrued or, worse, will be taken advantage of and abused. And so, for fear of continual demands upon our kindness, we lock ourselves into indifference. At other times, we find ourselves too cautious to speak out in the face of injustice because of a misguided respect

for "someone else's business" or because we are afraid anger or rejection will come down upon us. So, we lock ourselves into silence.

It is always the Spirit, however, that enables us to unlock those doors once locked by our fear. While that new power enables us to venture into a sometimes-shattering world, it does not promise we won't be shattered in the process. All that Jesus promised is that the Spirit would bring us peace. Such peace happens to us whenever we choose not to succumb to our fears. It is indeed a new creation taking place in us, even now.

## F3 Question of the Week

F3 Families and Caregivers, remember to view The Gospel for All Ages on page 6 of the weekly bulletin to learn more about today's Gospel passage through Scripture and Tradition.

This page features questions from this week's student session where your student, their catechists and classmates have learned more about their Catholic faith.

Also, the Family Corner briefly describes the gospel and helps us understand how Scripture and Tradition define us as a Church. I encourage each of you to continue to learn more about your faith as a family and together to pray the Family Prayer and take the weekly challenge inspired by the Question of the Week.

## What kind of bad choices do you find yourself making?

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Pentecost, the birthday of the Church. In the Church's festivities, we are again introduced to the third person of the Holy Trinity, as the Apostles and disciples were the first to be introduced to the Holy Spirit in the upper room on Pentecost. In celebrating the Ascension, we heard in Matthew, Chapter 28, Jesus speaking to the eleven admitting his full authority (in heaven and on earth) and commissioning them to make disciples of all people and to baptize.

We understand that sin injures our relationship with God and others. Sin also compromises the gift of our human dignity received at Baptism. As we pursue our life in Christ through the Church, how often do we find ourselves making bad choices, and when doing so, where is Christ in these moments? How do we get so far from Christ and our call to holiness? As we have received the gift of faith in Baptism, whether as an infant, child or adult, we too receive the gift of the Holy Spirit. Jesus promised this gift. This gift fills our life, and inspires our mind, heart and body to proclaim the Good News.

This same commissioning is also noted in Acts, Chapter 1. Before Jesus' Ascension, he said to his Apostles, "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in Judea, in Samaria and to the end of the earth." As Jesus imparts this great gift of the Spirit, in his blessing of peace, he also bestows his authority upon the Apostles and others who follow in their footsteps, "whose sins you forgive are forgiven, whose sins you retain are retained" (John, Chapter 20). The gifts of the Sacrament of Reconciliation and Eucharist allow us to remain in unity or communion with Jesus in a deeply personal and spiritual way.

As St. Paul writes in his first letter to the Corinthians, the gifts of the Spirit are not reserved for a particular group or individuals but are for all. In understanding this, the Spirit brings unity and community in the various kinds of spiritual gifts; the manifestation of these gifts is revealed in the fruits of the Spirit. Look around! There are different forms of service, the way we live

our Christian vocation within the Catholic faith, but the same Lord. We honor God through our prayer and work in different ways, but it is the same God we honor. Pentecost is a time for us to renew our active expression of faith through our prayer and worship and our understanding of why we receive sacraments and make use of the graces received and restored through the sacraments. The Holy Spirit binds up our wounds and strengthens our relationship with God and others, and through the Church, our human dignity is restored through his love and mercy.

The [Catechism of the Catholic Church](#) teaches us that "the mission of Christ and the Holy Spirit is brought to completion in the Church, which is the Body of Christ and the Temple of the Holy Spirit. This joint mission henceforth brings Christ's faithful to share in his communion with the Father in the Holy Spirit. The Spirit *prepares* men and goes out to them with his grace, in order to draw them to Christ. The Spirit *manifests* the risen Lord to them, recalls his word to them, and opens their minds to the understanding of his Death and Resurrection. He *makes present* the mystery of Christ, supremely in the Eucharist, in order to reconcile them, to *bring them into communion* with God, that they may 'bear much fruit.'" (CCC 737)

A blessed and spirit-filled Pentecost Sunday to you. In Baptism, we received the gifts of the Holy Spirit, and in Confirmation, these gifts were stirred up to help us be renewed in the Body of Christ, the Church. The gifts of the Holy Spirit include Wisdom, Understanding, Counsel (Right Judgment), Fortitude (Courage), Knowledge, Piety (Reverence), and Fear of the Lord (Wonder and Awe in God's Presence) Isaiah 11:1-2. And the fruits of the Holy Spirit are: Charity, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Generosity, Gentleness, Faithfulness, Modesty, Self-control, and Chastity. (Galatians 5:22-23)

Whether we are in search of God or God is in search of us, it is in the Holy Spirit's gift as the Sanctifier that provides us with the gifts of the Holy Spirit and calls us to bear fruit through this same Spirit. I pray, as we honor the Paschal Mystery, we too experience the joy of the Spirit with Christ's return to the glory of Heaven and the gift of the Spirit shared with us in his promise to send an Advocate for us to guide us to where He, our Head and Founder, has gone before.

As Memorial Day approaches, we take the time to remember and honor the brave men and women who have given their lives in service to our country. It is a day to reflect on the sacrifices these heroes and their families made. On Monday, May 29, you are invited to join me and others who gather for Mass at 4:15 p.m. at St. Boniface Parish to remember in prayer the memory of those who died in military service. Let us not forget to offer our gratitude and prayers for their eternal peace.

As we remember and honor these heroes on Memorial Day, let us also renew our commitment to work for a world where peace and justice can flourish. Let us never forget the sacrifices made for our freedoms and always keep in our hearts the memory of those who gave their lives for us in times of unrest and war and in the tranquility of peace. Blessings and peace to all!

#### About the Gospel

Jesus wanted us to have a way to be close to God again when we make a bad choice that hurts him, others, or even ourselves.

Other activities will include raffles of handmade quilts from parishioners and local artisans, and themed gift baskets, featuring local goods and artisan work. Handmade quilts from parishioners and local artisans will be available for purchase, from 9 to 9:30 a.m., for \$600 each.

Also featured will be live music by Sweetwater Band from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. An organ concert by Nolan Snyder, a graduate of Indiana University Jacobs School of Music, will begin at 11 a.m. Guided tours of the historic church, which is listed on the National Register of Historic Places, will be at 12 p.m. and 1 p.m. The oak case organ features 10 ranks, 535 pipes, two manuals with 58 keys, and pedals with 25 keys, built and installed in 1898 by Edmund Giesecke of Evansville, IN.

The picnic will conclude with raffle drawings and a reading of the picnic sponsors and the Picnic Honor Roll. You must be at least 18 years old to enter the drawings, and you need not be present to win. Cash prizes are mailed within 10 business days.

Shuttle service, handicap parking on the north side of the church, shaded grounds, and air-conditioned dining are available all day. An expanded area of covered outdoor seating will be set up on the south side of the parish center. Handicap-accessible seating is available at all dining locations.

#### Family Faith Formation

Every Christian is charged to spread the Gospel. Jesus directs us, "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature" (Mark 16:15). This is the work that we should be doing "together" best, and we should be recognized by this. However, we, the faithful of St. Boniface and St. Meinrad, need instruction in how we can best proclaim the Gospel to those around us.

We have to know our faith before we can share our faith. The Family Faith Formation Commission aids the pastor, pastoral council, and the Family Faith Formation staff and coordinators in establishing policies and setting goals pertinent to lifelong faith formation opportunities, programs, and activities for parish and at-home preparation and formation. These programs and activities are aimed at strengthening the faith of those who gather and worship in our communities and helping them develop the courage to invite others to share in the life, sacrament, and mission of the Church based on events that punctuate the liturgical year.

The parish-based catechetical process aims towards growth in many dimensions of Christian discipleship: knowledge of faith, liturgical life, moral formation, prayer, belonging to community and missionary spirit. It is faithful to Catholic tradition and responsive to the needs and lived experience of people today. The Family Faith Formation Commission's mission is to provide a lifelong intergenerational whole community approach to faith formation that emphasizes parish and home preparation and formation based on events of the liturgical year.

This commission's goal is to be stewards of these dimensions through their strategic planning and implementation. Commission members include the commission chair, program coordinators, site coordinators, safety coordinators, key program volunteers, activity advocates, and members of the pastoral staff who meet on the First Tuesday of January, March, June and August.

# Dear Padre,

***I am a practicing Catholic and I don't remember being confirmed. Is it too late for me to be confirmed?***

The sacrament of confirmation usually happens when a person is older, and therefore you would likely remember the occasion. It could be that you were not confirmed. You can check with the parish you lived in during your school years to be sure. They keep records of confirmations done in the parish.

Confirmation is the final sacrament of initiation. Baptism ushers us into our life with God by giving us new life. Confirmation seals us with the spirit so we can follow Jesus and live out our particular vocation. And the Eucharist gives us strength for the journey and keeps us in union with God.

If you discover you have not been confirmed or if you can't find out for certain, talk with your pastor. You would not be the first adult seeking confirmation. Your pastor can tell you how your diocese handles confirmation for adults. There might be a program of adult instruction for confirmation to ensure you understand the sacrament and the teachings of the Church.

Today is Pentecost, the day when we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit into the lives of the apostles. The Spirit gave them strength for what they had to do. The Spirit can do the same for you.
