God Up There, God Down Here

Which of these images best describes your God: gardener, friend, policeman, Santa Claus, magician, doctor, lover, parent, judge, the Force?

Theologically, God is both transcendent and immanent, up there and down here. In other words, God is powerful, majestic, awesome, and all-knowing but always close, caring for us, forgiving, and comforting. Most of us lean toward one or the other in our spirituality. Whichever image you choose will tell you something about how you usually relate to God. None of the images are necessarily right or wrong unless it locks us into relating to God in only one way.

Our tendency to relate to God as either transcendent or immanent may influence our preference for liturgical style. If we view God primarily as transcendent, we will tend to appreciate the Mass as a sacrifice, celebrated formally with processions, incense, and majestic music.

If we tend to relate to God as more immanent, we will tend to appreciate the Mass as a eucharistic meal with the community gathered around the altar table singing simpler music. As God is both transcendent and immanent, we should not have to choose. The ideal liturgical style would incorporate something of both transcendence and immanence.

Today's story of Moses, who climbs Mount Sinai and there bows down in worship before God, is a story of the transcendence of God—majestic, powerful, awesome to behold. Today's gospel is of an immanent God who loved the world so much that he sent his Son, not to condemn it but to save it. ●

The mysteries of God are hidden yet revealed through the Holy Trinity.

John 3:16-18

F3 Question of the Week

F3 Families and Caregivers, remember to view The Gospel for All Ages on page 6 of the weekly bulletin to learn more about today's Gospel passage through Scripture and Tradition.

This page features questions from this week's student session where your student, their catechists and classmates have learned more about their Catholic faith.

Also, the Family Corner briefly describes the gospel and helps us understand how Scripture and Tradition define us as a Church. I encourage each of you to continue to learn more about your faith as a family and together to pray the Family Prayer and take the weekly challenge inspired by the Question of the Week.

What other ways can we know God loves us?

As we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, we realize that while the mysteries of God are hidden, they are revealed through Divine Revelation and in our search for God. We must remember that God the Father sent his only begotten Son into the world to draw us back into His perfect love.

This perfect love is received and experienced through the Word, sacraments, and in our common service to one another. In celebrating the Ascension and Pentecost, our God, who was made visible through Christ, has returned to the Father and sent the Holy Spirit to sanctify the world until Christ comes again.

As we gather today, we honor the Most Holy Trinity in which we were baptized and sign ourselves at the beginning and end of every prayer, including our celebration of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. We rejoice in being born again in water and the spirit in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

Baptism leaves an indelible mark, no matter when one is baptized. Because the mark of baptism is permanent, there is no need for a second or third baptism. St. Paul tells us, "There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to one hope when you were called; one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all" (*Ephesians 4:4-6*). The doors to a new life in Christ are opened in receiving the Sacrament of Baptism. This life goes beyond our death and allows us to hope for life in Heaven after our mortal death. We believe Baptism is the sacrament of salvation. This sacrament cleanses us from sin, making us children of God and allowing us to share in his divine life. This divine life is experienced through our five senses most perfectly within the Mass.

PADRE'S POST (continued)

The [*Catechism of the Catholic Church*](#) teaches us that "the mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God in himself. It is therefore the source of all the other mysteries of faith, the light that enlightens them. It is the most fundamental and essential teaching in the 'hierarchy of the truths of faith.' The whole history of salvation is identical with the history of the way and the means by which the one true God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, reveals himself to men 'and reconciles and unites with himself those who turn away from sin.'" (CCC 234)

"The Trinity is a mystery of faith in the strict sense, one of the 'mysteries that are hidden in God, which can never be known unless they are revealed by God.' To be sure, God has left traces of his Trinitarian being in his work of creation and in his Revelation throughout the Old Testament. But his inmost Being as Holy Trinity is a mystery that is inaccessible to reason alone or even to Israel's faith before the Incarnation of God's Son and the sending of the Holy Spirit." (CCC 237)

Next Sunday, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ (*Corpus Christi*). In next Sunday's Gospel from John, there is a question posed from those who witnessed the multiplication of loaves and fish. Such miracles were identified as signs through which people came to believe that Jesus was the Son of God. Jesus reveals Himself in John's Chapter 6 as the Bread of Life. God gave the Israelites manna in the desert, which spoiled.

God now gives bread from Heaven, which never spoils, forever connecting us to Him through the Eucharist.

Again, congratulations to all graduates and their families. Thank you for the invitations to your families' celebrations.

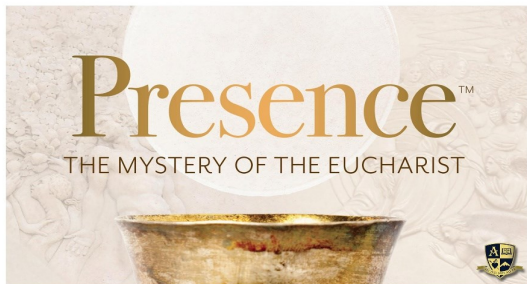

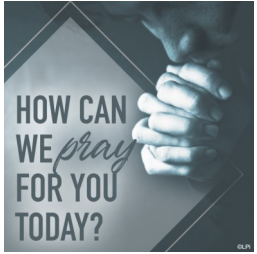
The red luminary located near the tabernacle burns to remind us of the sacramental presence of Jesus Christ.

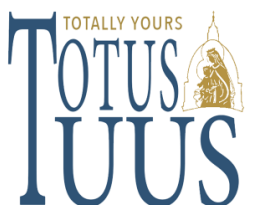

Family Faith Formation

Every Christian is charged to spread the Gospel. Jesus directs us, "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature" (Mark 16:15). This is the work that we should be doing "together" best, and we should be recognized by this. However, we, the faithful of St. Boniface and St. Meinrad, need instruction in how we can best proclaim the Gospel to those around us.

We have to know our faith before we can share our faith. The Family Faith Formation Commission aids the pastor, pastoral council, and the Family Faith Formation staff and coordinators in establishing policies and setting goals pertinent to lifelong faith formation opportunities, programs, and activities for parish and at-home preparation and formation. These programs and activities are aimed at strengthening the faith of those who gather and worship in our communities and helping them develop the courage to invite others to share in the life, sacrament, and mission of the Church based on events that punctuate the liturgical year.

The parish-based catechetical process aims towards growth in many dimensions of Christian discipleship: knowledge of faith, liturgical life, moral formation, prayer, belonging to community and missionary spirit. It is faithful to Catholic tradition and responsive to the needs and lived experience of people today. The Family Faith Formation Commission's mission is to provide a lifelong intergenerational whole community approach to faith formation that emphasizes parish and home preparation and formation based on events of the liturgical year.

This commission's goal is to be stewards of these dimensions through their strategic planning and implementation. Commission members include the commission chair, program coordinators, site coordinators, safety coordinators, key program volunteers, activity advocates, and members of the pastoral staff who meet on the First Tuesday of January, March, June and August.

Dear Padre,

Two relatives of mine died from a disease for which they never sought treatment. Both said, “God will heal me if that is his will.” Wouldn’t God have wanted them to see a doctor?

It is safe to say that God would have them see a doctor. Does doing so compromise our faith in God? No. Throughout all of salvation history, God has relied on human beings to be his instruments, his messengers. While we believe in God, who can and has acted miraculously throughout history, these moments are exceptions, not the rule. Ordinarily, God’s work is done by human hands. The spread of the gospel itself has come about through people who have responded to God in faith.

Part of this gospel story is the healing ministry of Jesus. Christianity has from the beginning taken up Jesus’ ministry of healing and attempted to restore health to the sick, not only through prayer and the sacraments but also through institutions that care for the sick and the dying. Even as we recognize that our primary relationship is with God, we must also see that caring for our lives and our health, gifts from that same God, is a responsible way to receive and be good stewards of these gifts.

Think of the training, knowledge, and experience that doctors, nurses, and all other health-care practitioners have spent years attaining. Is not their work a miracle of God’s love when it brings healing, restoration, and renewal? ●
