Just as the darkest of nights brings out stars we might never notice otherwise, so is it that when we find ourselves lost in the dark of life’s deserts, the slightest kindnesses can bring us to a brief oasis in a day otherwise oppressive. Most often such moments come as gifts, unearned—even undeserved. Yet they are blessings to us.

Psychologists tell us that if we find ourselves down in the dumps and depressed, we can find hope by naming three things that happened that day that were pure gifts—a phone call from a friend, a compliment, a free cup of coffee, a good bill of health from the doctor. Remembering them at the end of the day and giving thanks for them may not solve the issues that burden us, but they can put them in perspective, reminding us that life is a mix of both the good as well as the not so good.

Moses urged the people to recall all that God had done for them—bringing them out of Egypt, guiding them through the desert, leading them to water, and feeding them with manna. Amid their grumbling, their remembering offered them hope and the courage to go on.

Thus, what psychologists suggest is what God has been doing for us for thousands of years—that God feeds us daily in large and small ways, all without our deserving it but out of his great generosity. Remember, then, how God has fed you. ●

Living Bread from Heaven

John 6:51-58

F3 Question of the Week

F3 Families and Caregivers, remember to view The Gospel for All Ages on page 6 of the weekly bulletin to learn more about today's Gospel passage through Scripture and Tradition.

This page features questions from this week's student session where your student, their catechists and classmates have learned more about their Catholic faith.

Also, the Family Corner briefly describes the gospel and helps us understand how Scripture and Tradition define us as a Church. I encourage each of you to continue to learn more about your faith as a family and together to pray the Family Prayer and take the weekly challenge inspired by the Question of the Week.

Why do you think Jesus gave us the Eucharist?

Today we celebrate the second of two solemnities occurring in Ordinary Time following Pentecost Sunday. Last Sunday, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, and today, the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. So what is this all about? In my homily on Holy Trinity Sunday, I reintroduced the vocabulary word "consubstantial." This word is used in the Nicene Creed, meaning with the substance of the Father. Today's vocabulary word, "consecration."

As the holy sacrifice of the Mass is celebrated, Jesus Christ, through the bishop or priest who is celebrating the Mass, makes present sacramentally Jesus' saving and sacrificial death on the cross, where He redeemed us from our sins. For us, the Eucharistic Sacrifice is more than the memorial of Christ's redeeming death; it is not merely a symbol.

Our gathering for Mass in a eucharistic context is not simply to remember past events. It is making present in a sacramental manner – through matter and form – the sacrifice of the cross of Christ and his victory over death. As we gather for Mass, we are first nourished by God's Word and then, for those who are initiated and able to receive, the Eucharistic Sacrifice. The Mass is offered in adoration and thanksgiving to God, praying for all our needs and gaining us pardon for our sins. This miracle happens every time Mass is offered, day after day in every Catholic Church throughout the world, as bread and wine are consecrated for us and for our salvation.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* teaches us that "the mode of Christ's presence under the Eucharistic species is unique. It raises the Eucharist above all the sacraments as 'the perfection of the spiritual life and the end to which all the sacraments tend.' In the most blessed sacrament of the Eucharist 'the body and blood, together with the soul and divinity, of our Lord Jesus Christ and, therefore, the whole Christ is truly, really, and substantially contained.' This presence is called 'real' - by which is not intended to exclude the other types of presence as if they could not be 'real' too, but because it is presence in the fullest sense: that is to say, it is a substantial presence by which Christ, God and man, makes himself wholly and entirely present." (CCC 1374)

So, when we hear the bells ring by the deacon or acolyte shortly after we have knelt, we are called to participate in witnessing for ourselves, at the

moment of consecration, the transubstantiation of bread and wine bringing about the Body and Blood of Christ. Christ Himself, body, blood, soul and divinity, is present under the consecrated species of bread and wine.

As we receive Holy Communion, we acknowledge our union with God, forgiving our venial sins and providing the grace for us to turn away from grave sin. When we receive communion, we believe this sacrament strengthens the bonds of charity between the one receiving (the communicant) and Christ, while drawing us into a greater common unity as members of the Church, Christ's Mystical Body.

As a priest and pastor, I remain edified by the faithful who do not compromise their ability to receive or pray before the Blessed Sacrament, whether in quiet meditation or in the public worship of Eucharistic Adoration. We are blessed to have our parish churches open daily from dawn to dusk and to have the opportunity for Eucharistic Adoration each Wednesday from 3-4 p.m. before the 4:15 Mass at St. Meinrad Parish and on other occasions throughout the year.

Pope Paul VI said: "To visit the Blessed Sacrament is ... a proof of gratitude, an expression of love, and a duty of adoration towards Christ our Lord." As we celebrate this solemnity, let us remind ourselves that only Jesus can transform us into Himself. Our ability to receive the graces of this sacrament in the interior life that is only known to God within our heart is critical. Each initiated Catholic is called to receive love, to receive God. We must be open to this invitation and continue to be open to being transformed into one body, one spirit in Christ.

This past Monday, I celebrated the 18th anniversary of my ordination as a priest. I share this date with Saint Boniface, bishop and martyr. The church remembers this saint who founded the abbey of Fulda, who was the bishop of Mainz, who was martyred with 30 companions at Dokken in Frisia, and who was known as the Apostle of Germany. Recently, I finished reading *The Letters of Saint Boniface*, translated by Ephraim Emerton. This English translation captured well a biographical sketch of his life. His place in history identified some of the people and issues he encountered in the 8th century. Saint Boniface, pray for us!

Thanks to parishioners, family and friends who remembered me on June 5. Your prayers, affection and notes are appreciated and heartfelt.

The summer months have begun with activities to grow in our faith. Thanks to the many benefactors who provide scholarships for our young people to attend activities throughout the summer. The first of these activities begins this week. Carsten King and Marshall Snyder will attend the "One Bread, One Cup" Summer Conference #1 with Jess Fischer, Evangelization and Faith Formation Coordinator, and myself.

Since St. Francis of Assisi Parish and our two parishes have not been able to hire a youth minister, Jess and I have arranged our schedules to join these two young men, along with students from St. Francis of Assisi and St. Xavier High School, as the required adult chaperones.

Have a great week ahead. Let us continue to look out for one another as we are the hands and hearts of Christ to others. Thanks to the many volunteers who collaborate with the parish staff to strengthen and sustain the mission of our parish family. This time of the year, staff prepare annual reports for the various archdiocesan offices and agencies, highlighting the great work and service we do together. Much to celebrate and much to be thankful for, thanks for doing your part.

It is difficult to understand, but during the priest's words of consecration, the bread and wine becomes the Body and Blood of Jesus!

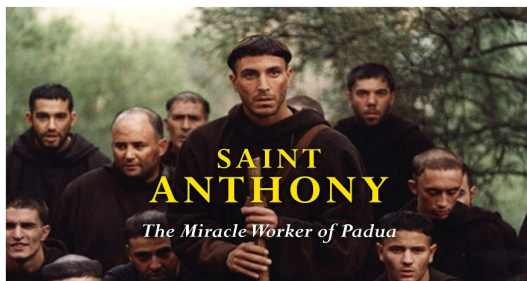

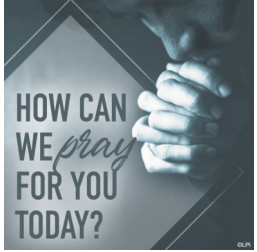
The red luminary located near the tabernacle burns to remind us of the sacramental presence of Jesus Christ.

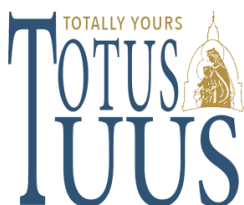

Family Faith Formation

Every Christian is charged to spread the Gospel. Jesus directs us, "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature" (Mark 16:15). This is the work that we should be doing "together" best, and we should be recognized by this. However, we, the faithful of St. Boniface and St. Meinrad, need instruction in how we can best proclaim the Gospel to those around us.

We have to know our faith before we can share our faith. The Family Faith Formation Commission aids the pastor, pastoral council, and the Family Faith Formation staff and coordinators in establishing policies and setting goals pertinent to lifelong faith formation opportunities, programs, and activities for parish and at-home preparation and formation. These programs and activities are aimed at strengthening the faith of those who gather and worship in our communities and helping them develop the courage to invite others to share in the life, sacrament, and mission of the Church based on events that punctuate the liturgical year.

The parish-based catechetical process aims towards growth in many dimensions of Christian discipleship: knowledge of faith, liturgical life, moral formation, prayer, belonging to community and missionary spirit. It is faithful to Catholic tradition and responsive to the needs and lived experience of people today. The Family Faith Formation Commission's mission is to provide a lifelong intergenerational whole community approach to faith formation that emphasizes parish and home preparation and formation based on events of the liturgical year.

This commission's goal is to be stewards of these dimensions through their strategic planning and implementation. Commission members include the commission chair, program coordinators, site coordinators, safety coordinators, key program volunteers, activity advocates, and members of the pastoral staff who meet on the First Tuesday of January, March, June and August.

Dear Padre,

I'm eighty-one. When I received first Communion, the nuns told me not to chew the holy Eucharist, but to let it melt in my mouth. Is it wrong to chew it?

It is permitted to chew the host or to let it dissolve in your mouth. The hosts today must be unleavened and made only of flour and water, making it easier for some communicants to dissolve it in their mouths. Unleavened bread doesn't mold or spoil and is more suitable than leavened bread for exposition and adoration. However, for nearly 800 years, the Church used leavened wheat bread for the Eucharist before unleavened wheat bread was introduced into the Roman rite. Communicants would have had to chew the Eucharist before the modern waferlike host evolved.

Your first Communion instruction on the proper way to consume the Eucharist was an effort to instill in you a deep reverence for the Real Presence of Christ. This profound respect for our Lord in the form of consecrated bread and wine is still desired by the Church. For example, at Mass the priest "reverently consumes the Body of Christ" and "reverently partakes of the Blood of Christ" (*General Instruction of the Roman Missal*, 158). Similarly, "when receiving Holy Communion, the communicant bows his or her head before the Sacrament as a gesture of reverence and receives the Body of the Lord from the minister" (*GIRM* 160). Today's Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ is a special day for us to remember Jesus' gift of his own body that we might be nourished and strengthened for this life's journey. ●
