Bucket List Questions

FR. JOSEPH JUKNIALIS

The *Bucket List* is a movie about two men, played by Jack Nicholson and Morgan Freeman, who find themselves sharing a hospital room, each diagnosed with terminal cancer. As they talk about the days that remain for each of them, they begin to discuss what they would yet hope to experience before they die. Hence, the title of the film.

At one point amid their many escapades together, Freeman suggests that God is going to ask two questions when they stand before the pearly gates. Nicholson hears this and grows edgy, suspecting his eternal future may be at risk. Freeman then tells him that the first question will be, “Have you ever experienced joy in life?” At that, Nicholson beams with a silly grin that suggests he is thinking more of pleasure than he is of joy. Nonetheless, he decides his lock on eternal bliss is halfway there. Then Freeman reveals the second question: “Have you ever brought joy to the lives of others?” With that, Nicholson’s face drops, realizing his life has been more about himself than about others.

Religion is not just about “going to church” but also about “going from church into the world.” That, in a sense, is what Jesus did when he named the twelve apostles and sent them out to heal, bring life, and overcome evil. It is also what we find ourselves sent to do amid the scattered events of every week—to bring joy into the lives of others. ●

F3 Question of the Week

F3 Families and Caregivers, remember to view The Gospel for All Ages on page 6 of the weekly bulletin to learn more about today's Gospel passage through Scripture and Tradition.

This page features questions from this week's student session where your student, their catechists and classmates have learned more about their Catholic faith.

Also, the Family Corner briefly describes the gospel and helps us understand how Scripture and Tradition define us as a Church. I encourage each of you to continue to learn more about your faith as a family and together to pray the Family Prayer and take the weekly challenge inspired by the Question of the Week.

How can you bring Jesus' healing love to others (even though you are not a priest)?

In today's Gospel, Matthew 9 and 10, we hear Jesus commission by name the 12 Apostles. This commissioning leads us to a deeper understanding of the Great Commission, Matthew 28, that we read a few weeks ago when celebrating the Lord's Ascension into heaven: "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

In this passage, we hear for ourselves what the duties will be for the Twelve, similar to a contemporary job description. Jesus has an expectation for those called: "Without cost, you have received; without cost, you are to give." Those commissioned for the mission are to proclaim the kingdom of God in word and deed by "curing the sick, raising the dead, cleansing lepers, driving out demons."

It was in Galilee, after encountering the official's daughter and the woman with a hemorrhage, the healing of two blind men, and the healing of a mute person, that the sight of the crowd moved Jesus' heart to pity because so many appeared to be troubled and abandoned, "like sheep without a shepherd." His compassion for the crowd brought into focus his discernment to call forth, commission and send out the Twelve whose names are also listed in the Gospels of Mark and Luke.

The goal was to minister to their spiritual needs under the guidance of the Holy Spirit to all people and all nations. Numbers have significant meaning throughout the Scriptures, such 3, 7, 10, 40. The calling of the Twelve, some scholars believe, represents the twelve tribes of Israel. This

representation brings into right relationship Israel and the Church.

The [Catechism of the Catholic Church](#) teaches us that "the whole Church is apostolic, in that she remains, through the successors of St. Peter and the other apostles, in communion of faith and life with her origin: and in that she is 'sent out' into the whole world. All members of the Church share in this mission, though in various ways. The Christian vocation is, of its nature, a vocation to the apostolate as well. Indeed, we call an apostolate 'every activity of the Mystical Body' that aims 'to spread the Kingdom of Christ over all the earth.'" (CCC 863)

As members of the Body of Christ, the Church, we are called to carry forth its mission, its ministry of charity. Each of us is sent out to proclaim the kingdom of God. It is not a matter of who; it is how. How we bring Christ to all situations.

Our common mission is to be open to the radical love that God revealed to us when sending his Son into the world. No matter how great or small the task, we must ask: Is the task responding to the needs of today while honoring what has transpired in our community or the story of salvation history? Jesus' keen awareness allowed Him to discern what was needed and, through compassion, respond.

Take time this week to make room for Jesus. Pray for the gift of discernment under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. I pray that the good work that began in you at the moment of Baptism will be strengthened and sustained by the gifts received through the Church, calling each of us to live out our call to be a holy nation renewed through the word of God and the sacraments received, making our journey of faith together through our life in Christ who is the Church.

I will be out of the office participating in the Archdiocesan Presbyteral Assembly Monday through Thursday. At this annual assembly, the priests of the archdiocese gather for ongoing formation and dialogue with Archbishop Thompson as we continue to live out the mission of the Church of central and southern Indiana. Father Brett Brannen, Director of Spiritual Formation in the School of Theology at the Pontifical College Josephinum is our presenter. He will be speaking about how hope, joy, and faith can breathe life into what matters most in our lives and the lives of those we lead and serve. Please pray for us as we pray for you and your loved ones. In my absence, please contact a member of the parish staff about any needs that might arise.

A blessed week ahead as you live out your vocation, remembering it is without cost we have received the gift of charity and it is without cost that we are to share it. Make a difference with the gospel as your guide.

St. John the Baptist | Catholic Saints

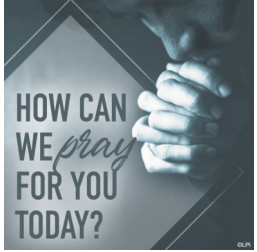
The red luminary located near the tabernacle burns to remind us of the sacramental presence of Jesus Christ.

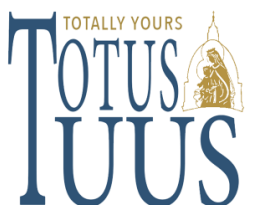

Water line replacement project



St. Boniface Parish has received four bids for the project to replace a water line at the parish center. The project will include replacing the current line from the meter, located north of the parish center, to the parish center. A water shutoff valve will be added near the meter to service the church line located north of the meter. Rather than replacing the existing line that begins at the southwest corner of the parish center, which is broken in a number of sections, the church line will now directly connect to the new valve by the meter. The updated line that serves the church begins just northwest of the meter in the parish center parking lot. All exterior lines on the church side were replaced when the recent church restroom renovation was completed. Gudorf Plumbing, Heating, Cooling, Electrical of Jasper was the successful bidder, and work will get underway soon.

In replacing the compromised line from the meter to the parish center, the existing galvanized water lines servicing the parish center, including the restrooms and restroom fixtures will need to be replaced within the next few months. The galvanized lines continue to rust and occasionally leak in the renovated areas through the lower level. In adding a valve to service the church waterline, the parish center and shelter house can be shut off without interrupting the water service to the church and can minimize damage in the lower level of the parish center.

Thanks to the volunteer team who have faithfully turned the water off and on in the lower level of the parish center daily to vacate the commode in church and during the winter months to arrive in plenty of time for the boilers to heat the church. Thanks for your patience during this time of exploring and securing short and long-term resolutions.

Family Faith Formation

Every Christian is charged to spread the Gospel. Jesus directs us, "Go into the whole world and proclaim the gospel to every creature" (Mark 16:15). This is the work that we should be doing "together" best, and we should be recognized by this. However, we, the faithful of St. Boniface and St. Meinrad, need instruction in how we can best proclaim the Gospel to those around us.

We have to know our faith before we can share our faith. The Family Faith Formation Commission aids the pastor, pastoral council, and the Family Faith Formation staff and coordinators in establishing policies and setting goals pertinent to lifelong faith formation opportunities, programs, and activities for parish and at-home preparation and formation. These programs and activities are aimed at strengthening the faith of those who gather and worship in our communities and helping them develop the courage to invite others to share in the life, sacrament, and mission of the Church based on events that punctuate the liturgical year.

The parish-based catechetical process aims towards growth in many dimensions of Christian discipleship: knowledge of faith, liturgical life, moral formation, prayer, belonging to community and missionary spirit. It is faithful to Catholic tradition and responsive to the needs and lived experience of people today. The Family Faith Formation Commission's mission is to provide a lifelong intergenerational whole community approach to faith formation that emphasizes parish and home preparation and formation based on events of the liturgical year.

This commission's goal is to be stewards of these dimensions through their strategic planning and implementation. Commission members include the commission chair, program coordinators, site coordinators, safety coordinators, key program volunteers, activity advocates, and members of the pastoral staff who meet on the First Tuesday of January, March, June and August.

Dear Padre,

Is there a right to health care? As a Catholic, what kind of obligation do I have to use my resources to help with the purchase of medicine for my brother? His insurance won't cover the costs, and he's on a fixed income.

Saint John XXIII's 1963 encyclical *Pacem In Terris* (Peace on Earth) said people have a right to live and a right to the "means necessary for the proper development of life" (11). This text serves as a foundation for the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' speaking of a right to "basic" or "adequate health care" in their Ethical and Religious Directives for Catholics. What is not clear in Church teaching is who has the duty to ensure that right. In some cases, the state has taken this responsibility, but this need not be the case. The condition of millions of our brothers and sisters in Christ, however, urges us to action on their behalf.

Regarding the case of one's brother, the question is difficult because of the need for more information. What is the brother's prognosis? Is he taking care of himself responsibly? What do you feel capable of doing morally without placing yourself and others in your care at risk?

Whatever one's ability to respond in this case, one's relationship with one's brother should be marked by compassion and a sincere desire and will to help in whatever way is morally reasonable. ●
