



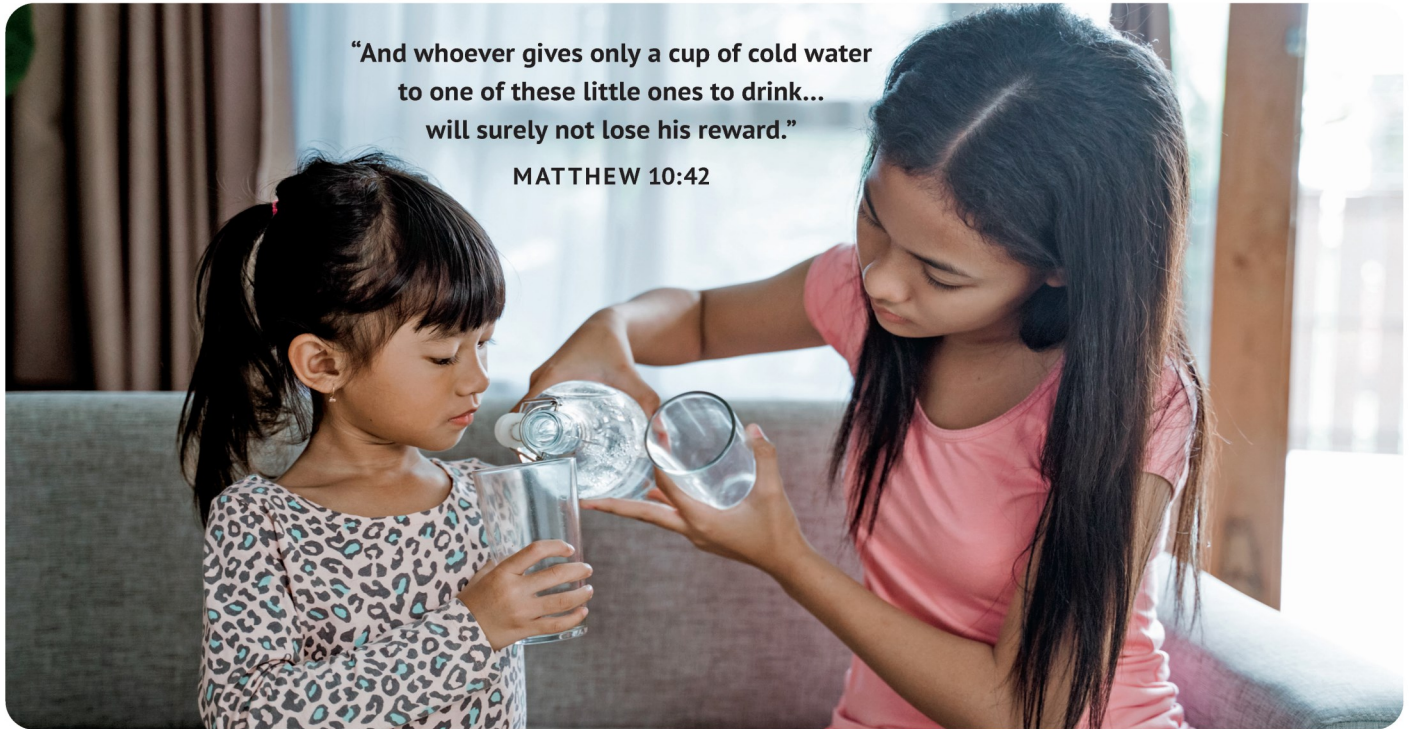

The Statue of Hospitality

Twelve score and seven years ago "our fathers brought forth, upon this continent, a new nation, conceived in liberty, and dedicated to the proposition that all men are created equal," as Abraham Lincoln once reminded us. This week we as a nation once again mark that new beginning, we who have inherited its blessings as a gift generously bestowed upon us by those who have gone before us, a gift not deserved but nevertheless ours, a gift we do not own, yet pass on to generations to come, a gift we eagerly share.

Hospitality is something to extend to those who come to our doors; it is also something we can extend to those who come to our shores. It seems worthwhile then, especially this week and amid so many disagreements over

immigration, to revisit the words inscribed at the base of the Statue of Liberty written by the poet Emma Lazarus and inscribed in our psyche as a nation. It serves as a vision of who we are, perhaps as much as does our Constitution.

Give me your tired, your poor,

The wretched refuse of your teeming shore.

F3 Families and Caregivers, remember to view The Gospel for All Ages on page 6 of the weekly bulletin to learn more about today's Gospel passage through Scripture and Tradition.

This page features questions from this week's student session where your student, their catechists and classmates have learned more about their Catholic faith.

Also, the Family Corner briefly describes the gospel and helps us understand how Scripture and Tradition define us as a Church. I encourage each of you to continue to learn more about your faith as a family and together to pray the Family Prayer and take the weekly challenge inspired by the Question of the Week.

How can you remember to give God thanks for your family?

As we gather in anticipation of our nation's celebration of Independence Day, as Catholics and Americans, we can be proud of both - our gratitude for the gift of faith we possess as Christian disciples and the gift of liberty that is ours as American citizens. The beautiful thing about being Catholic and American is that we do not have to choose one over another. Though our allegiances are distinct, they do not contradict one another. Faith and liberty complement each other.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* guides us in ways that compel us to work together as fellow citizens for the common good of all who live in this one nation, under God. In 1954, in response to the Communist threat of the times, President Eisenhower encouraged Congress to add the words "under God," creating the 31-word pledge we say today. Changing with the signs of the times, the inviolate words of the Pledge of Allegiance call us to form "one nation, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."

Our faith is not meant to reside merely within the walls of our parishes. At the end of every Mass, we are instructed to go forth and share the light of Christ, which we have received in the Eucharist, to the whole world. One way we share this light is by serving others as Christ served us, by doing the works he worked. Christ commands us to care for those weakest among us.

"Whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine," Christ tells us, "you did for me" (Matthew 25:40). The mission of our parishes' Service and Outreach Commission connects individuals with service opportunities, builds relationships with individuals and organizations who collaborate with volunteers, and searches for parish-wide service opportunities

in our town, our county, our state, our country, and around our world. We do this with our monthly food drives, helping neighbors in distress, and in building a home for a family in Belize.

I often give thanks for the freedom to gather for prayer and worship daily without making a reservation or request to our local, state, or federal government agencies. I can remember learning about the lack of liberty around the world when studying in the seminary and meeting monks from other countries such as Korea, Vietnam, and countries of the Eastern Bloc of Europe when under Communist rule. They did not have the right to celebrate Christmas on December 25 and Easter on Easter Sunday. The ruling party would assign alternate dates to disenfranchise their unity with the Church throughout the world, which is celebrating their unity of faith together on these dates.

These monks often lived in monasteries blended into neighborhoods where, before going to bed at night, they would fold their habits and place their belt, rosary, Bible, and any other expressions of faith in a false ceiling tile or a hidden compartment in their room. This important task was for fear that their monastery would be invaded during the night for a spot check of a reported nonregistered church or possibly being arrested, pulled from their bed as one identified who was living out their faith in the streets, classrooms, or assigned ministries.

In today's Gospel, Matthew, Chapter 10, we are reminded that to follow Jesus, we must be ready to give up ourselves totally. We believe that we receive supernatural life through the waters of Baptism. Our dignity is raised to a new life in Christ, who was born of the Virgin Mary, suffered, died, and rose from the dead. The freedom we celebrate on Independence Day brings to life the Paschal Mystery we celebrate at each Mass and calls to mind the deeds in which we are called to serve Christ and his Church through faith and action.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* teaches: "The way of perfection passes by way of the Cross. There is no holiness without renunciation and spiritual battle. Spiritual progress entails the asceticism and mortification that gradually lead to living in the peace and joy of the Beatitudes: He who climbs never stops going from beginning to beginning, through beginnings that have no end. He never stops desiring what he already knows." (CCC 2015)

Serving through faith and action is the same vision that our Founding Fathers possessed, and our Constitution guarantees that, as citizens, all religious faiths can freely put faith into action. One way we can contribute to the common life we share is through the support and participation of the Service and Outreach Commission ministries as we celebrate our nation's faith and liberty on this July 4th.

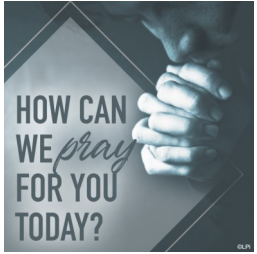
The red luminary located near the tabernacle burns to remind us of the sacramental presence of Jesus Christ.

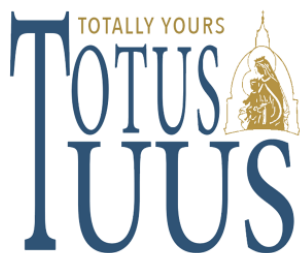

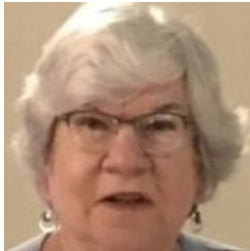
Water line replacement project

St. Boniface Parish has received four bids for the project to replace a water line at the parish center. The project will include replacing the current line from the meter, located north of the parish center, to the parish center. A water shutoff valve will be added near the meter to service the church line located north of the meter. Rather than replacing the existing line that begins at the southwest corner of the parish center, which is broken in a number of sections, the church line will now directly connect to the new valve by the meter. The updated line that serves the church begins just northwest of the meter in the parish center parking lot. All exterior lines on the church side were replaced when the recent church restroom renovation was completed. Gudorf Plumbing, Heating, Cooling, Electrical of Jasper was the successful bidder, and work will get underway soon.

In replacing the compromised line from the meter to the parish center, the existing galvanized water lines servicing the parish center, including the restrooms and restroom fixtures will need to be replaced within the next few months. The galvanized lines continue to rust and occasionally leak in the renovated areas through the lower level. In adding a valve to service the church waterline, the parish center and shelter house can be shut off without interrupting the water service to the church and can minimize damage in the lower level of the parish center.

Thanks to the volunteer team who have faithfully turned the water off and on in the lower level of the parish center daily to vacate the commute in church and during the winter months to arrive in plenty of time for the boilers to heat the church. Thanks for your patience during this time of exploring and securing short and long-term resolutions.

Dear Padre,

How do we serve everyone in a culturally diverse parish?

In the past it was common to have parishes dedicated to different ethnic groups where such populations were concentrated. In 2010, the US bishops found that 33 percent of all US parishes were culturally diverse, and that's perhaps using a narrow understanding of diversity. Then in 2014, they published *Best Practices for Shared Parishes: So That They May All Be One*, in which they outline a nine-movement process for creating an inclusive parish. The term "shared parishes" describes parish communities in which two or more languages or cultural contexts are present in the ministerial life of a parish. The fact that there are nine movements is notable. It means that we slowly move toward inclusiveness; we don't simply present a Mass in Spanish and think the job is done.

This brings to mind a parishioner in a parish I served in the Mississippi Delta. This was indeed a "shared parish," with a large African-American population, a significant Spanish-speaking population, and an elderly population of white Americans who expected a more "traditional" Mass with familiar hymns. Rosemary was an Italian-American whose family had lived in the area since the beginning of the nineteenth century. She served as the parish's director of education. Rosemary made it her practice to attend every Mass to welcome people and make them feel at home. She was the perfect example of the first movement toward serving everyone in a shared parish: hospitality. ●
