

ur lives seem to be plagued by an abundance of words, all seeking to influence us.
Television ads try to convince us to buy; teachers seek to pass on knowledge; parents cajole, discipline, and beg; society warns against drinking and driving, smoking and drugs; preachers hope to convert and change. They all do so with limited and varying success, and at times seeming failure. Too often there is the presumption that more words will achieve greater

results.

In the face of such questionable success, the prophet Isaiah proclaims that God's word "shall not return to me empty, / but shall do what pleases me, /achieving the end for which I sent it" (Isaiah 55:11). Yet the Gospel also suggests that the seed of God's word sown in our lives may wither and be choked

off and fail to take root, though also promising that what does produce fruit will surpass anything hoped for.

Because war is news and the media is obliged to report on it, it may appear that war is prominent worldwide. Not so. Statistically there is less war today than ever before, less violence, less conflict. We are more


> likely to die in our beds than at any other time in history. While there is yet much hunger in the world, there is less than at any other time. Nations are more inclined to try to negotiate peace. Great generosity abounds amid natural disasters, and while injustice prevails, we still fight to overcome

it. All of it the fruitfulness of God's word.

Creation is groaning in labor pains, says St. Paul, and we also groan. Yet the groaning attests to the pains of growing fruitfulness.

F3 Question of the Week

F3 Families and Caregivers, remember to view The Gospel for All Ages on page 6 of the weekly bulletin to learn more about today's Gospel passage through Scripture and Tradition.

This page features questions from this week's student session where your student, their catechists and classmates have learned more about their Catholic faith.

Also, the Family Corner briefly describes the gospel and helps us understand how Scripture and Tradition define us as a Church. I encourage each of you to continue to learn more about your faith as a family and together to pray the Family Prayer and take the weekly challenge inspired by the Question of the Week.

How do you till your spiritual sail (making your family a place where strong faith can flourish)?

As disciples of Christ, Christians can often easily share the story of Jesus as presented and professed in the Nicene Creed. We can tell the story of what we believe to be the truths of the Catholic faith by the gift of faith received in baptism, and by reason, our ability to think as only humans can do. So, it is in a sense easy to share with others that we believe that the Lord Jesus Christ, born before all ages, begotten not made, consubstantial with the Father and by the Holy Spirit was born of the Virgin Mary, becoming a man. He was crucified, died, and buried, rising on the third day as noted in Scriptures spoken through the prophets.

We also hold as truth that, after Jesus rose from the dead, he ascended into heaven and will come again in glory, judging the living and the dead. And that his kingdom has no end. These points of reference chronologically and spiritually make sense to us. So, what about the events of Christ's life beyond these points of reference? The Old Testament events, the prophets' words, and the Church's humble beginnings as described in the Book of Acts. Have you taken the time to be a lifelong learner of the Catholic faith, an informed disciple?

What are you good at? How did you become passionate about this topic? Do others see you as a reliable and informed source? I have a friend I have known for over three decades of my life who today is a computer engineer for one of the major phone and in-

ternet providers. He is well respected among his colleagues and leads a cyber security team that protects this company's intellectual property and financial assets. A few years ago, when I met up with him and a few other lifetime friends at a baseball game while visiting some national parks in the southwest area of the United States, I asked him how many hours a week he studies his discipline to be an excellent teacher and leader. Without hesitation, he responded, "At least 14 hours a week, two hours a day." I often return to this conversation as a monk and priest. You have heard me say before that you – the people of God – deserve the best when it comes to prayer and worship and how you can encounter Christ as you receive the sacraments, and the rest will flow from the graces you have received.

As we hear today's gospel from Matthew, Chapter 13, The Parable of the Sower, Jesus teaches in a way that can easily be understood in the geographic region in which he was teaching and in our setting of agriculture here in Spencer County. He speaks of sowing the message of salvation. For some, the message is heard and followed for a brief moment or only in the sight of others to please others who have social pressures on their freedom. And for others, the message is simply ignored. However, for some, the message is heard and received keenly - heard with an understanding that leads to greater knowledge and a deeper faith. And when listening with the ear of their heart, they learn the reason to live out their life, not according to their will, but the will of God. The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches: "Jesus asks for childlike abandonment to the providence of our heavenly Father who takes care of his children's smallest needs: 'Therefore do not be anxious, saying, "What shall we eat?" or "What shall we drink?"... Your heavenly Father knows that you need them all. But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things shall be yours as well." (CCC 305) To be a disciple of Jesus, we must be mindful of our soul's life, and how we care for and cultivate it. It does matter what we seek and find in this world. The soul must be always ready to receive the seed sown by God. The seed that allows us to know, love and serve God with the goal of a fruitful harvest for today and life eternal. Living the Gospel through faith and action is not an easy task and takes years of practice, years of discovery through learning. The kind of learning that goes beyond chronological reference points.

The kind of learning that comes from a deep dive into the truth to mine out the knowledge to be an effective teacher and leader.

In Romans, Chapter 8, St. Paul reminds us that no matter the situation we find ourselves in, the sufferings and trials of the present age are destined to be only a prelude to the glorious future as a child of God. We await the redemption of our bodies during this life so that what has



been promised can be fulfilled as we strive to bring honor and glory to every situation. We owe it to ourselves to seek and find the truth, so we can live the truth revealed in Sacred Scripture and Traditions of the Church. To have a great understanding of the gift and mystery of the Church, we must commit to be practitioners of the faith, with its source and summit being the Eucharist. The image I often reflect on is that of the image of a bike wheel. The center, Jesus Christ, the Eucharist – his Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity – is visible and present and from this center, all is connected, and all is holv.

I pray that you continue to have the grace to allow Christ to be a center and your source. Be assured of my continued prayer for you and your spoken and unspoken intentions. A blessed and safe week ahead to all.





Dear Padre,

I have a friend who has been coming to church with me, and he often has questions I can't answer. The big one last week was, "Why don't Catholics have more Bible preaching instead of all this ceremony?" I try to explain, but I don't think I have the right words. Help!

Your friend's question is very common because our Catholic ceremony can be confusing to those of other faiths.


The Catholic Mass comes from two prayer traditions. First, there is the tradition of the Jewish synagogue service where people gather to read and study the word of God. Second, there is

the tradition of the early Christians who met in their homes to celebrate the breaking of the bread.

The earliest Christians, Jewish converts, maintained their Sabbath tradition of reading and studying the word of God. They added to that the gift of the Eucharist that Jesus gave them. Our Mass puts these two together in the Liturgy of the Word (readings, preaching, prayers) and the Liturgy of the Eucharist (offering, eucharistic prayer, holy Communion).

The homily may not be as long as it is in some other Christian traditions, but the preaching should be solid, based on Scripture, and in line with the teaching of the Church. We are a Church of word and sacrament. We listen to the word of God and we celebrate the breaking of the bread.
