Finding Buried Treasure

Much like still-fishing, which is when the fish ultimately find the one sitting quietly waiting for the fish, most of the really treasured aspects of life somehow find us when we're not looking. Consider falling in love or discovering a friend; the job you enjoy so much that you'd almost do it for free; a hobby that gives you so much satisfaction; creative gifts you never knew you had until you stumbled upon them later in life. To say nothing of happiness for which so many go looking and never seem to find, while others are happy without ever seeking it out.

Wisdom, the gift Solomon asked for, is much like all of that. It seems to find us. Common sense, the stepchild of wisdom, is something most parents want their children to have, and, for some parents, it may be a source of great frustration as they try to make sure their children have it and use it. Wisdom is certainly a hint of the kingdom of heaven, but then so too is finding love and experiencing joy and living with a peace that refuses to be unsettled by the storms of life. All of those are the buried treasures of which the Gospel speaks, just as for others it is the pearl of great price for which they look and look until it finds them, not unlike still-fishing. All are buried treasures, hidden pearls, and tastes of eternal life. ●

F3 Families and Caregivers, remember to view The Gospel for All Ages on page 6 of the weekly bulletin to learn more about today's Gospel passage through Scripture and Tradition.

This page features questions from this week's student session where your student, their catechists and classmates have learned more about their Catholic faith.

Also, the Family Corner briefly describes the gospel and helps us understand how Scripture and Tradition define us as a Church. I encourage each of you to continue to learn more about your faith as a family and together to pray the Family Prayer and take the weekly challenge inspired by the Question of the Week.

The goal of family life is to help each other get to heaven. How can you help your family get to heaven?

As we continue in the gospel of Matthew, Chapter 13, Jesus teaches with a third parable. This parable is different from the first two. It focuses on the urgency of the kingdom's absolutes. The kingdom is to be seen as more important than any earthly importance or treasure. Anything we can imagine on this side of heaven is not worth the value of the kingdom – eternal life. As disciples of Jesus, we all have to actively take up our cross, first knowing what our cross is and when we see what the cross is and we follow for Jesus' sake and not our own. This parable reminds us to be truly his disciple; we ought to sacrifice even our life to receive the mysteries of the kingdom. Remember, our cross is not a punishment. It is our call to use the gift of love, our talents and our faith in God to live out our vocation, not our careers, as God designed it for each of us.

Like the person who found the buried treasure and the merchant who acquired the pearl of great price, we are called to seek and find the signs of the kingdom of heaven in our lives. We are called by the gifts received in the Sacrament of Baptism to bring about God's kingdom in our actions and in our words. Let us pray that our parish family values reflect our pursuit of the kingdom of heaven.

Please join me in praying for a safe and prosperous day as St. Boniface Parish prepares to celebrate their summer picnic on Sunday, August 6. Thanks to the summer picnic leadership team, committee and stand chairs, and many other volunteers, who make the day's activities possible and a homecoming for many.

ST. BONIFACE PARISH SUMMER PICNIC AUGUST 6

The annual St. Boniface Parish Summer Picnic will be held on Sunday, August 6, 2023, from 9:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. CDT on the church grounds at Fulda.

Games and entertainment, including bingo, will be available throughout the parish grounds. For the family, a Family Fun Center, along with free games and activities, will be open throughout the day.

Fulda's famous soup will be sold by the bowl or bulk at the shelter house. The food court will also serve hamburgers, featured grilled items and drinks. Ice cream and Dole soft-serve from Windmill Chill will be available.

Fried chicken or roast beef dinners with all the trimmings will be served in the parish center from 9:30 a.m.-1 p.m. Parishioners, friends, and neighbors are invited to enjoy indoor and outdoor dining throughout the day, weather permitting. Carryout is also available.

The Kountry Kitchen will feature homemade bread, rolls, muffins, coffee cakes, snacks, salsa, jellies, jams, relishes, vegetables and plants for sale.

Other activities will include raffles of handmade quilts from parishioners and local artisans, and themed gift baskets, featuring local goods and artisan work. Handmade quilts from parishioners and local artisans will be available for purchase, from 9 to 9:30 a.m., for \$600 each.

Also featured will be live music by Sweetwater Band from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. An organ concert by Nolan Snyder, a graduate of Indiana University Jacobs School of Music, will begin at 11 a.m. Guided tours of the historic church, which is listed on the National Register of Historic Places, will be at 12 p.m. and 1 p.m. The oak case organ features 10 ranks, 535 pipes, two manuals with 58 keys, and pedals with 25 keys, built and installed in 1898 by Edmund Giesecke of Evansville, IN.

The picnic will conclude with raffle drawings and a reading of the picnic sponsors and the Picnic Honor Roll. You must be at least 18 years old to enter the drawings, and you need not be present to win. Cash prizes are mailed within 10 business days.

Shuttle service, handicapped parking on the north side of the church, shaded grounds, and air-conditioned dining are available all day. An expanded area of covered outdoor seating will be set up on the south side of the parish center. Handicap-accessible seating is available at all dining locations.






Ignatius of Loyola

Sanctuary Lamp for July 30, 2023

The red luminary located near the tabernacle burns to remind us of the sacramental presence of Jesus Christ.

To view the list of scheduled luminaries or wish to have the luminary (sanctuary lamp) burning in memory of a loved one, to honor a special occasion or a particular intention, an envelope is included in the monthly envelope packet.





Sacraments

Dear Padre,

What is spiritual Communion?

Saint Thomas Aquinas said spiritual Communion is “an ardent desire to receive Jesus in the Most Holy Sacrament”...and to lovingly embrace “Him as if we had actually received Him.” It is the practice of desiring union with Christ in the Eucharist by those who cannot receive holy Communion for valid cause, such as an infirmity or an irregular marriage. During the COVID-19 pandemic, Pope Francis also said the practice is “highly recommended when it is not possible to receive the sacrament.”

A prayer by St. Alphonsus Liguori is ideal for those unable to receive holy Communion:

*My Jesus,
I believe that you are present in the Most Blessed Sacrament.
I love you above all things, and I desire to receive you into my soul.
Since I cannot now receive you sacramentally,
come at least spiritually into my heart.
I embrace you as if you were already there and I unite myself wholly to you.
Never permit me to be separated from you. Amen.*

Saint John Paul II wrote, “It is good to cultivate in our hearts a constant desire for the sacrament of the Eucharist. This was the origin of the practice of ‘spiritual Communion,’ which has happily been established in the Church for centuries and recommended by saints....Saint Teresa of Jesus wrote: ‘When you do not receive Communion and you do not attend Mass, you can make a spiritual Communion, which is a most beneficial practice; by it the love of God will be greatly impressed on you’” (*Ecclesia de Eucharistia*, 34). ●
