

uman beings grow and mature at different paces. Turning twenty-one is no marker of maturity. We've all known the ten-year-old whom people say is already an old man because of how he thinks and acts. Just as surely, we've known the forty-year-old who still acts and dresses like a teenager. If this is true with human growth, would it not be true as well with growth in faith?

This Sunday's parable of the landowner who pays all his laborers the same even though they have not all worked the same amount of time often sparks the comment that it's not good business sense. But the parable is not about business. It's about how we all come to faith at different times in life, all according to God's plan, not ours. Why then do some complain about deathbed conversions as being unfair? Who's to say when someone finally catches up to God's love and goodness? Too often human wisdom and divine wisdom spin in different worlds.

Pope Benedict XVI once commented on this Gospel's wisdom and how we should be patient with young people as they seek the sacraments. Jesus was patient with us, he said, so we should follow his lead. Federico Lombardi, SJ, the Vatican spokesman for Pope Benedict, reported that the pope had commented, "I used to be more strict about this, but the example of Christ led me to become more welcoming in cases in which, perhaps, there is not a mature and solid faith, but there is a glimmer, a desire of communion with the Church."

When did you want to be first, but did not get to be? Name something positive about being last or putting others first.

Congratulations to the parishioners of St. Meinrad Parish for a spirit-filled and well-planned annual picnic. Thanks to the Fall Picnic Leadership Team, parish staff and countless volunteers for all your preparation leading up to the 2023 Picnic. In reviewing my calendar, our first meeting was just a few weeks after the 2022 Picnic to prepare for Sunday's celebration of Faith and Heritage. Thanks to all picnic patrons and sponsors. Time and again, we may hear a phrase that when used in context makes sense and when out of context leaves us in greater wonder and possible frustration. For me, one of these statements is, "Many hands make light work."

For us to understand this and to hold value to this idea, we must think about what we have experienced "as many hands make light work" as it relates to the group and its end goal. Using John the Baptist as a model, he explained that he must decrease so that the one (Jesus) to follow could increase.

The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* teaches: "The economy of law and grace turns men's hearts away from avarice and envy. It initiates them into desire for the Sovereign Good; it instructs them in the desires of the Holy Spirit who satisfies man's heart.

The God of the promises always warned man against seduction by what from the beginning has seemed 'good for food . . . a delight to the eyes . . to be desired to make one wise'." (CCC 2541)

In today's parable, the tension among the workers is their belief that they are entitled to something more than what had been negotiated. What was negotiated? Can you name it? As a leader, no matter the context, whether serving on a committee or serving as pastor, it is important to review the organization's mission, making sure the organization's values and goals are not being compromised as human and financial resource are being tapped. If it is within the scope of the organization, then what is discerned and negotiated as a group will allow the group to respond to the need to, above all, to glorify God and to encounter Christ through the grace and gift of the Holy SpirA rote sense of planning takes place, leaning into the way of the past without considering the signs of the times. When this sense of leadership and planning occurs, the defined leaders and followers cannot support the collective group's mission, vision and goal. To fear change is to fear the gift of discernment and the fruits of discernment that allow families and organizations, big and small, to respond to the signs of the time freely and organically.

All of us have gifts and talents to share. In sharing these gifts and talents, we must be open to the roles and responsibilities needed to achieve what we set out to accomplish. If we discern well what the common values are, the goals and needs organically manifest, leading all to achieve a sense of success when doing our part.

In Palestine, the grape harvest will happen whether the people are ready or not. At the first reading of this parable, there seems to be a great offense to those who have put in their time – over the years or on the day of the harvest. The landowner seems to be unfair when viewed through our preconceived ideas of fairness and equality.

When taking a closer look at the parable, the landowner paid on the terms that were negotiated. The landowner is justice in this situation, giving those who worked in the field a full day their due pay while also giving those who worked only a single hour also a full day's wage. No one is cheated; all have received in abundance what seems to be a justifiable wage.

We can compare the landowner's response to this situation in the same way we would expect God to respond when it comes to His sharing love and mercy. In the parable, Jesus brings to light the hard truth that those who complain look foolish.

The parable here helps us understand that God owes us nothing, yet He offers abundantly and equally. There is great comfort in knowing this fact. Yet, we are tempted to think that our actions are greater than those of the whole, even when we're not open to knowing what the desired goal is for today. We may think that our actions deserve a greater reward or acknowledgment than that of our peers or the group as a whole.

This leaves us with the hard truth that we can lead to lead, or we can lead to meet a need. When needs are not grounded in goals that come from defined values, we lead on our own terms, often concluding that our actions deserve more, more of God's attention, than those of another individual's self-sacrifice or bending of the will that allows for great goods to manifest when responding to the signs of the times.

When we respond to life situations with only what we know and not with a discerning mind and heart, we may find ourselves coming in short of the goals, as we are blinded by our own assumptions and that allows us to make our judgments and the judgments of the group from appearance alone.

Let us continue to pray for one another and especially for those who have asked us to pray for their special intentions and for those listed on our Pray-





The red luminary located near the tabernacle burns to remind us of the sacramental presence of Jesus Christ.





Sacraments

Dear Padre,

When can I take photographs in church? During my niece's baptism, I was told to put my camera away. We have a confirmation and a wedding coming up, and I don't want to get in trouble again.

Reverence and courtesy are the issues here. Reverence keeps in mind that what is real about baptism and all the sacraments does not come out in photos. Courtesy notes that other folks are trying to enter into the awe and joy of the mystery, and people taking photographs can get in the way or distract.

Parishes differ in rules and regulations. Many parishes prohibit

the taking of pictures. Certainly taking flash pictures is annoying in a way that taking available-light photos is not. But even with nonflash pictures, the photographer is trying to get around people and into a good spot.

Weddings call for photos from approved photographers. In most United States cultures, photos at funeral Masses are out of place. However, there are exceptions, such as the situation of an infirm woman who was unable to attend her sister's funeral. She was extremely upset until her niece thought to record it with her phone. The pastor had no problem with this solution.

No matter what the situation, it is always best to check with the parish office before the event. If it is permitted, get a few good pictures and then be sure to close your eyes in prayer so you can see what is really going on.
