onfronted by a social obligation I would prefer to avoid, I frequently find myself musing that the timing is right for me to break a leg or get the flu. Yet more often than not, once I go, I find myself enjoying the gathering. Not all invitations are exciting or even desirable, but many become the building blocks of our lives.

When the parable of Jesus tells of an invitation to come to a wedding feast, it's really a story of our invitation to the kingdom of heaven, where, if we accept, we will dwell in the divine presence and enjoy the peace, joy, and love of God. Heaven is not only where we are but also how we are. It's an invitation to deeper and richer life—a taste of heaven, even in this life.

So it's good to consider going where we'd rather not

go. It's not simply about social gatherings, though a social gathering may be the event where you meet the person you fall in love with. It also may mean going for counseling when that may be a bit scary, or confronting one's addiction, or moving to a new city, or accepting serious and lifelong illness, or saying yes to having a child with special needs, or not getting the job you hoped for. Saying yes to what life brings may be the wedding garment that enriches our lives. It may be saying yes to God.

How are we responsible for Creation Mt 21:33-43 and One Another?

F3 Question of the Week

F3 Families and Caregivers, remember to view The Gospel for All Ages on page 6 of the weekly bulletin to learn more about today's Gospel passage through Scripture and Tradi-

This page features questions from this week's student session where your student, their catechists and classmates have learned more about their Catholic faith.

Also, the Family Corner briefly describes the gospel and helps us understand how Scripture and Tradition define us as a Church. I encourage each of you to continue to learn more about your faith as a family and together to pray the Family Prayer and take the weekly challenge inspired by the Question of the Week.

How is God like the owner of the vineyard? How do you care for the things and people you love?

Today's Gospel is a continuation of last Sunday's Gospel, focusing on our call to obey God's will. In Matthew 21:28-32, Jesus shared a parable about a son who, after having second thoughts about his father's request, obeys him. This parable helps us understand that, even as sinners striving to be saints, once we repent and are sincerely in search of God and uncover his love and mercy, we too, will be saved. As we listen to today's parable in Matthew 21:33-43, Jesus introduces a character, the vineyard owner. In this parable, salvation is offered to all. However, those who reject Christ are turning him over to the whole world. The vineyard, therefore, is leased by others, allowing the Kingdom of God to produce fruit.

As disciples, we are called to bear fruit through our life in Christ. Through our Baptism, we must believe that the salvific work of God encountered in the sacraments highlights his confidence in us, his creation. The parable helps us understand that God trusts us, has patience with us, and has an expectation for us to bear fruit through the gifts we have been given in our life. As the vineyard was equipped with everything, so too, are we through Christ, with Him and in Him in the unity of the Holy Spirit as members of the Body of Christ, the Church.

In our first reading today, Isaiah 5:1-7, the prophet uses a similar story about a vineyard, illustrating how the Lord respects his people. The well-cultivated vineyard that does not produce fruit demonstrates the vineyard of the Lord, the house of Israel and the people of Judah, his cherished people, plants of the vineyard.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches: "At all times and in every race, anyone who fears God and does what is right has been acceptable to him. He has, however, willed to make men holy and save them, not as individuals without any bond or link between them, but rather to make them into a people who might acknowledge him and serve him in holiness. He therefore chose the Israelite race to be his own people and established a covenant with it. He gradually instructed this people. ... All these things, however, happened as a preparation for and figure of that new and perfect covenant which was to be ratified in Christ ... the New Covenant in his blood; he called together a race made up of Jews and Gentiles which would be one, not according to the flesh, but in the Spirit." (CCC 781)

Throughout October, the Catholic Church in the United States celebrates Respect Life Month, and the first Sunday of October is designated as Respect Life Sunday. Thanks to all for supporting these annual observances. Donations support the mission and ministry of the local agencies we emphasize throughout this month.



Dear Padre,

My prayer-group leader is encouraging us to write our own prayers for our meetings. Don't you need some formal religious training to write prayers? Will our prayers count?

It's given to every human being to be able to pray. On the level of the spiritual life, prayer is as basic as breathing is to physical life. Everyone at every moment has the grace to say a prayer.

Sometimes I ask people, "Do you pray?" At times they tell me they don't. Then I ask them, "Well, do you talk with God?" And most answer, "Of course." That's praying.



When writing your prayers, I suggest you use this ancient definition as inspiration: Prayer is the raising of the mind and heart to God. I'm sure your prayers will be that in word and feeling, and they will count.

When writing more formal prayers, it's nice to include the prayer elements the Church considers important: adoration of God, contrition and sorrow for sin, thanksgiving for life and for God's care of us in good times and bad, and petition for what we desperately need in our poverty. And for you, a final word. Remember that no matter how bad things may get, no matter how out of control things feel, you always have the gift and power of saying a prayer. Especially in time of temptation—when things really go bad—ask Mary your Mother to pray with you.
