When Water Becomes Wine

FR. JOSEPH JUKNIALIS

or all of us, at one time or another, life seems to run out of wine. We look at our relationships and find ourselves saying, "There's no more wine." It may be a friendship of five years or a marriage of twenty-five years, but, for some, the wine runs out. For others, it is the job that loses its challenge. Or, one day, the foreman gathers everyone to announce that the plant is closing. In a moment, all has turned into vinegar; there is no more wine. For others still, it is when retirement suffocates the future, choking all that once gave meaning.

However, there are also those times when hope is reborn, when we feel "espoused" not only by life but also by God, when the ordinary turns extraordinary—and the water becomes wine. It is the phone call offering a new job after we have collected unemployment checks for months. It is falling in love when we have given up on the notion. It is conceiving a child after years of barren waiting. It is someone who listens, finally, when no one else would. It is at times like these—and many others as well—when we are caught off-balance and trip into God unwittingly, saved from drudgery and redeemed to live a life enriched, when water is turned into wine. It is a deeply felt joy that reveals God's presence. •





F3 Question of the Week

F3 Families and Caregivers, please read *The Gospel for All Ages* on **page 7** of the bulletin to learn more about next week's Gospel.

This page features questions from this week's student session, where your student learned more about their Catholic faith.

I encourage you to continue to learn about your faith as a family and together pray the Family Prayer and take the weekly challenge.

Do you ever doubt what Jesus said or did? How do you handle this doubt?

Another week filled with awe and wonder, as we make our way through the mid-January forecast. It has been a few years since we have had steady winter-like conditions. As I mentioned last week, the Holy Father's prayer intention for January is for all to have "the right to an education." While you and I likely take this for granted, the school districts in our area have been challenged to begin the spring semester due to the unusually lengthy period of snow and ice so far this month. Snow days are fun and can build community. I have great memories of snow days. However, those days of stability spent learning in a classroom provide intellectual and social growth for the next generation to become our local, state, and national leaders and faithful citizens. Let us pray that Pope Francis' intention takes hold in the local church of central and southern Indiana and in the greater communities we call home! I was surprised at how this resonated with

I was surprised at how this resonated with others. I was happy to receive the in person and written comments on this topic when first introduced in a recent post a few weeks ago by parishioners and others from our community. I even received a phone call from a local school board member requesting permission for my comments to be shared with others. You never know who is reading the bulletin! Two attributes of rural life, the tactile or tangible experience of faith

through nature and the stability of time and tradition, are part of the Church's gifts, of which we must be stewards.

Even when there are interruptions, it takes time to begin to understand unfamiliar and new ideas before we can adapt. The same goes for Jesus, whose glory was revealed at the wedding feast at Cana. Through the conditioning of Hollywood, perhaps The Hallmark Channel, we associate the glory of God being revealed as something beyond our reach with lights so bright it's impossible to know what to look for and dare to approach. In today's Gospel, we see how the revelation of God and the word of Jesus bring life to any situation. What we see today revealed in sacred scripture is the conventional archetype presented through a particular relationship. Here it is the relationship between Jesus and his mother. As Mary's vocation is first defined as a woman and mother, her vocation as the first disciple of lesus is equally marked and embodied at a specific time and place. The word of Jesus and the revelation of God manifests the covenant between these two agents. In Jesus turning water into wine, people experience God's covenant through basic elements, water, through Jesus' words, and the revelation of God, changes into wine. God's covenant is revealed through Mary at that particular time and place.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church explains that "The sign of water turned into wine at Cana already announces the Hour of Jesus' glorification. It makes manifest the fulfillment of the wedding feast in the Father's kingdom, where the faithful will drink the new wine that has become the Blood of Christ" (CCC, 1335).

As Jesus' glory is revealed through water being changed to wine, we too are invited daily to experience the awe and wonder in our lives, the glory of God revealed in the tangible signs surrounding us, particularly in the Eucharist. Each time we gather for Mass and hear the words of Jesus given to us at the Last Supper, the first Mass, Christ's words and the revelation of God revealed, at this time and in this place, manifest before us the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Christ on the altar for us to receive in faith as we participate in the Communion Procession at every Mass we are present for. Another reminder of our participation as members of the Pilgrim Church on Earth - making our

Blessing of Throats Will Take Place at Masses on February 1-3



Since the local custom is to transfer the Feast of St. Blaise, bishop and martyr, to the Sunday closest to or on February 3, blessing of the throats will be offered after all weekend Masses on February 1 and 2. Blessing of throats also will be offered at daily Mass on Monday, the actual feast day.

Those wishing to participate in this

sacramental celebration can get in line as if receiving Communion. The infirm and individuals needing assistance seated in the first two rows will receive the blessing first. 



Beginning February 1, here's how to get your statement:

- 1. Sign in to your Realm site, using the RealmConnect smartphone app or visit OnRealm.org.
- 2. Click Giving in the main menu.
- 3. Click Contribution Statement for the current year.
- 4. Click Print. A preview of your statement will display.
- 5. Click the printer icon for a physical copy or Download for a PDF.
- 6. If you need assistance, type "leave a message" in the search box of the parish website and fill out the form so you can receive another invitation to your account.

I invite you to take advantage of this online resource, which is another way to be a good steward of our parish's financial resources (eliminates printing and mailing costs). These statements will be available to every parishioner, benefactor and business that supports the mission and ministry of our parishes of St. Boniface and

St. Meinrad throughout the year. Your gifts may be through Sunday stewardship offerings, memorial gifts in memory or in honor of an individual or a family, bereavement gifts, annual programs and appeals, and picnic sponsorship.

Last year, St. Boniface mailed 1,647 (\$1,119.96 in postage alone) and St. Meinrad mailed 1,324 (\$932 in postage) giving statements using the necessary resources of paper, envelopes, and stamps. To protect your privacy, the weekly volunteers working in the Parish Office do not process or handle this information. The resource of the cost of labor hours also must be added to the equation to see what we can do together as stewards of God's grace by using this online resource.

Parishioners who do not have an email account on record on January 31, 2025, will receive a giving statement via the U.S. Postal Service, as well as parishioners whose primary address is at a long-term care center. All other requests to receive a mailed giving statement are to be received in writing by February 5, 2025. 


Dear Padre,

Is there a year of John? I know we're now in the year of Luke, next year will be the year of Matthew, and the following year will be the year of Mark. Then the cycle starts over with Luke. Why doesn't John have a year?

Matthew, Mark, and Luke, collectively known as the synoptic gospels, are narrative gospels. Together, they tell the story of Jesus of Nazareth. Although in some ways they might be understood synoptically, "the same," each narrative is unique in its emphasis. The Church desires that we hear these narratives and be nourished through the proclamation of the early memories of the Christian community.

John's Gospel, on the other hand, is not primarily a narrative, but is best understood as theological. As such, it is highly dependent on the use of symbolic representations to make the point it intends. For example, "I am the light of the world.



Whoever follows me...will have the light of life" (John 8:12). The interplay between light and darkness illustrates the point. John's Gospel is intended to be experienced and engaged in as "bigger than life," proposing and celebrating Christian themes that are life-giving and inviting. Therefore, we hear John's Gospel when the Church celebrates the mystery of the saving life and resurrection of Jesus. For this reason, the Gospel of John is proclaimed on Good Friday, during the Easter season, and on other major feasts.
