

ome people find love in their lives; others complain of loneliness. Some find peace, while others seem to be perpetually angry. Some live comfortably amid human diversity, yet others insist that the rest of the world be like them. There are those who are able to forgive and compromise and offer compassion and those who cannot. The difference seems to be the ability to forgo one's own desires for the sake of a greater good or the common good. Such may be the narrow gate through which some may not be strong enough to enter.

Phrases like *the kingdom of God* or *the kingdom of heaven* are not just references to places to which we go

but also ways of being or states of existence. They all refer to God's presence, to life with God. You've heard people say they were so happy that they felt it was like heaven on earth. It wasn't a place they went but an experience of being filled with joy and peace. It's pure gift. No one ever finds it by focusing on oneself. It is the narrow gate by which we find our way into such a life. It is the doorway of caring for others.

PREPARING FOR SACRAMENTS/SACRAMENTAL EMERGENCY

Parishioners seeking sacraments should visit the Sacraments tab on our website to begin enrollment and required preparation. To access this information, enter "sacraments" in the search feature at sbcatholic.church or smcatholic.church.

Baptism Preparation: Families seeking baptism should contact Jessica Fischer, Evangelization and Discipleship Coordinator, to schedule preparation and formation sessions at least two months before the child's birth.

Marriage Preparation: Couples wishing to marry at St. Boniface or St. Meinrad churches must contact Jessica Fischer, Evangelization and Discipleship Coordinator, at least six months before their wedding date to arrange marriage preparation and formation sessions. At least one person in the couple must have been a parishioner for one year.

Anointing of the Sick: Contact the Parish Office to request a priest for this sacrament of healing. If you require a priest due to severe illness or danger of death, please call 812-357-6600. Be prepared to provide your name, location and contact information. The priest on call will respond as soon as possible.

Families should use this number immediately when a loved one is admitted to an area hospital, long-term care center or hospice. Hospital, long-term care and hospice chaplains do not always contact the Parish Office promptly, which can leave parishioners and families without needed parish-based pastoral care or the Last Sacraments.


The Confessions of St. Augustine | Littlest Saints

"For behold, some are last who will be first and some are first who will be last."

Luke 13:30

Our cultural standards are different from God's standards. We often rank people by what they have, how powerful they are, or how successful they are. Jesus reminds us that God will not judge us by the same earthly standards. When God asks you, "What have you done with the gifts I have given you?" how will you respond?

The Wide Invitation of God: The Narrow Door of Discipleship

Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time, C

Luke 13:22-30 CCC 521

od's kingdom extends a universal invitation to all nations and peoples, yet entering requires our wholehearted, personal response demonstrated through the narrow door of discipleship.

As we gather in word and sacrament on this 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time, Sacred Scripture and Sacred Tradition both call us to embrace the expansive vision of God's allencompassing love and the demanding path of authentic discipleship that transforms belief into action.

Sacred Scripture — Catholic Faith

Today's readings reveal a creative tension between God's universal call and the challenge of discipleship. The prophet Isaiah shares God's plan to "gather all nations and tongues" to see His glory—a grand invitation extending far beyond Israel. The prophet envisions foreigners becoming priests and Levites, roles once held only by God's chosen people. This bold inclusion challenges our conventional thinking about who belongs in God's kingdom.

The Gospel reading from Luke initially seems to contradict Isaiah's expansive vision. Jesus speaks of a narrow door and warns that "many will attempt to enter but will not be strong enough." Yet this isn't a contradiction—it's a clarification. God's invitation is indeed universal, but entrance

requires genuine commitment, not casual interest.

The Letter to the Hebrews reminds us that "those whom the Lord loves, he disciplines." This divine discipline isn't punishment but formation, preparing us for the narrow door that leads to eternal life.

Sacred Tradition — Catholic Life

The Catholic tradition has always held these two truths in creative tension. The *Catechism* teaches us that Christ died for all humanity, yet also emphasizes the necessity of personal conversion and perseverance. Our tradition recognizes that while God desires all to be saved, we must cooperate with his grace through prayer, the sacramental life, especially found in the gift and mystery of the Holy Eucharist and responding to our baptismal vocation.

Our communion in the mysteries of Jesus Christ enables us to live in Him all that He Himself lived, and He lives it in us. As the *Catechism* states:

By his Incarnation, he, the Son of God, has in a certain way united himself with each man. We are called only to become one with him, for he enables us as the members of his Body to share in what he lived for us in his flesh as our model: We must continue to accomplish in ourselves the stages of Jesus' life and his mysteries and often to beg him to perfect and realize them in us and in his whole Church... For it is the plan of the Son of God to make us and the whole Church partake in his mysteries and to extend them to and continue them in us and in his whole Church. This is his plan for fulfilling his mysteries in us. (CCC, 521)

St. Augustine captured this powerfully: "God created us without us, but he will not save us without us." We cannot earn our salvation, but neither can we remain passive recipients. The narrow door requires our active participation in the life of grace.

Our Catholic Faith — From Belief to Action

"Faith without works is dead," as St. James reminds us (James 2:26). Today's readings challenge us to move beyond comfortable belief to transformative action. Like the foreigners in Isaiah who become messengers of God's glory, we too are called to share what we have received.

The narrow door isn't narrow because God

is exclusive—it's narrow because it demands everything from us. It requires dying to self, taking up our cross, and following Christ even when it's difficult. This path transforms not just our eternal destiny but our present reality.

When Jesus says, "I am the way, the truth, and the life" (John 14:6), He's not limiting access but clarifying the method and defining the tools for discipleship—tools readily available and accessible through the Church, through Jesus who we believe to be present in the Church. Through Him, the narrow door becomes navigable, the burden becomes light, and the impossible becomes possible.

Living Your Faith — Transforming Community Through Catholic Values

Our response to God's universal call must be both personal and communal. We cannot simply worry about our own salvation while ignoring our parish family and the wider world. Isaiah's vision shows us that those who encounter God's glory immediately become missionaries to others.

In practical terms, this means embracing the Catholic Social Teaching on Immigration and the Movement of Peoples:

Welcoming the stranger, recognizing that God calls people from "east and west" to his kingdom

Sharing our faith with gentleness and respect, becoming missionaries within our parish family and beyond

Building bridges across cultural and social divides, remembering that God makes no distinction between insider and outsider

Persevering in prayer and worship through daily prayer and reflection, gathering and participating in Eucharistic prayer and worship, actively receiving the sacraments—positioning ourselves to allow God's discipline and respond to our call to active discipleship, forming us for service

Discerning our unique vocation, whether as parents, single persons, religious, or ordained ministers

How do you Live, Love and Teach the faith of Jesus Christ, the faith of the Church founded in 33 AD?

How do we Live, Love and Teach these values through the mission and ministry of our parish family?

The narrow door isn't meant to exclude but to ensure we're properly prepared for the feast of the kingdom. Like athletes training for competition or musicians practicing scales before a concert, we must be spiritually fit for the journey ahead. The discipline required isn't punishment but preparation for something magnificent.

With a Grateful Heart

As we reflect on today's Scripture readings, let us give thanks for God's expansive love that reaches across all boundaries of nation, language, and culture. Let us also be grateful for the clarity Christ provides about the path forward—challenging though it may be.

The same God who opens his arms to all nations also walks beside

The same God who opens his arms to all nations also walks beside us through the narrow door. He who disciplines us does so in love, preparing us not for punishment but for participation in His divine life

May we embrace both the width of God's invitation and the focus required for discipleship. May we be both welcoming to others and demanding of ourselves. And may we trust that the narrow door, though difficult, leads to the spacious kingdom where people from every nation gather at the eternal feast.

In responding to God's call, we discover that the narrow door isn't a constraint but a freedom, not a barrier but a breakthrough—freeing

us to become who God created us to be and empowering us to help others find their way home.

Dear Padre,

My wife mentioned that neither the Book of Mormon nor the Catholic Bible mentions purgatory. Please comment.

A not-uncommon frustration is when a person searches the Bible for a particular word or phrasing. Frankly, it is expecting too much from the religious text to be able to faithfully record a particular word or phrase that originated hundreds of years after the ancient text was composed. Purgatory is one such example of this frustration. The concept of purgatory is referenced in the biblical text, particularly in 2 Corinthians 5:10 and 7:1, Hebrews 9:27 and 12:14, and 2 Maccabees 12:46, but the word is never used.



This should come as no real surprise because it was not until the writings of St. Thomas Aquinas (1225–1274) that the concept was expanded and formed into a theological statement of belief that has become central to Roman Catholicism. And what is that belief? The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* is clear: "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified, are indeed assured of their eternal salvation; but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven. The Church gives the name purgatory to this final purification of the elect, which is entirely different from the punishment of the damned" (*CCC*, 1030, 1031a). The Book of Mormon never references purgatory, but it does speak about the afterlife and the experience of "waiting" in the spirit world for the completion of earthly time. •
