When Life Becomes Lose-Lose

here is so often a cost to being a follower of Jesus, to doing the right thing. During our country's Civil War, southern plantation owners came face to face with the gospel's imperative to accept slaves as human beings who have the right to be free, though that would then bring about the collapse of the cotton economy. For them, it was live the gospel or save the economy. Sometimes, the gospel seems to put us in a lose-lose situation.

President Lyndon B. Johnson was confronted by the Vietnam War. By continuing a war he knew was unwinnable, it would cost human lives. If he ended the war, he would be labeled as the president who lost a war. For him, it was lose-lose. Do the right thing or save face. A person may be confronted by a job that demands unjust and immoral decisions when the refusal to make such decisions would cost that person the job necessary to support his or her family. A student may be faced with the prospect of either cheating or receiving a poor grade. Living the gospel is fraught with costs.

Today, our nation faces the difficulties of immigration. On the one hand, there is the gospel's command to love the poor and so to accept immigrants seeking to escape violence and terror and drought, conditions that make it impossible to live. On the other hand, there is the need for our nation to deal with uncontrolled migration. The question of "What would Jesus do?" is never without consequences. •



Father Terence Kersch, CSB, Will Speak Next Weekend on Work and Mission of The Basilian Fathers

At the invitation of the Most Rev. Charles Thompson, and the Archdiocese of Indianapolis Mission Office, the Basilian Fathers Missions are grateful to Father Anthony Vinson, OSB, and the parishioners of St. Boniface and St. Meinrad parishes for hosting Reverend Terence Kersch, CSB, to celebrate Mass on

Saturday, September 6, and Sunday, September 7.

The Basilian Fathers Missions is a nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization founded by the Congregation of St. Basil (Basilian Fathers) serving underprivileged communities in Mexico and Colombia through education and Catholic

evangelization.

Our apostolate is

founded on the Basilian principles of goodness, discipline, and knowledge. These values have guided the cause of the Basilian Fathers Missions since the 1930s when Basilian priests first began ministering to migrant workers south and west of Houston, Texas.

In 1961, the Basilian Fathers Missions expanded into Mexico and



began a process of taking over at poor parishes, building them up, and giving them over to the local diocese for continued ministry. There is one

There is one parish where we have continued

working for almost 40 years: San Lorenzo (Saint Lawrence) in Tehuacán. We first started serving at San Lorenzo when it was a chapel of Divino Salvador in 1978. In 1987, it became a parish, and the Basilian Fathers were entrusted with it. We have served there ever since.

The Basilians have been blessed with young Mexican vocations to the priesthood. These men begin their Basilian journey in the

Novitiate in Tehuacán and then they move to the Basilian House of Studies (Scholasticate) in Mexico City to complete their university courses and their theological training.

Ongoing services provided through our mission in Mexico include spiritual direction, psychological counseling, assistance to students, legal aid, a medical clinic, clothing, shelter, toys, and school supplies. Recently, through the help of our donors, the Basilian Fathers founded the Betania (Bethany) Community Center in Tehuacán to help provide an after-school program for children who need food and a place to stay before their parents can come home from work.

Regarding our apostolate in Colombia, we presently serve in the cities of Medellín and Bogotá. In 1995, the **Basilian Fathers** established a presence in the city of Medellín by ministering in an area of town designated as a war zone by the authorities. In time, relative peace would be gradually restored. In 2023, the Archbishop of Bogotá entrusted the Basilians with the

administration of the parish of Nuestra Señora de Egipto (Our Lady of Egypt).

The church dates from the 17th century. Because of a shortage of diocesan clergy, the parish had been underserved for some time; only one Mass was celebrated on Sundays and the church was usually closed during the week. But now, with the Basilians, a new era of ministry has begun.

Religious formation in Colombia begins at Casa Annonay in Bogotá. It is here that our Novices begin to live Basilian community life. Some of our Scholastics (Seminarians), in the Basilian tradition, also serve as full-time teachers. Basilian Fathers are also helping to organize women's ministry in Colombia to share in our evangelization.

In 1822 the Congregation of St. Basil (Basilian Fathers) began a holy ministry of education and evangelization in Annonay,

France. We the continued support of new donors, together with our longtime patrons, may the Basilian Fathers continue to educate and evangelize in the Basilian tradition for years to come in Mexico and Colombia.



"Every one of you who does not renounce all his possessions cannot be my disciple."

Luke 14:33

When we first hear this statement, it seems that Jesus is making an unrealistic demand upon us. How can we renounce all of our possessions? We need them to live. However, what we must renounce is the belief that they belong to us. Everything that we have belongs to God alone. All of our resources are entrusted to us not only for our own use, but also so that we can help others. Once we renounce the idea that we possess or are entitled to anything, it is much easier to share the many gifts that God has given us. Then we truly are his disciples.

Personal Responsibility and Setting Priorities: Learning from Young Saints

Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, C Luke 14:25-33 CCC 459

oday's readings challenge us to examine our priorities and commitment to following Christ, while we celebrate the upcoming canonization of Blessed Carlo Acutis and Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati, two young saints who exemplified radical discipleship in their brief but powerful lives. On this Sunday, the Church invites us to consider the cost of discipleship through Scripture and the witness of two remarkable young men who chose Christ above all else, inspiring us to live with similar dedication and joy.

Sacred Scripture - Catholic Faith

In today's Gospel from Luke 14:25-33, Jesus presents us with challenging words about the cost of following Him. He speaks of carrying our cross and renouncing all possessions, reminding us that discipleship requires total commitment. The reading from Wisdom complements this message, acknowledging human limitations in

understanding God's will: "Who can know God's counsel, or who can conceive what the Lord intends?" Yet through the Holy Spirit, we are given wisdom to discern God's path.

The Responsorial Psalm echoes this theme of dependence on God: "In every age, O Lord, you have been our refuge." These readings prepare our hearts to understand that following Christ demands everything from us, but in return offers the greatest treasure — eternal life with God.

Jesus does not sugarcoat the demands of discipleship. He uses blunt imagery to emphasize that our love for Him must surpass all earthly attachments. This does not mean we abandon our families or responsibilities, but rather that Christ becomes the lens through which we view and live all our relationships.

Sacred Tradition - Catholic Life

The Catechism of the Catholic Church, paragraph 459, reminds us that "The Word became flesh to be our model of holiness." Christ calls us to learn from Him, to follow his example of self-sacrifice and love. This teaching comes alive in the witness of our soon-to-be saints, Carlo Acutis and Pier Giorgio Frassati, who embodied this call to holiness in their everyday lives.

Sacred tradition teaches us that sainthood is not reserved for extraordinary circumstances but can flourish in ordinary life when lived with extraordinary love. Both young men demonstrate how the Gospel can transform contemporary culture when lived authentically.

Our Catholic Faith - From Belief to Action

What an exciting day of the Church and the world, on September 7, Pope Leo will canonize Blessed Carlo Acutis and Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati together, marking a historic moment for the Church. Carlo Acutis, born May 3, 1991, died of leukemia at age 15 in 2006. He will become the first millennial saint, showing us that holiness is possible in the digital age.

Carlo was passionate about the Eucharist. Despite his love for video games and

technology, he was known to limit his gaming to one hour a week and used his skills to create a website documenting Eucharistic miracles. He never lost sight of his ultimate goal: heaven. He once said, "Everyone is



born as an original, but many people end up dying as photocopies." His life challenges us to remain authentic to our calling as Christians.

What makes Carlo particularly relevant to young people today is his ability to use technology for evangelization. As 26-year-old computer programmer Maria Roberts noted, Carlo shows us "how technology can be used for good and for evangelization." He demonstrates that we can embrace modern tools while maintaining deep spiritual roots.

Carlo's gentle nature and care for those who were bullied or struggling made him beloved by classmates. Father John LoCoco, nearly the same age as Carlo, initially felt unimpressed but came to admire Carlo's "profoundly quiet, honest sense of God's presence in all things."

Living Our Catholic Faith - Transforming Community Through Our Values

Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati, born in 1901 into a prominent Turin family, offers another model of young sainthood.

Despite his family's wealth and social position, Pier Giorgio dedicated himself to serving the poor through the St.

Vincent de Paul Society. A member of the Dominican Third Order, he combined deep spirituality with social action.

Pier Giorgio was known for his enthusiasm for life, love of mountain climbing, and complete faith in God. He persevered through academic struggles



while maintaining his commitment to helping others. At age 24, he contracted polio, possibly from someone he was assisting, and died in 1925.

Both saints show us that following Christ does not require abandoning joy or normal interests. Carlo enjoyed PlayStation and Pier Giorgio loved mountain climbing, yet both found ways to integrate their faith into every aspect of life. They remind us that the Gospel's demands, though challenging, lead to authentic happiness and fulfillment.

These young men understood what Jesus meant about counting the cost of discipleship. They chose Christ over comfort, service over self-interest, and eternal perspective over temporary pleasures.



Dear Padre,

Why is RCIA now called OCIA? And why do people have to go through that process anyway? Can't they just talk to the priest if they want to be Catholic?

The reason why Christian Initiation for Adults is now identified as the "Order" rather than the "Rite" is that the US Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) changed the name in November 2021. The name change more accurately reflects the English translations of the Latin texts and emphasizes the ongoing development of participants in the faith. Within the Order are different rites, such as the Rite of Entrance to the Catechumenate, the Rite of Sending, the Rite of Election, the Scrutinies, and the Rites of Initiation.



Although it is still possible to become a baptized Catholic or a confirmed Catholic after a simple conversation with a priest or a catechist, the preferred way is the communal encounter. The Christian community plays an important role in calling us to faith, enabling our practice of the faith, and helping us persevere in our baptismal call to faith. We are not alone; we are part of the people of God. We are the community that is called into life by the Spirit of God and that is nourished by the Eucharist we share and the sacraments we celebrate. •
