

SUMMER SCRIPTURE SERIES

This series is introductory and will show the learner how the Bible is organized and highlight the main ideas of each section.



Session 1: The Law — God teaches His covenant

This session helps learners see that the Old Testament “Law” (Torah) is not only a set of rules; it’s God’s gift to form a covenant relationship—so His people can live in justice and holiness.

Session 2: Israel’s History — God works through real people

This session shows that God is faithful through messy history: people choose faithfulness and also fail—yet God continues to preserve His people, especially in hardship. It also highlights courage under persecution in the Maccabean period.



Session 3: Wisdom & Poetry — Learning how to pray and live

This session teaches how Scripture gives us a “school of the heart”: learning to pray, to think wisely, to endure suffering faithfully, and to understand love and virtue in light of God.

Session 4: The Prophets — God calls His people to conversion

This session helps learners understand why prophets “sound harsh” and why their message always contains hope: warnings are meant to bring people back, because God’s intention is restoration.



Session 5: The New Testament — Jesus, the Church, and the final hope

This session explains the New Testament as a unified story: Jesus fulfills God’s promise, the Holy Spirit guides the Church in Acts, letters teach Christian life, and Revelation describes God’s victory and the fulfillment of history.
