- Frank Pease made a motion for the St. Thomas Council to reimburse Matt Pettine to cover his \$130 fee to cover his Serve Safe Certification. Rob Martin seconded the motion. There was no discussion,. The motion passed.

#### **Lecturer Presentation**

Brother Jerome Lessard delivered a presentation on *Christ in Crisis*, a book by Jim Wallis.

- Jim Wallis is an iconic Christian activist, preacher, justice advocate and a globally respected writer of 12 books. Jim is also the founding editor of Sojourners magazine and a teacher of ethics in public life at Harvard anbd Georgetown Universities.
- Major points outlined in the book include:
  - Jesus is the answer humanity is seeking.
  - b. We need to reclaim Jesus and his way of life.
  - c. We need to close the gap between Jesus and Christian and thus help save the soul of our nation.
