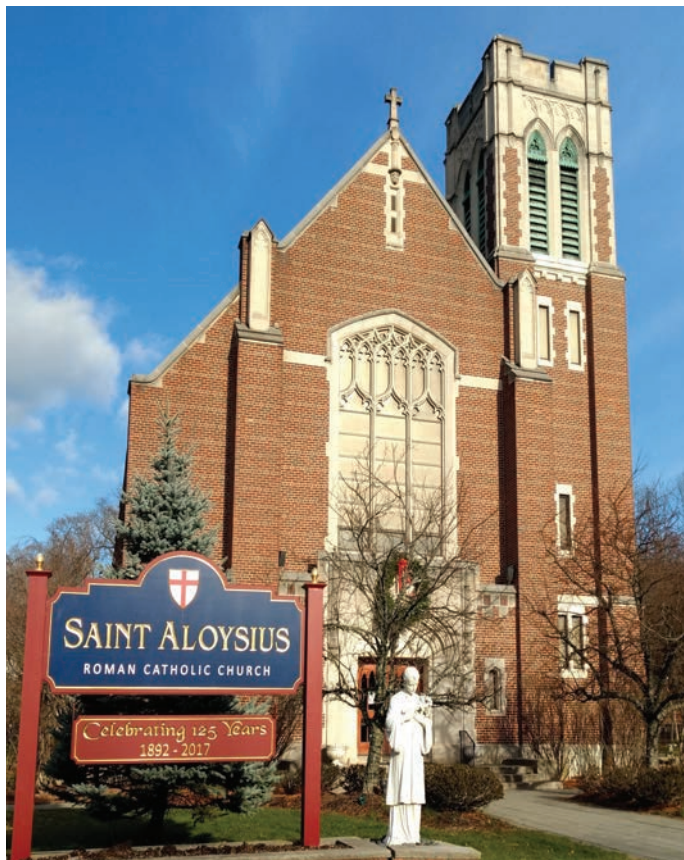

Dear Parishioner,

The month of August is truly magnificent! Not only because of the most beautiful weather of the year enjoyed in this month, but also because the Church celebrates great Marian feasts and the great saints of our history. August is also the month dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The veneration of the Heart of Mary is analogous to that of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. There are, however, differences as the devotion to the Heart of Jesus is directed to the "Divine Heart" as overflowing with love for all humanity. In devotion to Mary's Immaculate Heart the attraction is the love of her heart for Jesus and for God the Father. The second difference is the nature of the devotion itself: in the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, we adore Love responding to love, in the devotion to the Heart of Mary, study and imitation are the focus in order to learn how to love. The goal of this devotion is to unite humanity to God through the Immaculate Heart of Mary, and this process involves consecration and reparation. In this way we will better love God and Jesus by uniting ourselves to Mary and by imitating her virtues. During this month Jesus in His Word invites us to change our logic and to enter into the logic of God. A privileged time for conversion. Jesus invites us to come away and rest. It is therefore normal to want to take a vacation. But the heart of the rest that Jesus proposes is not in distraction, it is in attentive listening to the Word of God, prayer, and contemplation, just as Our Lady lived while on earth. True freedom is in God and true rest is in Jesus Christ. He is the true Sun who comes to visit us and restore us, and the Heart of Mary shows us just how to do that.

- Cradle Catholics interested in learning more about our faith.

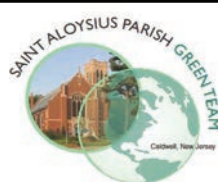

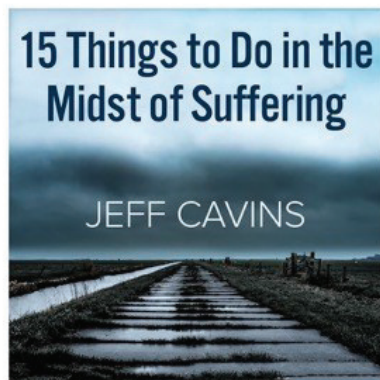

Durante este mes Jesús por su Palabra nos invita a cambiar nuestra lógica y a entrar en la lógica de Dios. Es un tiempo privilegiado para la conversión. Jesús nos invita a apartarnos para descansar. Por lo tanto, es normal querer tomarse unas vacaciones. Pero el corazón del descanso que propone Jesús no está en la distracción, está en la escucha atenta de la Palabra de Dios, en la oración, en la contemplación, como vivió la Santísima Virgen en la tierra. La verdadera libertad está en Dios y el verdadero descanso está en Jesucristo. Él es el verdadero Sol que viene a visitarnos y restaurarnos, y el Corazón de María nos muestra cómo hacerlo.

REMINDER: Eucharistic Adoration has been suspended for the summer. Adoration will resume Sept 12.

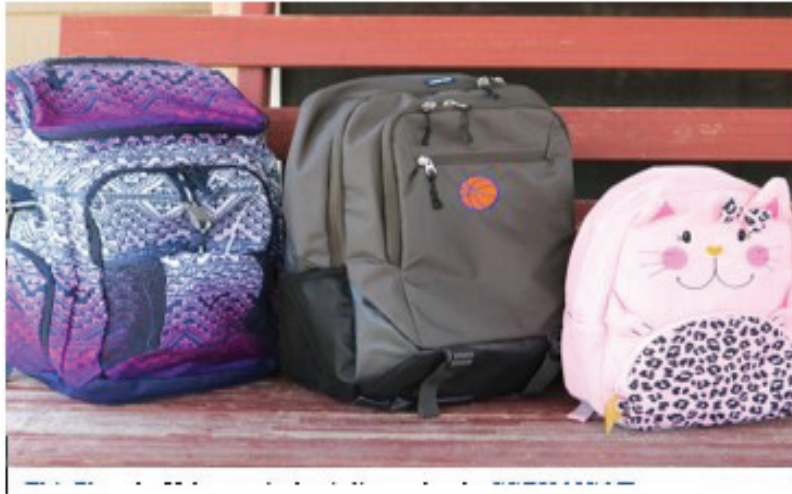
Meatloaf Saturdays

August 21 and 28 – school supplies

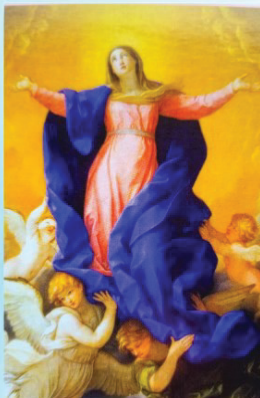

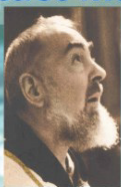

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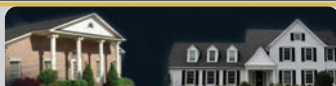
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
