## THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM





## REFLECTION EASTER SUNDAY

Do you put God first in all things? Possessions, money, power, ego can easily become gods to many of us. Do a quick check of what is important to you. Is God at the very top of the list? If not, your priorities need to be re-adjusted. Don't let earthly things become a god before God. This is also the first commandment – I am the Lord your God, you shall not have any strange gods before me.



Dear Parishioner,

*"Do not be afraid! I know that you are seeking Jesus the crucified. He is not here, for he has been raised just as he said." Matthew 28:5-6*

Today we celebrate the holiest day of the year, the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead – an event that defies logic and challenges our imagination, while offering us hope that all will be transformed. New life occurs in the bursting of life from death. By overcoming death, our Lord opened the way. As Pope Francis reminds us, *"It is the resurrection itself that opens us to greater hope, because it opens our life and the life of the world to God's eternal future, to full happiness, to certainty that evil, sin and death can be overcome"*. Who can guide us better than Saint Mary Magdalen? With the other women, she dared to visit the tomb while it was still dark. It was she who ran and told the disciples what she had seen, even though she did not understand the meaning. Through her tears, she met the risen Jesus who called her by name. As the first apostle of the Resurrection, Mary Magdalen challenges us not to be afraid to go to the tomb, even to "remain" there in our ignorance, but afterwards to go and proclaim the Good News. This awesome historical event can not be kept to ourselves or within our churches. It must be proclaimed to a world that seeks Truth in the midst of confusion and darkness. May this season of Easter, which we will celebrate for the next 50 days, renew in us a love and belief in the Risen Christ and inspire us to sing to Our Lady: *Queen of Heaven, rejoice, Alleluia! For He whom you did merit to bear, Alleluia! Has risen, as He said, Alleluia! Pray for us to God, Alleluia! Rejoice and be glad, O Virgin Mary, Alleluia! For the Lord has truly risen, Alleluia!*

I wish you all a most blessed, happy, and holy Easter!



### Recovering the Full Celebration of the Liturgy Receiving the Blood of Christ



In the Gospel of Matthew, at the Last Supper, Jesus specifically commanded his disciples to “eat” and “drink” his Body and Blood. This command is at the heart of all of our worship—the Liturgy of the Eucharist. Jesus gave his Body and Blood to be consumed. In the Gospel of John, Jesus taught: *“Unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you”* (6:53).

Because of concerns about sharing the chalice during the pandemic, the Archdiocese of Newark, like many others, placed a moratorium on its distribution for the assembly. It was reserved to the clergy who are obligated (for validity) to receive the Blood of Christ at every Mass.

Communion from the chalice is being restored now, so that all may have the opportunity to participate more fully in the celebration of the Eucharist. The church rightly teaches that whoever receives Communion under only one kind receives the whole Christ, *“Body and Blood, soul and divinity,”* since the living Lord is totally and completely present in each of the species. However, it also states that *“Holy Communion has a fuller form as a sign when it takes place under both kinds”* (GIRM, 281).

Beginning as early as the Evening Mass of the Lord’s Supper on Holy Thursday, April 6, 2023, but no later than Pentecost Sunday, May 28, 2023, parishes across the Archdiocese of Newark will once again begin offering the Blood of Christ at Mass. This will allow all parishioners to respond to Jesus’ command to eat and drink at their own level of comfort.

*“The consecrated host may be received either on the tongue or in the hand, at the discretion of each communicant”* (GIRM, 160).

Saint Paul wrote, *“As often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the death of the Lord until he comes”* (1 Cor 11:26). Eating and drinking the Body and Blood of the Lord fulfills his Last Supper command, commemorates his sacrifice on the Cross, and moves believers into a deeper participation in the Eucharist.

Hoy celebramos el día más sagrado del año, la resurrección de Jesucristo de entre los muertos, un evento que desafía la lógica y desafía nuestra imaginación, mientras nos ofrece la esperanza de que todo será transformado. A través de sus lágrimas se encontró con Jesús resucitado que la llamó por su nombre. Como primera apóstol de la Resurrección, María Magdalena nos interpela a no tener miedo de ir al sepulcro, incluso a "quedarnos" allí en nuestra ignorancia, sino a ir después a anunciar la Buena Nueva. Este impresionante evento histórico no puede guardarse para nosotros o dentro de nuestras iglesias. Debe ser proclamado a un mundo que busca la Verdad en medio de la confusión y la oscuridad. Que este tiempo de Pascua, que celebraremos durante los próximos 50 días, renueve en nosotros el amor y la fe en Cristo Resucitado y nos inspire a cantarle a la Santísima Virgen: *Reina del cielo, alégrate, aleluya! Porque el Señor, a quien has llevado en tu vientre, aleluya! Ha resucitado según su palabra, aleluya! Ruega al Señor por nosotros, aleluya! Goza y alégrate Virgen María, aleluya! Porque en verdad ha resucitado el Señor, aleluya!*






