

Dear Parishioner

In 1Kings, the prophet Elijah had boldly confronted the prophets of Baal on Mount Carmel. Queen Jezebel wants him dead. Despite witnessing God's mighty power, his boldness turns to fear and he runs for his life. Knowing only God could help him, he walks to Mount Horeb, and expects to encounter God like Moses did: in a strong wind, earthquake, and fire. But God has many ways to make himself known. He didn't want to frighten an already terrified Elijah! As the fear-paralyzed Elijah waits, God allows him to recognize his faith-fortifying and reassuring Presence in a tender, soft, still, whispering voice.

Faith and boldness go askew again in today's Gospel. Our Lord had just performed one of the greatest miracles recorded in Scripture. He fed over five thousand people with five loaves and two fish. There were twelve wicker baskets of leftovers! The disciples had seen many miracles that showed our Lord was indeed God. They were with God; they had nothing to fear. With emboldened faith, they leave the Lord on the mountain, and go off in their boat that soon gets tossed about in a terrible storm. This does not terrify them as much as seeing our Lord walking toward them looking like a ghost. They forget who they are: companions of a mighty God. They take their eyes, hearts, and minds off their Master. When Peter does the same, looks not at the Lord but the storm, he begins to sink in fear.

We may never experience such chilling events, but we will certainly experience many fear-filled, faith-shaking moments. At those times, our Lord does not want us to forget who we are, and to keep our entire being fixed on him. When fear strikes us, our Lord invites us to run at once to him, to his Real Presence in the Tabernacle and cry out, "Lord, truly, you are the Son of God and my Savior! Please help me!" He will console us with tenderness, and whisper softly, "Take courage. Do not doubt. Do not be afraid. I will never leave you nor abandon you." If we believe and allow him, he will eventually turn all our fears into bold, unshakeable faith! After all, we are his beloved, the Heavenly Father's children, filled with the Holy Spirit, fortified by Sacramental graces, and Heaven bound!

THINK GREEN

With the hot days of summer, we look for ways to cool down in the most environmentally efficient way. Some steps we can take include:

- Plant trees or shrubs to shade air conditioning units, but not to block the airflow. Place your room air conditioner on the north side of the house. A unit operating in the shade uses as much as 10% less electricity than one operating in the sun.
- Don't place lamps or TV sets near your air-conditioning thermostat. The thermostat senses heat from these appliances, which can cause the air conditioner to run longer than necessary.
- Consider using an interior fan in conjunction with your window air conditioner to spread the cooled air more effectively through your home without greatly increasing your power use.
- When the night-time temperature dips into the mid-70s, try opening up your windows and use a ceiling fan to bring in the cool air.
