

Dear Parishioner

Along with the unofficial end of summer, Labor Day more importantly recalls the dignity and contribution of the worker to American life. Our job, including the working conditions and the setting, is deeply connected with our happiness and fulfillment. It is no wonder the Church has fostered such an ongoing concern for the worker and the workplace. On May 15, 1891, Pope Leo XIII issued an Encyclical Letter, *Rerum Novarum*, On the Condition of the Working Classes. The Church focused its attention on the individual laborer, on the number of working hours required, on just wages and benefits, as well as a healthy and safe working environment. The dignity and rights of the worker were at the very core of vital issues addressed by the Church.

For ourselves, it is important to understand the intimate connection between our work and our fervent desire to form a spirituality of work that will bring us closer to God. Our jobs provide what is necessary for our lives and for those who are dependent upon us. We want our effort to make a difference, to help people, to contribute something significant to the welfare of the world, and the good of others.

A reporter once asked St. Teresa of Calcutta how she could bear to work at such a hopeless task day after day where people are extremely poor and near death. St. Teresa replied, "Because I love what I do." The reporter continued to ask, "How do you do it with such dedication, knowing that poverty and sickness will be here long after you are dead?" St. Teresa's explanation was simple. "I know the task is immense but finishing and results are not my concern. I am attached to the work but not to the results."





SEPTEMBER 7th
INTERNATIONAL DAY OF
CLEAN AIR FOR BLUE SKIES

"Clean air is now a human right. A stable climate is a human right. Healthy nature is a human right. Today, air pollution is denying billions of people of their rights."
-UN Secretary General

Energy produced by the burning of fossil fuels (coal, oil and natural gas) releases carbon dioxide and other greenhouse gases into the atmosphere. Additionally, many machines powered by gasoline such as power lawnmowers and leaf blowers emit CO₂, toxic and carcinogenic pollutants into the air. These unhealthy pollutants affect all.

Depending on whether you live in an apartment building or in a house with a lawn, you may be able to take some of the following steps to help reduce the pollutants in the air.

- Replace incandescent light bulbs with LED light bulbs. A LED light bulb uses 75% less energy.
- Reduce power usage by using power strips for televisions, computers and lights. From 5 to 10% of home energy can be consumed by electronics when they are not in use.
- If purchasing a new appliance or any electronic item, buy one that is Energy Star Certified.
- Seal any leaks or cracks around windows. "A crack as small as 1/16th of an inch around a window can let in as much cold air as the window being open 3 inches."
- Consider redesigning your outdoor lawn next year. A redesigned lawn with a smaller grass area and more natural plants and trees would possibly reduce the time spent using power tools and improve the environment. Per the US Forest Service, "trees in urban areas of the United States remove an estimated 711,000 tons of toxic pollutants from the air each year."

Una vez, un reportero le preguntó a Santa Teresa de Calcuta cómo podía soportar trabajar en una situación tan desesperada. tarea día tras día donde la gente es extremadamente pobre y al borde de la muerte. Santa Teresa respondió: *"Porque yo amo lo que hago."* El reportero continuó preguntando: *"¿Cómo lo haces con tanta dedicación? sabiendo que la pobreza y la enfermedad estarán aquí mucho después de que estés muerta?"* Para Santa Teresa la explicación era sencilla. *"Sé que la tarea es inmensa pero el terminar y los resultados no son mi inquietud. 
A Prayer For Labor Day




