Dear Parishioner

On October 1st, the Church celebrates the Memorial of Saint Thérèse of Lisieux. Although this year it falls on a Sunday, and therefore not observed, it is still a good idea to review one of the greatest spiritual treasures left to us by the little French saint who has touched so many lives. Saint Thérèse was convinced that the Lord couldn't inspire her with unrealizable desires, and therefore she could aspire to holiness despite her weaknesses. How? By choosing a little path made to her measure which consists of taking the fast track into the arms of Jesus. She discovered in Scripture the answer to her quest for love and holiness; the discovery of her "Little Way" as related in the last manuscript of her autobiography "Story of a Soul". The Little Thérésian Way, which has been called the path of spiritual childhood, is not reserved for an elite group of people nor for the perfect. It's a path we can all take from the beginning of our spiritual lives. This small, straight path leads progressively to the heights of abandonment and love, to the culminating point of Jesus' desire to love and be loved. The more we take it, the more we learn abandonment, and the more we abandon ourselves to it, the more we open ourselves to the Divine Mercy which wants to invade everything. The "Little Way" of spiritual childhood frees holiness from the shackles of perfection, long before the Second Vatican Council proclaimed that all the faithful, no matter what state in life they're in, are called to holiness. The young Carmelite democratized holiness through her little path of trust, which is accessible to all. For Thérèse, to be holy is to open oneself to the waves of tenderness that are contained in God, to abandon oneself to His infinite Mercy, and to consent to allow oneself to be consumed by this purifying and transforming love in all the little things of ordinary life. Our fragility, welcomed as a grace, becomes the offering of ourselves totally to the love of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. The "Little Way" of spiritual childhood has nothing to do with childish behavior or whims. It's not to be gullible or passive, but to welcome mercy, to marvel at the actions of the Lord in our lives, and to expect everything from Him. This doesn't mean that we do nothing and resign ourselves to sinning; on the contrary, we work to transform the world and we unite ourselves to the Cross of Jesus. May we receive the grace to begin this "Little Way" of Saint Thérèse of the Child Jesus, and may she continually intercede for our parish on its road toward holiness!

Estimado Feligrés,

El 1 de octubre la Iglesia celebra el Memorial de Santa Teresita de Lisieux. Aunque este año cae un domingo y, por lo tanto, no se observa, no deja de ser una buena idea repasar uno de los mayores tesoros espirituales que nos dejó la pequeña santa francesa que ha tocado tantas vidas. Santa Teresita estaba convencida de que el Señor no podía inspirar deseos irrealizables y, por tanto, podía aspirarla a la santidad a pesar de sus debilidades. ¿Cómo? Eligiendo un pequeño camino hecho a su medida que consiste en tomar el camino rápido hacia los brazos de Jesús. Descubrió en las Escrituras la respuesta a su búsqueda de amor y santidad; el descubrimiento de su "Camino" relatado en el último manuscrito de su autobiografía "Historia de un alma". El Pequeño Camino Thérésiano, que ha sido llamado el camino de la infancia espiritual, no está reservado a una élite ni a los perfectos. Es un camino que todos podemos tomar desde el comienzo de nuestra vida espiritual. Este pequeño y recto camino conduce progresivamente a las alturas del abandono y del amor, al punto culminante del deseo de Jesús de amar y ser amado. Cuanto más lo tomamos, más aprendemos del abandono, y cuanto más nos abandonamos a él, más nos abrimos a la Divina Misericordia que quiere invadirlo todo. El "Pequeño Camino" de la infancia espiritual libera a la santidad de las cadenas de la perfección, mucho antes de que el Concilio Vaticano II proclamara que todos los fieles, sin importar en qué estado de vida se encuentren, están llamados a la santidad. La joven carmelita democratizó la santidad a través de su pequeño camino de confianza, accesible a todos. Para Teresita, ser santo es abrirse a las olas de ternura contenidas en Dios, abandonarse a su infinita Misericordia y consentir en dejarse consumir por este amor purificador y transformador en todas las pequeñas cosas de la vida ordinaria. Nuestra fragilidad, acogida como gracia, se convierte en ofrecimiento total de nosotros mismos al amor del Padre, del Hijo y del Espíritu Santo. El "Caminito" de la infancia espiritual no tiene nada que ver con comportamientos ni caprichos infantiles. No se trata de ser crédulos ni pasivos, sino de acoger la misericordia, maravillarnos de las acciones del Señor en nuestras vidas y esperar todo de Él. Esto no significa que no hagamos nada y nos resignemos a pecar; al contrario, trabajamos para transformar el mundo y nos unimos a la Cruz de Jesús. ¡Que recibamos la gracia de iniciar este "Pequeño Camino" de Santa Teresita del Niño Jesús, y que ella interceda continuamente por nuestra parroquia en su camino hacia la santidad!




