

# Dear Parishioner

Once again, the Church enters the period in which we contemplate how to live these holy days of sacrifice and resolution which, for 40 days, will punctuate our daily life. A season that begins in winter and ends in spring, like a perpetual renewal, where we live with patience the anticipation of the Passion and Resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Which efforts and resolutions can we make this Lent? Three pillars help us to concretely live this season: prayer, fasting and almsgiving. The first pillar, prayer: We must take time regularly in this hectic life to recollect ourselves. Praying like Jesus who knew how to take time away, escaping the crowds to find time to dialogue with the Father. By meditating on the Word in silence, by turning off the television and shutting off the music, by avoiding being too dependent on smartphones, we can daily place ourselves before the Lord for a few minutes and allow ourselves to be grasped by Him. The second pillar, fasting: It can be a little scary. Why should I fast? A fast is not just about food. The purpose of fasting is to make us thirsty and hungry for God and His Word. It is not only a gesture of penance, but also a gesture of solidarity with the poor and an invitation to sharing and almsgiving. It is a voluntary deprivation of what satiates us: certainly food, but also of the desire traps which are tobacco, alcohol, television, social media; anything that makes our life dependent on the tyranny of habit and need. Finally, the third pillar, almsgiving: Sharing is directly linked to fasting. Our deprivation is a time of sharing, of almsgiving. What we have saved, we are invited to give to those who fast every day because they have nothing to spare, so that they too can buy food. Once again, our Holy Mother the Church confirms that Lent is a time of joy. And more precisely joyful hope! The renewal of prayer, the insistence on almsgiving and training in selfcontrol through fasting is especially recommended for the season of Lent and invites us to joy. May the Lord grant each of us a fruitful and holy Lenten season!

# LA VOZ HISPANA

# Estimado Feligrés

Una vez más, la Iglesia entra en el período en el que contemplamos cómo vivir estos días santos de sacrificio y resolución que, durante 40 días, marcarán nuestra vida diaria. Una estación que comienza en invierno y termina en primavera, como una renovación perpetua, donde vivimos con paciencia la anticipación de la Pasión y Resurrección de Jesucristo. ¿Qué esfuerzos y resoluciones podemos hacer para esta Cuaresma? Tres pilares nos ayudan a vivir concretamente este tiempo: la oración, el ayuno y la limosna. El primer pilar, la oración: debemos tomarnos un tiempo regularmente en esta vida agitada para recuperarnos. Orar como Jesús que supo tomarse el tiempo, escapando de la multitud para encontrar tiempo para dialogar con el Padre. Meditando la Palabra en silencio, apagando la televisión y la música, evitando depender demasiado de los teléfonos, podemos situarnos diariamente ante el Señor durante unos minutos y dejarnos captar por Él. El segundo pilar, el ayuno: puede dar un poco de miedo. ¿Por qué debería ayunar? Un ayuno no se trata sólo de comida. El propósito del ayuno es hacernos tener sed y hambre de Dios y Su Palabra. No es sólo un gesto de penitencia, sino también un gesto de solidaridad con los pobres y una invitación a compartir y a dar limosna. Es una privación voluntaria de lo que nos sacia: ciertamente la comida, pero también de las trampas del deseo que son el tabaco, el alcohol, la televisión, las redes sociales; cualquier cosa que haga que nuestra vida dependa de la tiranía del hábito y la necesidad. Finalmente, el tercer pilar, la limosna: compartir está directamente relacionado con el ayuno. Nuestra privación es un tiempo de compartir, de dar limosna. Lo que hemos ahorrado, estamos invitados a dárselo a quienes ayunan todos los días porque no tienen nada de sobra, para que ellos también puedan comprar alimentos. Una vez más, nuestra Santa Madre Iglesia nos confirma que la Cuaresma es un tiempo de alegría. Y más precisamente, esperanza gozosa. La renovación de la oración, la insistencia en la limosna y el entrenamiento en el autocontrol a través del ayuno se recomienda especialmente para el tiempo de Cuaresma y nos invita a la alegría. ¡Que el Señor nos conceda a cada uno de nosotros una Cuaresma, fructífera y santa!

#### **REGULACIÓNES PARA LA CUARESMA 2024**

**ABSTINENCIA**: Todos los fieles que hayan cumplido los 14 años de edad están obligados a abstenerse de comer carne todos los viernes del Tiempo de Cuaresma.

**AYUNO**: Todos los fieles entre 18 y 59 años (inclusive) están obligados a ayunar el Viernes Santo (29 de marzo), limitándose a una única comida completa y evitando comer entre horas. Se puede tomar un sustento ligero en otras dos ocasiones durante el día.





#### **PIENSA VERDE**

**Escritura**: "Y estuvo en el desierto cuarenta días y cuarenta noches, y fue tentado por Satanás." (Marcos 2:13)

Reflexión: Una de las formas en las que habitualmente somos tentados es en el ámbito del consumismo. Los anunciantes y los equipos de marketing hacen un gran trabajo al convencernos de que necesitamos más de lo que realmente necesitamos. ¡La destrucción asociada de recursos no renovables y las toxinas industriales provenientes del transporte y la fabricación de "cosas" se acumulan!

**Acción**: ¡Tomémonos un tiempo así de lento para examinar lo que realmente necesitamos, de dónde viene y si es necesario realizar una nueva compra! Tomémonos tiempo para resistir la tentación del consumismo.

PRECEPTO PASCUAL: Después de haber sido iniciados en la Santísima Eucaristía, los fieles están obligados a recibir la Sagrada Comunión por lo menos una vez al año, cumpliéndose este precepto durante el Tiempo Pascual, a no ser que se cumpla en otro tiempo por causa justificada. En Estados Unidos, el período para cumplir este precepto se extiende desde el primer domingo de Cuaresma (18 de febrero) hasta el domingo de Pentecostés (19 de mayo). La obligación de observar, en su totalidad o sustancialmente los días penitenciales especificados por la Iglesia, es grave.


# LENT GIFT CARD COLLECTIONS

Church Regulations Regarding
Fast and Abstinence

The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

- On a day of Fast, only one full meal is permitted, and two smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.
- Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.
- On days of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.
- The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially," or as a whole, is a serious obligation.
- The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.

The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty) extends from the *First Sunday* of Lent, February 18, 2024 to The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, May 26, 2024.


#### Week One | Restore: Lent with Sr. Miriam James Heidland, SOLT


