



Dear Parishioner

Today we hear about Jesus chasing the money changers out of the temple. The cleansing of the temple may be seen as symbolic of the cleansing that must take place in each of us during this Lenten Season. Just as Jesus cleansed the temple, he wants to cleanse us of the sin in our lives and make us clean again.

We may feel at times like we don't know where we are heading and that we are no longer in control of our lives. These days of Lent are a time to make choices and to take control so that we can get back on the right path again. During these weeks, we have heard the Prophet Isaiah say: "Wash yourselves clean." What does that mean? What does it mean to "wash ourselves clean"?

First of all, it means repenting of our sins. It also means making an effort to avoid those things that lead us to sin. Perhaps Isaiah's call to "wash ourselves clean" can lead us to think of Lent as an opportunity to take a "spiritual bath". How much we all need to be cleansed and purified. The Sacrament of Reconciliation is a wonderful way to experience the Lord's forgiveness and begin anew. We can repent of our sins and cleanse our souls.

As Jesus turned the money changer's tables upside down, you and I need to turn our lives upside down and begin to make changes - changes that will bring us closer to the Lord - changes that will lead us to new and eternal life.

REGULACIÓNES PARA LA CUARESMA 2024

ABSTINENCIA: Todos los fieles que hayan cumplido los 14 años de edad están obligados a abstenerse de comer carne todos los viernes del Tiempo de Cuaresma.

AYUNO: Todos los fieles entre 18 y 59 años (inclusive) están obligados a ayunar el Viernes Santo (29 de marzo), limitándose a una única comida completa y evitando comer entre horas. Se puede tomar un sustento ligero en otras dos ocasiones durante el día.

PRECEPTO PASCUAL: Después de haber sido iniciados en la Santísima Eucaristía, los fieles están obligados a recibir la Sagrada Comunión por lo menos una vez al año, cumpliéndose este precepto durante el Tiempo Pascual, a no ser que se cumpla en otro tiempo por causa justificada. En Estados Unidos, el período para cumplir este precepto se extiende desde el primer domingo de Cuaresma (18 de febrero) hasta el domingo de Pentecostés (19 de mayo). La obligación de observar, en su totalidad o sustancialmente los días penitenciales especificados por la Iglesia, es grave.

Church Regulations Regarding Fast and Abstinence


The days of both Fast and Abstinence during Lent are



Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. If possible, the fast on Good Friday is continued until the Easter Vigil (on Holy Saturday night) as the "paschal fast" to honor the suffering and death of the Lord Jesus, and to prepare ourselves to share more fully and to celebrate more readily His Resurrection. The other Fridays of Lent are days of Abstinence.

- On a day of Fast, only one full meal is permitted, and two smaller meals, which, if added together, would not exceed the main meal in quantity.
- ♦ Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to fast.
- On days of Abstinence, no meat may be eaten. Those who have reached the age of 14 are obliged by the law of abstinence.
- ♦ The obligation to observe the laws of Fast and Abstinence "substantially," or as a whole, is a serious obligation.
- The Fridays of the year, outside of Lent, are designated as days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial as penance.

The time for fulfilling the Paschal Precept (Easter Duty) extends from the *First Sunday of Lent, February 18, 2024 to The Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, May 26, 2024.*

Probably the two most notable meals in the Bible were given by Moses and Jesus.
