Dear Parishioner

In my early days as a Catholic I used to go with a group of people to do door-to-door and street evangelization. Before talking about our Lord and the essential points of the *Kerygma* to those who were receptive, we always wanted to ascertain who Jesus was to them by asking the question: *Who do you say that Jesus is?* We knew from the responses those who did not believe and those who did. The ones who did not would say Jesus was a good teacher like Buddha, or a prophet like Mohammad, or just a good, holy man, etc. But those who did believe always confessed, "*He is the Son of God and God.*"

St. Paul tells us today that no one can boldly confess "*Jesus is Lord*" unless they are filled with the Holy Spirit. God the Holy Spirit descended on Jesus when John baptized Him. In His entire mission, He communed with the Spirit. And, on that first Pentecost after His resurrection in the Spirit, He lavished the Holy Spirit on the Apostles and the entire Church, and they were filled with intense joy, holy boldness, and a love that transcended human fear. Inflamed by the Spirit, they preached with courage and conviction, willing to live, serve, suffer, and die for our Lord Jesus and the Gospel.

Today, we are invited to recall and renew our Confirmation when we were permanently "*sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit.*" We are no longer a people who are in darkness, still sleeping the sleep of death. A Christian who has willfully surrendered to the Spirit is one who is fully animated and alive in the Spirit. He or she will boldly and eagerly offer and put into use the service and talents the Spirit has manifested (1 Cor 12:7) to lovingly strengthen and build oneself, St. Aloysius, and the greater Body of Christ.

Today, dear brother or sister, drink deep of the Holy Spirit. May He kindle in us the fire of His love! All our efforts in the world, however small or large, will be devoid of good fruit without the Spirit's aid. Let us all become fruit inspectors, not judges! "*The fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control.*" (Gal 5:22-23)



El materialismo de nuestra sociedad nos atrae a concentrarnos más en lo que queremos que en lo que Dios quiere para nosotros. El relativismo de nuestro mundo nos dice que debemos ser tolerantes con todas las cosas, que no hay una verdad absoluta. Ore al Espíritu Santo para que transforme nuestras vidas y guie nuestros pensamientos, palabras y obras. Lo que pone en su mente, su corazón y su alma afecta sus acciones. Ponga cosas buenas dentro y saldrán cosas buenas.

Estimado Feligrés

En mis inicios como católico, solía acompañar a un grupo de personas a evangelizar puerta a puerta y en las calles. Antes de hablar de nuestro Señor y los puntos esenciales del *Kerigma* a quienes se mostraban receptivos, siempre queríamos determinar quién era Jesús para ellos, preguntándoles: "*¿Quién dicen que es Jesús?*". Por las respuestas, sabíamos quiénes no creían y quiénes sí. Los que no creían decían que Jesús era un buen maestro como Buda, un profeta como Mahoma, o simplemente un hombre bueno y santo, etc. Pero quienes sí creían siempre confesaban: "*Él es el Hijo de Dios y Dios*".

San Pablo nos dice hoy que nadie puede confesar con valentía que "*Jesús es el Señor*" a menos que esté lleno del Espíritu Santo. Dios, el Espíritu Santo, descendió sobre Jesús cuando Juan lo bautizó. En toda su misión, comulgó con el Espíritu. Y, en aquel primer Pentecostés, después de su resurrección en el Espíritu, derramó el Espíritu Santo sobre los apóstoles y toda la Iglesia, quienes se llenaron de intensa alegría, santa valentía y un amor que trascendió el temor humano. Inflamados por el Espíritu, predicaron con valentía y convicción, dispuestos a vivir, servir, sufrir y morir por nuestro Señor Jesús y el Evangelio.

Hoy, se nos invita a recordar y renovar nuestra Confirmación, cuando fuimos sellados permanentemente con el don del Espíritu Santo. 



REFLECTIONS

"The Advocate, the Holy Spirit whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you." (John 14:26)

The materialism of our society lures us to concentrate more on what we want than on what God wants for us. The relativism of our world tells us that we should be tolerant of all things, that there is no absolute truth.
